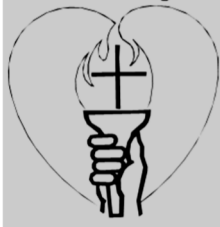

REFLECTION: The suggested readings for All Souls' Day invite us to trust in the mercy of God and in his desire to care for us for eternity. The accusation is often made of Christianity that faith in the resurrection is simply a nice delusion replacing the harsh reality of permanent death. Anyone who knows the loss of a loved one knows the seeming finality of death, of saying goodbye to someone held dear. That pain is real, and nothing can reverse that loss. Yet the first reading from Wisdom says that the just only seem to be dead for the "foolish." Is it foolish to cling to hope that God would indeed raise the just? If we can recognize the evil of

death when we see it, shall we not also see goodness? Faith can be difficult when reality seems to show anything but God's love and presence. We cling to the cross of Christ at the darkest times, when all else seems lost, because nothing else will hold.

Ave Crux, spes unica—hail the cross, our only hope.

In the entire corpus of Scripture, even in the face of rejection, blasphemy, and idolatry, God is nothing other than faithful to his chosen people. If God can be steadfast in these moments, then certainly God will also be faithful to the one who humbly seeks him in our own time. Jesus promises in the Gospel that all who come to him will be raised on the last day. Prayer for the dead is a spiritual work of mercy because we offer our own love for those in need, willing something that God desires for them. In praying for the dead, we trust that out of love and in response to our faith, God will raise us all from death into eternal life. (*Living Liturgy, page 242*)

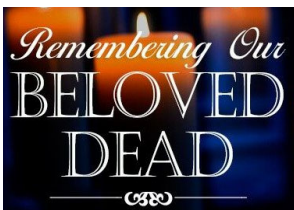

November 2— *Día de los Muertos*

We hear so much more about *Día de los Muertos* now than in the past. Stores have food and decorations associated with this day. But how does our Catholic faith see this annual event? The



Universal Catholic Church views this day as a meaningful celebration of Catholic beliefs about death and the afterlife, rather than a secular festival. It aligns with the Church's traditions of praying for the dead, the Communion of Saints, and hope for resurrection. Catholics can participate in the celebration while remaining grounded in their faith by focusing on prayer, remembrance, and ensuring the observance does not contradict Catholic teachings.

Catholic perspective on *Día de los Muertos*

Hope for resurrection: The celebration is a joyful reminder of the Catholic belief that death is not the end, but a transition to eternal life through Jesus Christ.

Prayer for the departed: A core Catholic element is the practice of praying for the souls in purgatory to help them reach heaven, a spiritual work of mercy that is central to *Día de los Muertos*.

Communion of Saints: The holiday reflects the Catholic belief in the Communion of Saints, the connection between the living and the dead who are united in Christ.

Honoring the deceased: It is a time to remember and honor loved ones who have died by sharing stories and creating altars (ofrendas) with their favorite things.

A celebration of life: The emphasis is on celebrating the lives of those who have passed and the eternal life they now have with God.

How to celebrate appropriately

Focus on prayer: Pray for your departed loved ones.

Create an altar: Build a home altar (ofrenda) to remember deceased family members.

Visit cemeteries: Decorate graves with flowers and food, and say prayers for those buried there.

Attend Mass: Many parishes will hold special Masses for *Día de los Muertos*, which aligns with the Church's observance of All Souls' Day.

Facts about physical grooming

The term "grooming" refers to the way in which a predator tries to mold and set up his victims and their families, in order to gain access to a child and cause harm, all while appearing innocent. The first of the three types of grooming is physical, and it involves touch. A predator starts with innocent touches — back pats, appropriate hugs — and then moves on to tickling, wrestling, hugging, conditioning the child to increasing levels of physical contact. Over time, the predator conditions the child to accept all forms of touch, progressing to sexual contact. 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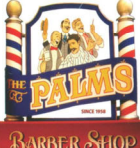
