The first owner of the house was **Charles B. Whitworth**, a young pharmacist and avid golfer who dabbled in real estate and purchased the home in 1920. His investments and his choice of well-heeled golfing buddies were strategic and he made a fortune. He married in 1924 and by 1930, the couple were living on Belle Meade Blvd. and his occupation listed in the census was “Capitalist.”



By 1926 the home was purchased by **Morris and Rosa Rothstein**, a middle-aged couple with three daughters. They moved to Whitland from 2nd Ave. downtown, where they had been living above their dry goods store. Morris had immigrated from Austria when he was 16, and in 1910 opened the store on 2nd Ave. Their oldest daughter, Bernice, was married in the living room of the Whitland home “before an altar of palms and ferns” by Rabbi Julius Mark in 1928.

During the 1930s, relatives from Germany fled from the Nazis to Nashville to stay with the Rothsteins. The 1940 census shows three recent emigres in their household: sister-in-law Rosalie Zander, age 72; sister-in-law Henrietta Gabriel, age 78; and grand-nephew Stephen Vurich[?], age 23.

In 1952, after 42 years in business, Morris closed his downtown store and the Rothsteins moved to Oklahoma to live near a daughter. But by 1958 they were back! They lived in an apartment on West End at Murphy Rd. until their deaths, Rosa in 1960 and Morris in 1963.

The home went through a string of owners after the Rothsteins. **William and Mary Elliston** were followed in 1970 by **Albert Pedro**, manager of IHOP and owner of Victor Victoria’s nightclub. He sold it to **Ellis and Carolyn Levine** who owned the House of Pizza.

In 1980 **John and Kathy Griffin** moved in and were long-time owners; Kathy still lives in the neighborhood. In 1997 **David and Elizabeth Fox**, the current owners, bought this lovely home. Elizabeth has found an identical home on Richland Avenue and would love to find out the name of the architect who designed both homes.
