GNR FUNDRAISER FOR HENRY DANCER DAYS

Some of you will remember Henry Dancer, a great friend of our eldest son, George. Henry attended Lanchester EP school and then started in year 7 in September 2009 at St Bede's along with his group of besties - Joe, Cameron, George and Harry. They were affectionately known as the "fab five"! Henry began suffering with pains in his leg during the autumn of his first term... to cut a very long, traumatic and painful story short, Henry died a year later at the age of 12 in November 2010 from osteosarcoma (bone cancer) which had spread.

Henry's mum, Jane, set up a charity in Henry's memory (he was an only child) called Henry Dancer Days. The charity supports other families going through similar difficult journeys, and it does amazing work. One example is the setting up of the Storyteller project, which now runs on children's cancer wards in hospitals in the North East and beyond. Professional storytellers work with children and young people in hospital, giving them and their parents/carers some much needed respite and a brief escape from the situation they find themselves in.

I am doing the Great North Run this year to raise funds for HDD. Like most charities, times are hard and it's becoming increasingly challenging to fundraise. Jane really struggled to recruit runners this year, so I decided to give it a go and have recruited a couple of colleagues along the way (thanks guys!).

ECO SHOPPING - UNDERSTANDING FOAM IN WASHING UP LIQUID

I have heard a concern expressed that our Ecoleaf washing-up liquid does not produce as much foam as other brands. Doing some research, here is what I have found:-

When washing up by hand, creating a bowl full of bubbles is not the way to go. Foam in the water actually holds on to soiled particles, and as well as using more detergent than necessary in the first place, you also need more water to rinse it off.

More foam in washing up liquid does not necessarily mean better cleaning; it's often a marketing tactic. The effectiveness of a detergent comes from its surfactants, which break down grease and dirt, not from the amount of bubbles produced.

Surfactants - The foaming effect is not essential for cleaning; in fact, many effective cleaning products are low-foam or foam-free. Many mainstream brands add extra foaming agents to create more suds, which can mislead consumers into thinking they are using a more effective product. In summary, while foam may look appealing, it does not equate to better cleaning.

ECO SHOPPING - WASHING UP LIQUID

Given that washing-up liquid finds its way down into the drains and eventually into our waterways, logically they should not contain substances that could harm the environment. But most mainstream washing-up liquids contain synthetic fragrances and petrochemical surfactants, whose biodegradability is questionable.

Certain ingredients are harmful to human health and the environment e.g. triclosan, phthalates, parabens, and formaldehyde. Interestingly Fairy (Procter & Gamble) scored 0/100 points in the harmful ingredients category as assessed by Ethical Consumer, Ecoleaf stocked in our Eco stall scored 80/100 (the higher the score the more ecofriendly the product!).

Palm oil is a controversial ingredient used in many products, with links to environmental destruction and workers' rights abuses. Fairy's owner Procter & Gamble also scored 0/100 points for this category, Ecoleaf 40/100. For these reasons, amongst others, we are stocking Ecoleaf in our Eco Stall, also reducing plastic waste by refilling the bottles which many of you have kindly collected for this purpose
