# Our Community News



## CALLED TO RENEW UPDATE

Back in July 2019 the Archdiocese of Los Angeles began an ambitious, multi-year campaign titled

**Called to Renew.** The intent was to strengthen parishes, families, and communities. The campaign goal was to raise \$500 million to address critical needs and invest in the future of the Roman Catholic Church in Southern California.

Key aspects of the Called to Renew campaign:

1. **Strengthening Parishes, Families, and Communities:** The campaign focused on rejuvenating facilities, supporting innovative programs, and addressing critical needs within parishes.
2. **Investing in the Future:** Funds were used to support priestly vocations, provide education and faith formation for children, and serve vulnerable populations through various ministries.
3. **Addressing Deferred Maintenance:** The campaign aimed to address long-overdue infrastructure needs in parishes and schools.
4. **Spiritual and Material Renewal:** Called to Renew emphasized both the spiritual growth and the practical needs of the Church.
5. **Multi-Year Commitment:** The campaign from the start was planned out as a multi-year effort, encouraging donors to consider a five-year pledge.
6. **Community Involvement:** The campaign involved every parish in the Archdiocese.

### How the Campaign Worked

Each parish had a specific goal (dollar amount).

50% of every dollar raised was returned to the parish.

100% of every dollar OVER the parish goal was returned to the parish.

For San Roque our goal was \$540,000. By the end of the pledge period we had received \$434,613.13 in pledges (short of the goal by some \$105,386.87). As of July 2026, we have \$373,177.13 PAID toward those pledges.

### How We Have Benefitted So Far

We received the following:

1. Church, a new roof and exterior paint
2. Rectory, a new roof and interior and exterior paint
3. Parish Hall exterior paint

**Total cost \$478,000. The Archdiocese Called To Renew Campaign paid \$378,000 and the parish paid \$100,000.**

**We have received WAY more money from this campaign than we gave as a parish.** The money we sent in to the Archdiocese DID NOT disappear into a black hole!

More than 50% of what has been paid to date (San Roque donors) has been used for replacing the church furnaces (completed) and is designated for the Accessory Dwelling Unit (beginning construction soon!). \$373,177.13 PAID TO DATE - 50% (\$186,588.56) goes to the Archdiocese and the other 50% (\$186,588.57) stays here at San Roque and goes to our two projects: The Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) and the church furnaces.

So, a huge **Thank You** to all of you who so generously donated and have been so faithful to your monthly payments over five years! The money you gave DIRECTLY benefitted San Roque.

# Religious Education & Faith Formation



We are excited to offer Grade 1 & Grade 2 Religious Education for the academic year 2025-26! This is a **two-year**

sacramental program that prepares your child well in an awareness of God's constant and abiding love, a relationship with Christ and the community, and foundations of the teachings of our Catholic Christian faith. Eligible students in Year 2 receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession) in early February, and Eucharist (Holy Communion) in early May. Families are expected to attend our parish 9:30 am Mass with their child, grab a donut (and some coffee!) and then head to class from 10:45am-12noon. Classes are held this year from September 7 to May. Registration forms available now.

**Class begins September 7 so register today!**

We also offer a Special Sacraments Class for older students, please contact Noël personally for more information.

For Students in Grades 9 & 10 who would like to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation we offer a **two-year**

Sacramental program, (just like it is for Reconciliation and Holy Communion). Typically, Grade 9 is Year 1 and Grade 10 is Year 2

**(all students under age 21 are welcome).**

All Confirmation meetings are Monday evenings at 7:00 pm.

- Year 1 from September to December
- Year 2 from February to May (the following academic year)

This is a team teaching experience for our students with Mr. Ed DeCaro and Noël Fuentes (Fr. Bruce will make guest appearances as well!). Registration forms available now.


