

En esta lectura encontramos el relato de Adán y Eva, que nos muestra cómo, a pesar de todo lo que Dios ha hecho por el ser humano "sopló en su nariz un aliento de vida, lo colocó en el Edén..." el hombre y la mujer rechazan cumplir la voluntad de Dios porque quieren ser "como Dios". Se trata de hacer un contraste entre dos cosas opuestas y Pablo hace la comparación entre los efectos del pecado y la muerte, y el poder del perdón y la vida; y lo hace contrastando a Adán con Jesucristo; pero en realidad, se trata de comparar y contrastar dos épocas: la de Adán es de pecado y de muerte, y la de Jesucristo es la de la restauración de la vida. Al hablar de Adán, Pablo parece referirse a toda la humanidad: hombre y mujeres.



Mateo 4, 1-11

Hemos iniciado la Cuaresma, Jesús es el Maestro que nos enseña el camino y el método para vencer las tentaciones. El camino es la misericordia de Dios que viaja por la vida con nosotros, y nos salva de las caídas. El método es vivir de la Palabra de Dios en toda circunstancia. # Las tentaciones en el desierto



El desierto. La tarde. Ayuno y oración. Cristo ha pasado en este ambiente cuarenta días con sus noches. Profunda preparación espiritual para iniciar la vida pública. Pero antes de abandonar la soledad quiere someterse a la tentación. Él, en todo igual a nosotros, menos en el pecado, quiere pasar por donde pasamos los hombres. Quiere dejarnos bien claro desde el primer momento que hay un enemigo, diversas batallas por librar pero, sobre todo, que la victoria puede ser siempre nuestra. Nos dice el Evangelio que al final del retiro se acercó Satanás a Jesús. No se puede hablar aquí de un pasaje parábólico. El hecho es real, tanto para Cristo como para nosotros: hay alguien en la vida que en determinadas circunstancias se nos acerca. Y el Evangelio dice para qué: para tentarnos. No se puede perder de vista a este ser, ni dudar de su existencia y cercanía simplemente porque no se le vea. San Pedro escribe que ronda como león rugiente buscando a quién devorar. Ignorarlo es darle una ventaja que le interesa: un enemigo invisible es infaliblemente mortífero.

El demonio lo sabe. Por eso nunca se presenta como lo pintamos: con cuernos, cola y olor a azufre. Posee un Amplio armario de disfraces y viste el que considera mejor para seducir a cada hombre en cada ocasión. También intentó hacer esto con Cristo. Se muestra interesado por el Señor: por su cansancio, su salud, su comodidad. Lo adula y halaga. Se disfraza de amigo. Y ofrece sus "favores" sin ninguna otra intención que la de "su bien".

Sus favores son las tentaciones, mercancía que vende en atractivos envoltorios. Tal como se insinuó a Eva: ¡Seréis como dioses! ¿Le hablaba de la ofensa a Dios, de la amargura del remordimiento, del dolor que se desencadenaría con el pecado, del castigo y de la muerte? No. Mostraba la tentación de tal forma que el fruto era apetitoso a la vista y sabroso al paladar. Así son todos los "favores" que el demonio hace: buen sabor, pero mala digestión.

Cristo sabe que el demonio atacará sutilmente, que hasta le esgrimirá como argumento la misma Palabra de Dios. Es consciente de que no le dejará a la primera y de que le opondrá su "bien personal" al plan de Dios. No se le

oculta que la intención del diablo será, en definitiva, abrirle una puerta de fuga en su camino hacia el Calvario.

Cristo tiene en cuenta al enemigo, conoce su plan, se prepara para la lucha con la oración y el sacrificio, cimenta su vida en la voluntad de Dios... Así es como se explica su victoria. "Yo, el Maestro, os he dado ejemplo para que vosotros hagáis lo mismo..."

Tres tentaciones de Cristo. Tres tentaciones a las que el cristiano se enfrenta diariamente. Tres tentaciones que buscan degradar, destruir y sacar la alegría y la frescura del Evangelio. Que nos encierran en un círculo de destrucción y de pecado. Vale la pena que nos preguntemos: ¿Hasta dónde somos conscientes de estas tentaciones en nuestra persona, en nosotros mismos? ¿Hasta dónde nos hemos habituado a un estilo de vida que piensa que en la riqueza, en la vanidad y en el orgullo está la fuente y la fuerza de la vida? ¿Hasta dónde creemos que el cuidado del otro, nuestra preocupación y ocupación por el pan, el nombre y la dignidad de los demás son fuente de alegría y esperanza?.
