God's Design for Fatherhood

Raising godly children takes wisdom, effort, and divine guidance. Judging by the scriptural record, successful fathering was not all that common in Biblical times—God's Word lists numerous instances where a son followed a bad example by walking in the way of his father. However, Matthew 4:18-22 introduces one of the Bible's relatively few positive role models for dads: a man named Zebedee. He must have been an outstanding picture of fatherhood, because Scripture repeatedly refers to disciples James and John as the "sons of Zebedee."

From Matthew's gospel, we can learn several things about this man. He was a fisherman by trade and probably successful, since he and his grown sons all earned a living from the business. More than likely, from the time the boys were small, he had taught them about boats, oars, sails, and nets. He certainly shared all that he knew about wind and worms and instructed them about the sea, showing them how to determine the deepest parts and where to locate fish. James and John also undoubtedly observed his patience, persistence, determination, and discernment, which were indispensable traits.

A father is the first authority figure in a child's life; the better his example, the more his children will be predisposed to submit to God's sovereign authority. In sharing his interests and time with his sons, Zebedee was developing a wonderful relationship with them. He didn't realize he was getting James and John ready for a great ministry. But his example and involvement with them was building character qualities that enabled them to respond immediately when they, one day, heard the Jesus call, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Matthew 4:19-20)

James and John followed Christ without hesitation or reservation. Zebedee confidently watched them walk away, knowing that he might never see them again. Like successful Christian parents today, this father had raised his sons to be upright, self-confident young men, and his reward was in witnessing them wisely transfer themselves from his authority to that of the Son of God.

the 6th grade, the Senegalese Dance Troupe invited him to tour with them. He learned to play various African drums and has quite an extensive collection of them. When he was in the 10th grade, he performed a Kwanzaa celebration at Rikers Island in New York, the biggest and most dangerous jail complex in America.

Minister Armor's foundational scripture can be found in 2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine.



Reverend Jacqueline (Jacquie) Martinez, the youngest of six and a native of Philadelphia, PA, fondly recalls church attendance being mandatory. Her grandparents were Pentecostal ministers for over 60

years. She learned at an early age that no matter what you are going through in life, there's nothing that God can't do and, if you read the Bible every day, God will show you what he wants from your life.

It was during her struggles through an addiction, homelessness and abuse, that she came to know Jesus personally. The Bible not only informed her salvation, it continues to teach her how to maintain her salvation.

"My work is to teach, preach and empower people to know that with God, all things are possible," she says. Using her own personal testimony, the Bible, and the special soups that she makes, she helps others find hope. "I put love in all of my pots. My own miseries became my ministry. What I thought would take my life, gave me life, only through the grace and mercies of God!"

Personal trials caused her to move to Harrisburg, PA where she met and married Rev. Juan Martinez. Together they have a blended family of five children. They are also raising their granddaughter, Ashanti.

A product of the Philadelphia school system, Rev. Jacquie has attended several colleges, majoring in Biblical Studies and Christian Education. She retired from the State Employees Retirement System as a Fiduciary Specialist in 2000, and is currently the Site Director for Springboard Education in America, LLC at Rose Tree Elementary School. In 2004, she attained her Master of Divinity and Theology degree from the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University.

At Mt. Pleasant, Rev. Jacquie supports the Missionary Ministry with their visits to Inglis House in Philadelphia by ministering the Word of God. The Sunday School teacher also loves to teach and demonstrate life lessons from the Bible. "All of our stories are in there, we just need to know what Jesus did and we can overcome," she explains.

Her military experiences in the Army and National Guard, including a stint as a Military Police Officer, helped form her life as a Minister. "I learned patience, compassion and empathy, as well as how to survive. It is the same as a civilian. However, I use the Word of God as my marching orders. Jesus helps me to survive the tricks of the enemy of our souls."

Her favorite Scripture is Philippians 3: 13-14, "Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing *I do*, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ." Ministry is not a job or a Sunday routine, it is a privilege to be chosen and used by Jesus!

We celebrate our Mt. Pleasant youth and are so proud to know that they are moving forward and represent the best young people anywhere.











SINGLE BUT NOT ALONE by Catherine Crawford


IF JESUS LIVED INSIDE MY HEART by Jill Roman Lord

This book tells of a father's love for his child through its tender message of comfort and protection, assuring children that as they grow and change, their parent(s) will always be there for them.






GLOW: ANIMALS WITH THEIR OWN NIGHT-LIGHTS by W.H. Beck

God's Ingredients for Victory By Sylvia Ficklin

Do not let this book of the law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night so that you may be careful to do everything written in it, then you will be prosperous and successful (Joshua 1:8)

This was one of God's instructions to Joshua as he prepared to lead the Children of Israel into the Promised Land; the land God promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob over 700 years ago. The Book of the Law, along with codes and decrees God had given to Moses, was Joshua's Bible. These laws managed every aspect of the Israelites' lives, morally and spiritually. And, under Joshua's leadership, the Israelites obeyed, resulting in prosperity and success.

God's Word provides all of the ingredients to revitalize, fortify and nourish His children.

First ingredient: to be diligent in **Speaking the word.** When you speak the Word, it reinforces your faith. It is confirmation that God's Word is impeccable, righteous and true.

Now, when you blend being diligent in speaking the Word with being devoted in **pondering the word**, you further strengthen and nourish your soul. Focusing on God's Word enables you to renew your commitment to be faithful and obedient.

Finally, when you blend **speaking**, **pondering**, **and obeying the word**, these ingredients blend to become spiritual food conducive to prosperity and suc-

cess. However, hearing the Word without any commitment will not lead to growth. James admonishes us to be doers as well as hearers of the Word (James. 1:22).

We know that the Israelites later faltered. However, Joshua accomplished his purpose just as Christ did on the cross. James 2:10 reminds us that if we stumble at just one point, we're guilty of breaking the whole law. Only Jesus was able to keep the law perfectly.

God did a remarkable thing. He not only provided a High Priest who sympathizes with our weakness (Hebrews 4:15), He also sacrificed His only Son for our sins. He paid the full penalty for the broken law.

The Kingdom of God Response By Rev. G. Joyce Bryant

Whether you're just graduating and looking for a job or have been working for years, there comes a time when we all deal with unprofessional, inconsistent, arrogant, narcissistic bosses, who often make unrealistic, conflicting, and difficult demands on us. Whether on the job, at home, at school, or even in the church, there are three ways to deal with antagonistic people.

OPTION #1 – RETALIATION

Research shows that retaliation is unproductive and does not produce positive change, and you may be fired for insubordination. A more severe form of retaliation is work place violence, which is a category of violence that has been happening with increasing regularity. The outcome is devastating and it's one of the leading causes of job-related deaths.

OPTION #2 – QUIT

The option to quit is unwise for three reasons –

God may want to use you right there, to be a blessing, to institute positive change.

A new boss may be far worse than the one you left. You've heard the saying, "the grass isn't always greener on the other side."

It looks bad on your resume to con-

tinually go from job to job, unless you're getting promoted.

OPTION #3 – THE KINGDOM'S RE-SPONSE

Through the story of Hannah and Peninnah, (1 Samuel 1:1-20), I found that you can accomplish more with prayer, kindness, and a positive attitude.

The biblical account tells of a woman named Hannah, one of two wives of a man named Elkanah. They had been married for 10 years, and she was barren. Elkanah married a second wife, a younger woman named Peninnah, because he wanted an offspring. Peninnah had many children, while Hannah had none. Peninnah was a bitter antagonist to Hannah, possibly because she was not loved as much as Hannah by their husband, even though she had the children.

Without remorse, guilt, or concern, Peninnah relentlessly teased Hannah, reducing her to tears. However, Hannah was prayerful, she trusted God, and did not retaliate evil for evil. God blessed her to be the mother of a son named Samuel, who became a blessing to Israel. The Bible records that he was the last judge, a priest, and the first prophet.

Peninnah had 10 children and

Hannah had five. God punished Peninnah because of her harsh treatment toward Hannah. All of Peninnah's children died, except two. Hannah interceded in prayer for Penninah, asking God to spare her last two children, and God answered Hannah's prayer. All of Christendom knows that Hannah, the mother of Samuel, was publicly favored, but Peninnah was not mentioned once Hannah had her son.

When dealing with difficult people, if you want to be blessed and be a blessing, choose the Kingdom of God's response, which is –

- Pray (I Thess. 5:16)
- Commit your way to God and trust Him (Prov. 37:5)
- Don't return evil for evil (1 Peter 3:9)

Remember, your *attitude* determines your *altitude*. In the life of Hannah, we see that it was better to control anger and negative feelings; replacing them with mature actions and positive energy will take you far in life.

- 2. WhatsApp is ideal for international travel, allowing you to stay in touch with loved ones back home as well as your travel companions if you happen to get separated. It uses very little data which allows you to send thousands of messages on a basic data plan, more than what's typically allowed by standard text messaging plans.
- 3. Are you traveling to a place where you may be concerned that you do not understand the words (language) spoken? This app provides millions of perspectives from real people who have tread the course on which you are about to embark. This assists you to walk in wisdom, allowing for a safe and pleasant adventure.
- 5. Finally, a note on the use of social media. If all members of your household will be away, use precaution when posting those pics showcasing your fabulous destination on Facebook, Instagram, etc. Broadcasting your movements far from home could, unfortunately, alert people that you're away and leave your home vulnerable to uninvited guests in your absence.

Early Head Start Home Visiting Program By Kathy Crews-Williams

Oftentimes, when we discuss children and education, we fail to focus on our youngest population of kids which are prenatal to age 3. In addition to receiving early childhood education in the typical center-based or home child care setting, there is another program that is not well known to many. Home visiting is an ever-growing program that offers educational services to pregnant mothers and parents of newborns to youngsters in the home setting.

The goal of home visiting is to promote the parents' involvement and encourage positive parent/child interactions, integrate services into the family setting, assist parents in goal setting and educational development, and assist in transitioning students to preschool. Home visiting is a voluntary program that not only provides social, emotional, health-related parenting support and information to families, it also links them to appropriate resources. Families that participate in home visiting services may receive:

- Referrals for prenatal care for pregnant women
- Early support in their role as a child's first teacher
- Help in creating a safe and healthy environment for a young child to thrive
- Parenting skills that decrease the risk of child abuse

Depending on family goals and developmental and risk assessments, a family has the opportunity to work with a home visitor from the prenatal period up until the child's third birthday. Through consistent and planned home visits, parents and caregivers learn how to improve their family's health and provide better opportunities for their children. Home visiting is open to income eligible teenage parents, mothers, fathers, foster parents, grandparents, or anyone that is a caretaker for an age eligible child or children.

Home Visiting services are offered through the following:

- Delaware County Intermediate Unit in nearly a dozen locations—610-623-3696
- Crozer Keystone Nurse Family Partnership in Chester, PA—610-497-7399
- Maternity Care Coalition in Philadelphia, PA—215-972-0700

their captivity by the Assyrians in 722 BC and the Babylonians in 586 BC. In Revelations 9:1-21, sin has such control over people that they would rather die than repent and turn to God.

that we don't have to wait another second, minute, or day to receive. Praise brings us miracles. We have to fix our eyes on Him daily, apply the word to our everyday lives, and know that God is working directly on our behalf every step of our day. No matter what seems to be in our way, because of the praise we send up, rather than fear-filled, doubtful complaints that we utter, God can move mountains. Praise leaves us no room for complaining and negativity. The Lord God knows our hearts, and cares about all that concerns us. 




