



II Domingo de Cuaresma

Génesis 12, 1-4A

Los desplazamientos eran normales en las poblaciones del tiempo de Abram; eran grupos nómadas; pero, en este caso, hay un acto de obediencia. El desplazamiento no es temporal, sino definitivo y fundado en una promesa hecha por un Dios desconocido; la promesa es de una descendencia numerosa. La estabilidad se marca con la construcción de los altares de Siquén y Betel. Estos gestos, que significan posesión del territorio, son el argumento religioso para reclamar el derecho sobre la tierra. A Abram se le ordena marchar a tierra extranjera. Como los antiguos creían



que la tierra estaba bajo el control de los dioses, dejar la tierra era dejar al dios de ella. Está claro por este relato que el Dios de Abram no estaba ligado a esas restricciones. Sus órdenes exigen una profunda fe por parte de Abram, a quien se le pide que deje todos sus lazos de origen que determinaban su identidad y su herencia. Dios le pide que empiece de nuevo.



En este caso, las dificultades son parte integrante de una vida recta.

Mateo 17, 1-9

La historia relata una teofanía, una revelación de Dios. Aquí se dan dos experiencias: la de Jesús mismo y la de los apóstoles. Las cimas de las montañas siempre han estado consideradas en muchas religiones como lugares donde habitaban los dioses; por eso la gente iba a esos lugares a tener una experiencia de Dios. Fue en una montaña donde se mostró la gloria de Jesús transfigurado.



2 Timoteo 1, 8 B-10

Pablo no piensa solamente en las dificultades que surgen del ministerio; habla de una llamada a la santidad, que se extiende a todos.



Hay muchas formas de salir de nosotros mismos, de hacer un camino interior para encontrar a Dios. Cuando hacemos esto internamente, en oración, muchas veces Dios concede la gracia de contemplar su belleza y de su gloria. Se sabe que se ha estado en la presencia de Dios cuando la experiencia está acompañada de paz, alegría, serenidad y fortaleza. No es un resplandor de un momento, sino una seguridad de que ese Dios que nos ha llamado a estar con Él no nos abandona nunca; es la seguridad de que, como los discípulos, aunque tengamos que bajar de la montaña, atender a nuestras obligaciones y enfrentarnos a todas las dificultades de la vida, Dios está presente con su luz y su fuerza.

Las tentaciones en el desierto



El Evangelio es el libro de las enseñanzas por excelencia. En él se delinea el camino a seguir para llegar algún día a la Jerusalén celestial. Una continua invitación de Jesús es la de ser luz de las naciones, la de guiar a

nuestros hermanos. «Ustedes son la luz del mundo». Es claro el mensaje del Señor, tenemos que ser luz en todo el sentido de la palabra. Por ello, al presentarse transfigurado, les muestra la fuerza del testimonio de quien irradia esa luz. Es la luz verdadera que no se enciende para esconderla sino para ponerla en lo alto e iluminar a los demás. Es por ello que también lo hace en un monte. Jesús muestra que el verdadero testimonio es capaz de suscitar en los corazones aspiraciones como las de san Pedro «que bien se está aquí», quien no termina de entender lo que está sucediendo, pero es tal la fuerza de la luz que dobla su corazón.

Ésta es nuestra misión, las palabras pueden convencer pero el testimonio arrastra. Ayúdame, Señor a que mi coherencia de cristiano, sirva como testimonio evangelizador. Que mi vida sea verdadera luz para aquellos que se encuentran en tinieblas y sombras de muerte.

Homilía de S.S. Francisco: Miren, queridos

amigos, la fe en nuestra vida hace una revolución que podríamos llamar copernicana, nos quita del centro y pone en el centro a Dios; la fe nos inunda de su amor que nos da seguridad, fuerza y esperanza. Aparentemente parece que no cambia nada, pero, en lo más profundo de nosotros mismos, cambia todo. Cuando está Dios en nuestro corazón habita la paz, la dulzura, la ternura, el entusiasmo, la serenidad y la alegría, que son frutos del Espíritu Santo, entonces y nuestra existencia se transforma, nuestro modo de pensar y de obrar se renueva, se convierte en el modo de pensar y de obrar de Jesús, de Dios.

Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma: Todos los años, el II Domingo de Cuaresma, la Iglesia nos ofrece el relato de la Transfiguración. Después de haber contemplado en el Domingo anterior la figura de Cristo padeciendo la tentación, como verdadero hombre, la Palabra de Dios nos muestra hoy al Hijo de Dios, en su gloria eterna, como verdadero Dios. El Evangelio quiere mostrar que no debemos separar la Pasión de la Resurrección; no debemos considerar los dolores de la cruz, sin pensar en la gloria de la Pascua. Hoy también la Iglesia, a través de su liturgia, nos invita a mantener unidos estos dos grandes temas, cuando en este tiempo penitencial de Cuaresma, mientras nos preparamos para la Semana Santa, nos muestra esta escena gloriosa de la Transfiguración; o también cuando a continuación del relato de las tentaciones,

que leemos en el Ier Domingo de este tiempo, en este IIº Domingo nos habla de la Gloria. De toda esta Epifanía (manifestación divina): vestidos deslumbrantes; Moisés y Elías (flor y nata del Antiguo Testamento); nube; voz celestial... De entre todo esto, prestemos particular atención a lo que dice la voz de Padre Celestial, desde la nube: ESTE ES MI HIJO AMADO: ESCÚCHENLO (los títulos de Jesús) (lo que debemos hacer frente a Él) Seguir a Cristo nos ha cambiado totalmente la vida. . . ¿O no? (Si seguir a Cristo no nos cambia la vida: ¿Qué significa efectivamente para nosotros ser cristianos?). Justamente, la Cuaresma nos invita a ser de verdad cristianos, dejando aquellas cosas que desdican de nuestra dignidad de hijos de Dios. Pero ¿en nombre de qué Cristo tiene derecho a pedirnos esto? El Señor quiere darnos esta gracia de la conversión... Abrahám (cfr. I lect.), dispuesto a entregar a su hijo amado, se transforma en un símbolo del amor del Padre, que no dudó en entregar, por nosotros y nuestra salvación, a su Hijo único... Y Abraham también nos enseña a anteponer la esperanza en el Dios que no vemos a las pequeñas esperanzas palpables. Sólo creyendo y esperando contra toda esperanza, abandonando todos los asideros que nos atan, nos convertiremos, por la obediencia, en instrumentos de su bendición (como nuestro padre en la fe).
