FATHER DANIEL'S MUSINGS

I had hoped to get back to our Liturgical meditations, but, alas, something else presents itself. I started writing this yesterday, (my yesterday, that is your last Monday), on the plane on the way back to New York from Columbus, Ohio, where I attended the 5-day SEEK 2026 Conference. What, you might ask, is SEEK? The first answer I want to give is that SEEK is:

AWESOME !! And that answer is completely true, but not, perhaps, very descriptive. Let me tell you a bit more. FOCUS (the Fellowship of Catholic University Students) sends young missionaries to college campuses to support them in the life of faith. There are at the present more than a thousand FOCUS missionaries in over 250 college campuses. For the last 27 years, FOCUS has been holding a biennial or annual SEEK Conference: at the first conference, about 25 people were present; this year, over 26,000 attended! There were three locations – Fort Worth, Texas, Denver, Colorado, and Columbus, Ohio (the largest), where I was, at which at least 17,000 people participated! In addition to the thousands and thousands of students and missionaries, and recent missionaries, there were about 600 priests and 30 bishops, countless religious sisters, and lots of others of every age.

What did we do? Each day there was, of course, a Mass, concelebrated by all: the procession, alone, into the vast hall, where the sanctuary was beautifully and worthily arranged, took a long, long time. Processing four abreast, the priests stretched on and on and walked probably the length of a football field (like I know what a football field feels like!) past thousands of enthusiastic, pious (mostly young) people, singing exuberantly but prayerfully!

There was a chapel, with room for about 1,300 people, where the Blessed Sacrament was exposed from morning till night; at many points in the day, it was nearly impossible to get a seat, so strong is the desire (ever growing) among young people for Eucharistic Adoration! Confessions were offered – in a vast room, often with thirty priests hearing – for hours each day. I went to hear for at least an hour or so a day; while we are very fortunate here in our parishes that so many go to confession [and if you don't, here's an invitation!], but for some priests, they rarely have the opportunity (like our confrères in Austria, where confession is anemically embraced).

During each day there were speakers, big names in the Catholic world: Matt Fradd, Joe Heschmeyer (my favorite!), Sr Mary Grace, SV., Fr Mike Schmitz, Sr Josephine Garrett, CSFN, Dr Scott Hahn, Dr Edward Sri, and a special video message from Pope Leo!!, keynote addresses, smaller conferences, on and on! There were booths from various Catholic groups and religious orders (I think we need to do this next year), and just lots and lots of happy, Catholic people.

On Saturday evening, from 8:30 to about 11:00, there was Eucharistic Adoration, at which almost 16,000 were present, adoring the Lord in songs, new and old, and silence. Meanwhile in an vast, adjacent hall, hundreds of priests were hearing confessions. The penitents walked around the outside of the hall, and when a priest was free, someone would go to him. Thousands were set free!

I share this brief and woefully inadequate glimpse of what was going on at the Conference (where, in a real sense, the Church in America was gathered) as a reminder that the Church is alive and growing and as an encouragement – I was certainly encouraged – that each of us has a vocation to not only to seek the Lord ever more deeply, but also to share Him with others!

I have no objection to concelebration, which is now an approved part of the Roman Rite. While concelebration – that is, where more than one priest together celebrate Mass, all joining in the Consecration of the Eucharist – has always been a major part of the Eastern Church's liturgical life, in the Roman Church it had not been practiced for over 1000 years, until Vatican II, save (in a limited way) in the Rites of the Ordination of Bishops and Priests. I advocate also, however, that we never lose or forget the wonderful Roman tradition of priests attending Mass "in choir", that is, vested in Choir Dress (not Mass Vestments) and seated in the sanctuary, participating without concelebrating. To misquote (intentionally, and for many reasons, but the quote works here) Mao Zedong, "*Let a thousand flowers bloom!*" All the Church's legitimate traditions should be respected!

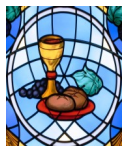

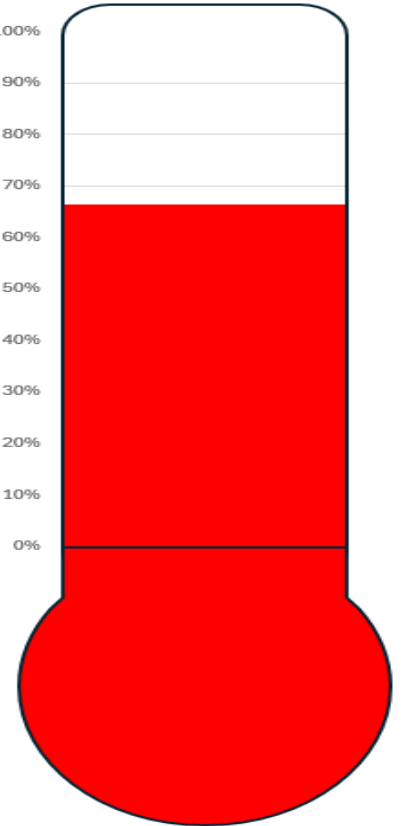

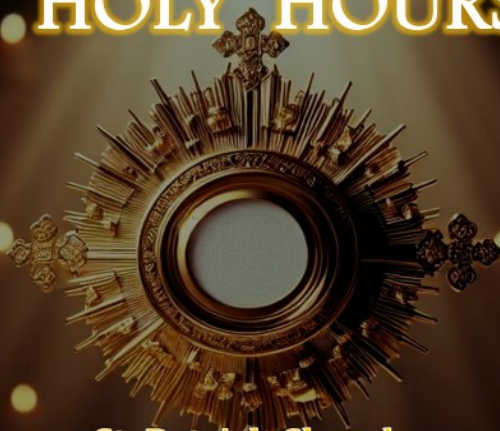

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Fiesta Del Bautismo Del Señor

Isaías 42, 1-4, 6-7

Este es el primero de los cuatro cánticos dedicados a un desconocido personaje que ha sido denominado Siervo del Señor. No se sabe con certeza si se trata de un individuo y siendo así habría que pensar en Ciro –o de un colectivo, y siendo así se podría pensar en la comunidad fiel de los israelitas. Lo cierto del caso es que ese personaje es presentado como un siervo que ha sido elegido y sostenido por Dios mismo. Sobre él ha sido derramado el espíritu que le habilita para su misión de ser alianza y luz y obrar una liberación.



Hechos 10, 34-38

Pedro comienza diciendo que Dios no hace distinciones entre personas, que acepta a cualquiera que sea bueno y honrado sin mirar la raza o nación de la que procede. Por fin parece que Pedro ha comprendido. Sus palabras repiten el testimonio que ya venía dado entre los judíos sobre la persona de Jesús, su muerte y resurrección. Solo que esta vez en auditorio es distinto pues los oyentes son paganos. Pedro les pone al corriente de todo lo sucedido acerca de Jesús hasta llegar a la resurrección, a los testigos de ella y al mensaje universal que implica.

Mateo 3, 13-17

En tiempos de los evangelistas había un grupo muy activo de seguidores del Bautista. Creían que Juan era el herald de la revelación De Dios. La historicidad del bautismo de Jesús se puede asegurar con certeza por la existencia de esta secta. En la cultura palestina tan centrada en el honor, la voz con autoridad del cielo era un signo muy importante y una gran afirmación de la misión de Jesús. Dios personalmente proclama la relación del padre y el hijo. La voz del cielo establece la credibilidad de Jesús.



Muchas veces se oye en la iglesia o en las comunidades que hacen falta más sacerdotes. No hay suficientes, los que hay tienen demasiado trabajo y hay relativamente pocos que hablen español o que comprendan la cultura hispana bien. Y entonces, escuchamos la llamada a pedir por vocaciones: al sacerdocio, a la vida religiosa, o a un laicado comprometido. Pero en el fondo de nosotros a veces, es como si deseáramos que esas vocaciones vinieran de otro lugar, no de nuestras propias familias y comunidades. Queremos para nuestros hijos otras cosas que den más dinero, prestigio y, sobre todo, que aseguren que va a haber nietos... Al enfrentarnos a este deseo íntimo de que las vocaciones vengan de otro lugar, quizá no nos demos cuenta de que hay otras mamás y papás en otras familias sintiendo lo mismo. Y entonces, ¿A quien se enviará a la misión de difundir la Palabra de Dios, de enseñar los valores cristianos, de enseñar en la escuela, de llevar los hospitales, de cuidar de las necesidades de todos, de administrar los sacramentos? La misión de Dios no es fácil y quizá no traiga dinero ni prestigio. Y, sin embargo, es lo mejor, lo más importante y lo más elevado que se puede hacer para el futuro, no ya de nuestra propia familia, sino de la humanidad.

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El Bautismo Del Señor



Normalmente el domingo que sigue a la fiesta de la Epifanía es dedicado a celebrar el bautismo de Cristo y señala la culminación de todo el ciclo natalicio o de la manifestación del Señor. Es también el domingo que

da paso al tiempo durante el año, llamado también tiempo ordinario. Cuando Cristo se metió en la cola para esperar su turno de ser bautizado, seguramente San Juan Bautista no sabía que hacer. Llegó el Mesías delante de él y pidió el bautismo. El Bautista exclamó: "Soy yo el que necesita ser bautizado por ti, ¿tú vienes a mí?" (Mt 3,14). El Catecismo hace referencia a esta actitud humilde de Cristo en el n.536:

Hay una diferencia importante entre los dos bautismos:

El de Juan: con agua, exterior, signo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados.
El de JESUS: con Espíritu Santo, renovación interior que nos hace "participes de la natura-

leza divina"

"No soy digno ni siquiera de desatar la correa de su sandalia..." trabajo reservado al más inútil de los esclavos... Juan destaca la infinita distancia entre él y Jesús...

¿Porqué entonces Jesús se hace bautizar por Juan? [es una escena tan impresionante, que podría resultar incomprensible, y hasta escandalosa]...

Pero admitámoslo, y descubramos nuevamente el "modo" que Dios emplea para salvarnos: hoy se pone en la fila de los pecadores, y aunque no lo necesitaba, se somete también a un bautismo de penitencia... Se ha hecho semejante a nosotros en todo, y por eso no se avergüenza de colocarse en la fila de aquellos que se preparaban para la llegada del Reino de Dios... así como tampoco se avergonzó de nosotros cuando tomó sobre sí todos nuestros pecados, y subió a la Cruz como si fuese un delincuente...

Pero el bautismo que recibió Jesús fue muy "especial": ciertos hechos nos indican que con Él comienza un nuevo bautismo:
El cielo abierto (ya nunca más cerrado por los

pecados, como hasta este momento) Es decir, comienza una nueva etapa de relación entre Dios y los hombres: el Cielo viene a nosotros, y nosotros vamos allá: viene con Cristo y el Espíritu Santo. Llegó todo, porque Dios mismo viene, y Él será para nosotros y nos dará todo. Estamos frente al comienzo de una nueva humanidad, divinizada.

En la proposición que San Marcos hace en su Evangelio, el Padre no "presenta" a su Hijo ("Este es mi Hijo amado"), sino que se dirige a Él ("Tú eres mi Hijo..."): Cristo nos representa a todos, que desde ese momento pasamos a ser hijos amados, complacencia del Padre... Cuando somos bautizados, esta vocación eterna se verifica efectivamente, verdaderamente: somos una nueva creación. Por lo tanto, nuestra dignidad, nuestra gloria, y nuestro compromiso pasa por VIVIR NUESTRO BAUTISMO...

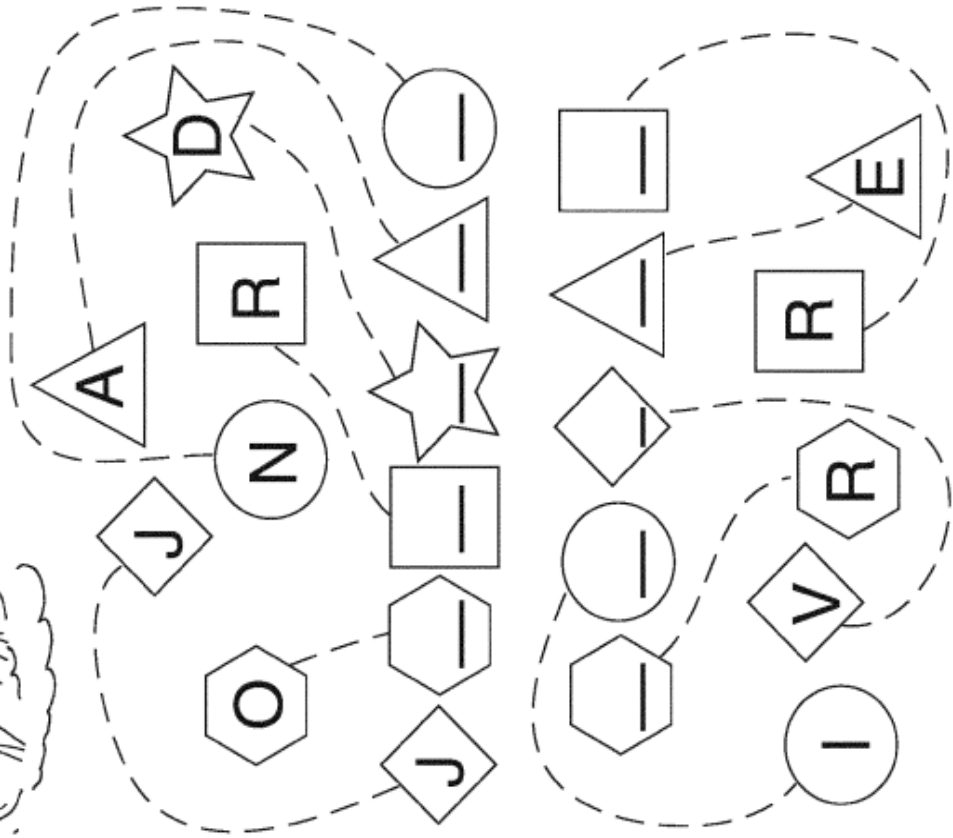

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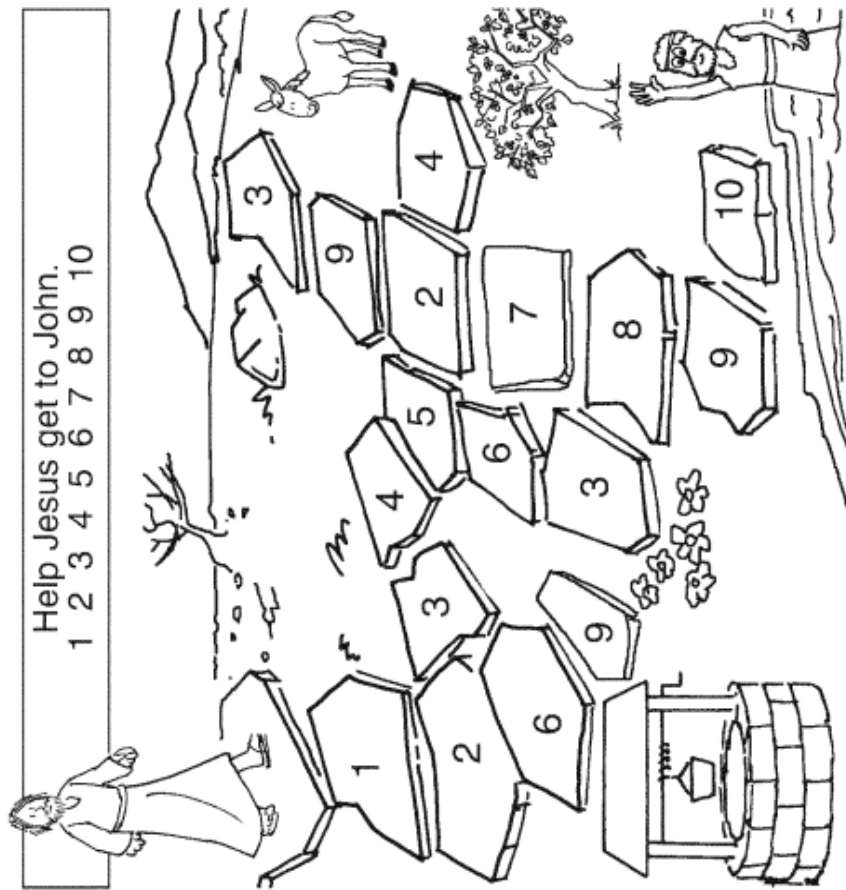
