Without a doubt the best thing we alumni have done with these guys was to accept their invitation to the first annual spring alumni/undergraduate day. Late in March, 14 alumni traveled to campus to play intramural football against 35 undergraduate brothers from the chapter. THAT'S RIGHT I SAID FOOTBALL. Can you believe a bunch of 50+ year old, bald, fat guys taking on these 20-year-old studs? Although they had the speed, youth, and numbers on their side it was estimated that the total gross weight of their 35 and our 14 alumni we just about equal. - 1961 Kappa Gnu merged into Phi Epsilon Pi
- 1969 Phi Sigma Delta merged into Zeta Beta Tau
- 1970 Phi Epsilon Pi merged into Zeta Beta Tau
- 1995 National Headquarters moves to Indianapolis
- 1999 Zeta Beta Tau back on UMass Campus

From a high of 145 chapters following the 69/70 mergers, ZBT dropped to a low of 56 chapters in 1973. Today, the merged Zeta Beta Tau brotherhood is some 110,000 brothers strong and ZBT chapters and colonies are established at over 80 campus locations. ZBT enjoys the wisdom and vitality of five traditions merged into one and the dedicated support of alumni who have joined its five antecedent fraternities.

Tom Hoffey '01, President of ZBT colony at UMASS asked that the following be included in the newsletter.

Alumni:

We, the brothers of the Zeta Beta Tau colony here at UMASS would first like to extend our sincere thanks for the ways in which many of you have been in contact with us, willing to lend support and help when necessary.

Here at UMASS, our colony is growing very quickly. Just over a year ago, nine founding fathers introduced ZBT to the UMASS campus once again. Since that time we have grown to become thirty-four men strong. As we continue to grow, we continue to search out new options for places to house our brothers collectively in the future.

Currently we are involved with the greater Amherst area to a large extent. Over three semesters ago our Philanthropy chairman managed to create a program at a local community center that is designed to address the large gap that exists between senior citizens and adolescents. The program formally named Seniors and Teens Together is in its third semester of operation. During the week, brothers go to the Bangs Community Center and serve as facilitators between the two groups while playing billiards, ping pong, or cards. The program is designed to break down the barriers of fear and stereotyping that exists between the two groups. With regards to National news, we have completed our application for charter and should hear back from National in September. National has approved our request and named Stan Kittredge '72 as our advisor.

Lastly, if you have not heard from our alumni chairman yet, be assured you will in the future. We are looking to interact with alumni in any way possible. We recognize the valuable input that you are able to lend and look forward to meeting each of you. If at any time you would like to join the undergraduate members at the University please do not hesitate to contact me. We are open to any thoughts that you may have and would love to see you if you are in the Amherst area.
