

OBSERVATIONS, WITH CAVEATS

It's shameful to admit this, but, alas, deception would be worse still. So, I hereby confess: I love everything that I write. Unequivocally. Now, by no means am I so foolish as to think that everything I write – or perhaps even anything that I write – is good or helpful or amusing or even vaguely coherent. Sesquipedalian, turgid, recursive and far-too-self-conscious pseudo-literary exhibitionism can only have a limited appeal. But I don't love what I write because I think it's good (though I dare to hope that sometimes it might be). Recognizing its (my) limitations, I still love it. There is not a single tortured sentence, no bedeviled and overworked metaphor, no grammatical obfuscation that I have willingly committed to paper – virtually or literally – that I don't cherish.

Why? Perhaps one's written progeny resembles a bit – just a bit – one's children, or perhaps friends and family. One loves them because they are. Period. Not because they are perfect, clever, this, that or the other thing. Not because you agree with them, or they with you. Or?

Isn't one of the great trials and signs of decadence of our time – perhaps of every time, yet it seems to have more sway today – that the *Zeitgeist* demands that we adopt, follow and strictly adhere to, with unwavering faith, this particular lethal, pernicious and totally false definition of love, even if not always so clearly and honestly expressed: to love people, the Lie declares, you must agree and love completely with what they say and love; you must support what they support; you must dislike and even hate, what they dislike and hate. And so on. On to perdition, and to the destruction of families, friendships, and societies.

In this doubtless silly analogy, I love my silly writing without its ever achieving the goals I set out for it, without any objective excellence, without its even really saying what I wanted it to say. I can – and should, and do – criticize it, disagree with it, encourage it to be better, am disappointed with it, and still love it.

Should we not love others the same way?

Is not a vast meta-problem of our society that we are told only to love – whatever we are coming to mean by that term – or even simply treat decently and humanly others who reflect our own image, our own thoughts? And to demonize those who have different opinions?

In our nation, torn (now especially) by disagreements (real, serious and complicated), hatred (always wrong) and the deliciously evil self-justification that my thinking is always right (even if in some ways it is!), the unwillingness to love the Other (who may be as wrong and misguided as my prose), and even to see Christ in the Other, and give the Other (regardless of being right or wrong) some – at least some – human respect and some prayer, gives the Devil (who is real) precisely what he wants.

Hate or ignore or argue with or even love my scribbling. But, everybody: love everyone.

Foolish, of course, But not **so** foolish!

I've been looking for a chance (of course I have) to use that otherwise underused word. "Sesqui" in Latin means "one and a half", and the "pedelian" comes from "feet". so "one and a half feet" or ridiculously long [words]. This is in distinction to the delightful and rarely useful word which you might soon be seeing: semiquincentennial (half of 500 years) for the 250th anniversary (of the US this July 4th). The other possible term considered for this event and equally rarefied but, I would argue, slightly less precise, is sestercentennial (which literally means "half (less than) three hundred"). Don't even get started on: bisesquicentennial!

Please leave me this illusion!

I do always agree with what I've written, or at least what I've actually written. How frustrating to find that one has not infrequently said something other than what one intended to say.

I love the word, but I don't like to current "cultural appropriation" which treats it as an English word and not a German one!

To a degree which most would say exceeds that obedience owed religious beliefs! But then modern culture IS a religion [and a screed on the misuse of the word 'religion' is percolating], and its devotees are fierce and ready to burn heretics blithely!

You can't imagine the internal conversations (arguments) I have with myself when I write. And it's better that way!

That doesn't mean we don't debate, argue, disagree, defend our beliefs, or any of those things. But how do we do that? In fact, it's not possible to love if we don't tell others the truth, and the Truth, who is Christ.

Jesus said this. No exceptions.





Vine a dar la plenitud a los profetas



Oración introductoria: Señor, Dios mío, abre mi alma para que puedas modular mi corazón a través de esta meditación que me dispongo a realizar. Haz que mis ojos se centren en tu misericordia para que me dé cuenta del inmenso amor que me tienes. Es en tu misericordia, Señor, que quiero apoyar esta sencilla oración, es en ella que quiero poner mis intenciones y las intenciones de mis seres más queridos. Jesús, que no me aparte de tus mandamientos.

Meditación: Muchas veces creemos que el cristianismo es una lista larga de normas y mandamientos que debemos cumplir. Es más, parece que Cristo, en este pasaje, nos complica más nuestros deberes. Pero eso no es el cristianismo: "No se comienza a ser cristiano por una decisión ética o una gran idea, (o, podemos añadir a las palabras del Papa, por el cumplimiento de normas), sino por el encuentro con un acontecimiento, con una Persona, que da un nuevo horizonte a la vida y, con ello, una orientación decisiva". (Deus Caritas est, n.1). Es sólo a través de Cristo, del prisma de su amor, que se puede, no sólo entender, sino sobre todo vivir lo que nos corresponde como sus seguidores. Si atendemos bien, la

lista de leyes que Cristo perfecciona en este evangelio tiene necesariamente un punto de unión con el amor, sea a Dios o al prójimo. Acaso, el saber perdonar al que nos ofende, al que ha dañado nuestra familia, nuestro trabajo, nuestro interior o nuestra situación económica, ¿no es el acto supremo del amor? El guardar nuestra pureza de corazón y de cuerpo, ¿no es un acto heroico de amor a nuestro Señor? El matrimonio, ¿no se puede traducir como fidelidad en el amor que Dios unió? Y, la coherencia en los deberes contraídos ante Dios, ¿no es una postura de un alma que quiere amar con sinceridad? Sólo Cristo nos da la fuerza, los ánimos, el coraje y la paciencia para ser auténticos seguidores de su Persona; sólo así, nuestro compromiso de cristianos deja de ser un peso y se convierte en una respuesta de amor al Amor.

Reflexión apostólica: Cristo viene a "dar plenitud" a ley y a los profetas. Viene a purificar en el fuego lo que le impide a nuestro corazón darse plenamente a Dios. Lo que Cristo pide es un plus de justicia en la convivencia con los demás; un plus de santidad en la realización de nuestras tareas más ordinarias; un plus de generosidad en nuestra oración, en la vivencia de los sacramentos: "si su justicia no es mayor...". Por eso para Cristo no basta hacer justicia humana con el que nos ofende, pide que lo perdonemos, que nos

reconciliemos con él. No le basta que no se cometa adulterio, quiere que custodiamos la pureza de nuestro corazón con una voluntad tajante: "si tu mano derecha es para ti ocasión de pecado, córtatela y arrójala lejos de ti". No le basta la ley del divorcio, sino que correspondamos al designio divino sobre el matrimonio (cfr. Mt 19, 4). A Cristo, en fin, no le basta la vivencia externa de nuestros deberes de cristianos; ¡quiere nuestra coherencia, nuestra sinceridad de vida: "digan sí cuando sea sí...!"

Propósito: Buscaré dar un plus en alguna responsabilidad de mi vida cristiana (en mi oración, en mi trato con los demás, en mi sinceridad, en perdonar...).

Diálogo con Cristo: Jesucristo, cuántas veces me fijo más en lo que me cuesta cumplir que en lo que te costó sufrir por mí; cuántas veces me quejo de mis deberes porque me falta tu amor. Tú conoces mejor que nadie mi debilidad y mi pequeñez, pero también conoces cuánto quiero responder a tu amor. Te pido que, así como viniste a perfeccionar la Ley judía, perfecciones la sinceridad, la humildad, la entrega y la pureza de mi corazón. Te lo pido por la intercesión de su santísima Madre la Virgen María. Así sea.
