REFLECTION:

The apostles' request of Jesus to "increase (their) faith" is made in the face of the seemingly impossible demands of discipleship. Jesus answers by illustrating what faithful discipleship looks like. The servant has been laboring all day in the field, but more is yet to be done. The work of the disciples is never completed. Discipleship is never-ending. To be a disciple means to be a servant. Here faith means faithfulness, that is, faithfulness in service. The faith-filled person puts in an honest day's work. That person is gracious to those with whom he or she comes in contact. That person is ready to reach out and help another, even beyond one's own workload. That person does not judge or condemn others. The faith-filled person sees Jesus in the other and responds to the situation with Jesus' love and mercy. Faith is faithfulness in action.

I have been thinking a lot about angels recently. This past week on Sept 29 we celebrated the Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Then on Oct 2 it was the Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels. As many of you know by now my daughters were both expecting babies. My first Grandson was born a month ago and the twin boys are due in December. I was thinking about how their guardian angels were all around my daughters (their mothers) while the boys were in the womb. Their mother's angels and the baby's angels, it was quite a crowd when we would gather for dinner! I remember Daddy telling me the name of his guardian angel, he was so aware of that angel's presence in his life and that angel has seen him through many a life threatening event! "Angels are not just the cute little pudgy cherubs from the art of the middle ages," Bishop Bob (Barron) used to tell me. "They are warriors, and at such a higher pitch of existence than we puny humans." I just had to laugh and ask my angel for forgiveness when I pictured my angel without heavy armor or a sword! So even though I thank the "parking angels" when I am out and about in town, I do know that this incredible guardian of my earthly life and soul, who must have witnessed the battle in when Lucifer was thrown out of heaven (meaning my angel sided with God!), is so much more powerful than I could ever imagine! We need to talk to our angel, thank them, ask for their protection, and live our lives in such a way that we are aware of their constant presence. We must also thank God for this incredible companion on our journey through life!

Guardian Angel Factoids!

The history of the Catholic belief in guardian angels stems from Scripture and Tradition and is supported by early Church Fathers like Saint Basil. The formal Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels was introduced in the 16th century and officially added to the Roman Calendar by Pope Paul V in 1615, though the concept of angels guarding individuals and communities is ancient, with examples in the Old Testament and the Catechism. This belief emphasizes that each person has a guardian angel assigned at birth to provide protection, guidance, and intercession on their journey toward God.

Biblical and Traditional Roots

Old Testament: The concept of angels playing a protective role is evident in the Old Testament, with examples of angels protecting individuals like Hagar and Lot, and preventing Abraham from sacrificing his son, Isaac.

Jesus' Teaching: The Church's teaching on guardian angels is rooted in Jesus' words.

Early Church Fathers: The tradition was further developed by figures like Saint Basil the Great, who stated, "Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd, leading him to life".

Development of Devotion and Doctrine

Monasticism: Devotion to guardian angels gained momentum with the rise of monasticism.

Local Feasts: The feast of the guardian angels was celebrated locally in various dioceses before being formally placed on the universal Roman Calendar.

Formal Establishment: Pope Paul V introduced the Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels to the Roman calendar in 1615.

Teaching on Guardian Angels

Individual Guardian Angels: The Catholic Catechism teaches that every human being is assigned a guardian angel at birth to protect, guide, and intercede for them.

Community Guardian Angels: It is also piously believed that communities, parishes, and even nations have guardian angels, such as Saint Michael, the guardian angel of the Church.

Role of Guardian Angels:

These angels are seen as participants in God's holiness, offering intellectual help, suggesting good thoughts, and presenting human prayers and good works to God. They also ward off evil and assist in our journey to salvation.

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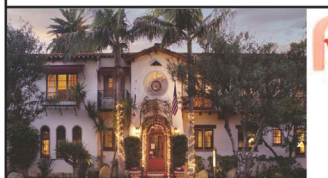
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
