As a UMass employee, the current state budget crisis is the worst in my 23 years at the University, with devastating impacts on many academic and administrative departments. Early retirements have seen about 500 Amherst campus employees leave, with only about 100 (20%) of those positions able to be re-filled. Please keep UMass in mind if you correspond with Massachusetts' legislators.

Plans are underway for a one-day PSD/ZBT reunion August 3 in Sturbridge, MA. We are planning a picnic at Old Sturbridge Village (11am-1pm), a quick business meeting 12:30-1:30, family tours of OSV from 1-5pm, and a dinner at Rom's Restaurant (private room) in Sturbridge from 6pmon (we have the room for as long as we need it).
