The Choir also sings for special events (Blessing of the Crib) and Holy Days (Christmas Eve, Easter Sunday, etc.). They may also be called upon to sing on additional Sundays.

No experience is necessary, but children must have basic reading skills.

The Adult Choir sings for Christmas Midnight Mass, Holy Week, and special occasions.

Previous experience is desirable, but not necessary.

All Adults will have completed the VIRTUS Course or be given the opportunity to do so.

MUSINGS FROM FATHER DANIEL - LIVING THE LITURGY

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

The celebration of the Liturgy, the Church's public, official worship of God, is not only the most important thing we do but also the place where we are most often together. It's wonderful that, as a parish family, we often come together also for other events – most recently our wonderful Oktoberfest, but also the Feast of St Rocco, discussion groups, parties, talks, and many other occasions. But, week in and week out, we see each other most frequently and regularly at Mass, which is the principle, but not only, celebration of the Liturgy.

Since I like writing but haven't really had much time for that in the past few years, I've fallen out of the habit of writing columns for the Bulletin. But now, since having stepped down as President of the Schools of St Mary's (Manhasset), I'm happy to take up quill and ink – metaphorically – and share some thoughts (inchoate or possibly even coherent) with you regularly. While from time to time other topics might present themselves for my – hopefully our – interested musings, the Liturgy, so central and important to our lives, stands at the front of the line.

The Second Vatican Council's "Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*)², a document infrequently read, often ignored by those who have read it, and misunderstood by even more, states in paragraph 14 the following: "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy."³ While in no way denying the efficacy of the Liturgy without our understanding of it, the call to a real and ever deepening understanding (when that term is properly understood!)⁴ of the Liturgy is a most excellent undertaking. Not only because of the beauty, direction, comfort, and assistance of what the Liturgy contains, but also because it weakens us (and deprives us) to do something over and over and not know what we are doing or why we are doing it! Repetition is, indeed, the Mother of learning⁵, but only the beginning and guide. And even if, when not understanding, we do personally benefit and truly participate, how can we ever lead others to experience that gift which we ourselves leave, at least somewhat, unopened?

So, for the sensible, to talk about something requires – though many ignore this – to be clear about what we are talking. What is liturgy? So often we hear the tired old (not so tasty⁶) canard that "liturgy means 'the work of the people'". Well. Sort of. The Greek source for this term is: λειτουργία [*leitourgia*], which is based on the words λαός [*la-os*] (don't worry about the "t" that shows up; it's from another Greek dialect), meaning "people", and ἔργον [*ergon*] meaning "work". So we can see how one might come to the translation "work of the people". But this is misleading and ahistorical.

The λειτουργία of the ancient (Greek) world was not something the people did, or determined, or planned, or directed, nor was it "about them" – which is the sense one might get (and which many, for ideological reasons, have put forward with the interpretation "work of the people") it was something done **for the people**.

Those who were responsible in a city-state would put together public works, games, festivals (religious, since everything was religious), even plays (this is the origin of drama) to serve, educate, guide and even protect the people. Liturgy, in this historical sense, was not "of the people" or "from the people" or even "by the people" but something **for** them, **on behalf** of them. That's enough for today.

Your homework (ungraded!) is (to begin) to see the Liturgy in this context! What can this mean?

² Vatican Documents take their name from the first two or three words of the text in Latin (such as Pope Leo XIV's recent Apostolic Exhortation "*Dilexi Te*" ("I have loved you")) or sometimes in the so-called vulgar tongue (like *Mit brennender Sorge*, ("with burning concern") the German encyclical sent by Pope Pius XI to the German Bishops on 14 March, 1937 regarding the travails that the Church under Hitler was experiencing).

XXIX Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario: Orar siempre, sin desanimarse

Éxodo 17, 8-13

Los amalecitas eran una tribu vecina de Judá que vivía en el Negueb, al sur de Israel y que controlaba las rutas de caravanas entre Egipto y Arabia; eran rudos y temibles; pero los israelitas los vencen, no tanto por su poder militar, cuanto por la oración perseverante de Moisés. Durante el tiempo en que Moisés mantiene los brazos alzados, los israelitas vencen. Si los baja, los israelitas son derrotados. Moisés es un héroe para el pueblo, por su resistencia; pero lo que se hace claro es que la protección de Dios es la que salva al pueblo siempre y cuando el pueblo esté unido a Dios.

2 Timoteo 3, 14-4, 2

Hay que entender este pasaje dentro de su contexto literario y cultural. Se pone énfasis en los maestros falsos y se recuerda que, dentro de esa cultura, la mentira, el secretismo y el engaño son estrategias aceptables. Es difícil saber cuándo se está diciendo la verdad y eso puede resultar muy frustrante; por eso la afirmación de que el autor se basa en la Sagrada escritura da credibilidad al mensaje de Pablo.

Lucas 18, 1-8



Este material es muy típico de Lucas. Concluye con dos parábolas sobre la oración. En la primera se pone de manifiesto la necesidad de una oración perseverante y continua para no caer en el error o la apostasía. En la segunda se pone énfasis en la necesidad de orar humildemente, sabiendo que no son nuestros méritos los que alcanzan resultados y que la persona tiene que sentirse en total dependencia de la gracia de Dios.

Oración introductoria: Señor, quiero crecer en mi amor a Ti y a los demás; alimentar mi amistad contigo por medio de la oración humilde y perseverante. Ayúdame a buscar cumplir tu voluntad sobre mi vida, dejando que tus palabras modelen todo mi comportamiento. No permitas que el miedo me acobarde. Aumenta mi confianza, mi amor y mi fe.

Petición: Señor, ¡aumentame la fe y mi perseverancia en la oración!

Meditación del Papa Francisco: Hay una lucha que llevar adelante cada día; pero Dios es nuestro aliado, la fe en Él es nuestra fuerza y la oración es la expresión de esta fe. Por eso Jesús nos asegura la victoria, pero nos pregunta: "Pero cuando venga el Hijo del hombre, ¿encontrará fe sobre la tierra?" Si se apaga la fe, se apaga la oración y nosotros caminamos en la oscuridad, nos perdemos en el camino de la vida. Aprendamos por tanto de la viuda del Evangelio a rezar siempre, sin cansarnos. Era buena esta viuda, sabía luchar por sus hijos, y pienso en tantas mujeres que luchan por su

familia, que rezan, que no se cansan nunca. Un recuerdo hoy todos nosotros a estas mujeres que con su actitud nos dan un verdadero testimonio de bien, de valentía, de poder de la oración. Un recuerdo a ellas. Luchar, rezar siempre ¡Pero no para convencer al Señor a fuerza de palabras! ¡El sabe mejor que nosotros qué necesitamos! Más bien la oración perseverante es expresión de la fe en un Dios que nos llama a combatir con Él, cada día, en cada momento, para vencer al mal con el bien. (S.S. Francisco, 20 de octubre de 2013)

Reflexión: Un mosquito en la noche es capaz de dejarnos sin dormir. Y eso que no hay comparación entre un hombre y un mosquito. Pero en esa batalla, el insecto tiene todas las de ganar. ¿Por qué? Porque, aunque es pequeño, revolotea una y otra vez sobre nuestra cabeza con su agudo y molesto silbido. Si únicamente lo hiciera un momento no le daríamos importancia. Pero lo fastidioso es escucharle así durante horas. Entonces, encendemos la luz, nos levantamos y no descansamos hasta haber resuelto el problema. Este ejemplo, y el del juez injusto, nos ilustran perfectamente cómo debe ser nuestra oración: insistente, perseverante,

continua, hasta que Dios "se moleste" y nos atienda. Es fácil rezar un día, hacer una petición cuando estamos fervorosos, pero mantener ese contacto espiritual diario cuesta más. Nos cansamos, nos desanimamos, pensamos que lo que hacemos es inútil porque parece que Dios no nos está escuchando. Sin embargo lo hace. Y presta mucha atención, y nos toma en serio porque somos sus hijos. Pero quiere que le insistamos, que vayamos todos los días a llamar a su puerta. Sólo si no nos rendimos nos atenderá y nos concederá lo que le estamos pidiendo desde el fondo de nuestro corazón. **Propósito:** Dedicar especial tiempo de mi día a la oración con la confianza que Dios me escucha si lo pido con fe y esperanza.

Diálogo con Cristo: Jesús, eres mi juez, pero también mi Padre y mi Salvador. Te suplico que esta oración me lleve a crecer en la fe, en la esperanza, en el amor y en la confianza, en mi vida diaria.
