#### ECO SHOPPING - CHOCOLATE THIS CHRISTMAS

# This Christmas, how can we choose the most ethical chocolate to match our budget?

Extract from 'Ethical Consumer': -

Over 70% of the world's cocoa is grown in West Africa, primarily in Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana. Oxfam reports that up to 90% of cocoa farmers in Ghana and Côte d'Ivoire don't earn a living income, forcing them to rely on child labour because they can't afford adult workers, involving practices that harm children's health, safety, or morals. Approximately 2.1 million children work on cocoa farms in these regions. Fairtrade certified chocolate has a set minimum price for cocoa to protect farmers.

Pesticide use is rife in cocoa cultivation, especially worrying due to the prevalence of child labour on cocoa farms and the lack of access many farmers have to proper protective equipment. Chocolate production is a major cause of deforestation. EU deforestation law states 'By December 30, 2025, all cocoa entering the EU must be deforestation-Mondelēz (own Cadbury, Green & Black) is urging for a delay of another year.

Of the 'affordable' chocolate that is readily available I found Oxfam chocolate, scoring 87/100, a clear leader at £2.40 for 100g. Ferrero, Lindt, Mars, Mondelēz and Nestlé all score under 25/100 overall for ethicality – with Cadbury's scoring 3/100!!

Our eco stall now has Oxfam Fairtrade milk and plain chocolate at £1.20 for 50g bar.
