## OBSERVATIONS, WITH CAVEATS

Welcome to Holy Week! You have already entered Holy Week (or are about to do so, depending on when you read the Bulletin!) with the celebration of the Lord's Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem, which we know as Palm Sunday. This Week is like no other, and it merits not to be ignored or overlooked; it calls out to be cherished and loved and experienced! Join us!

The Church, you know, asks very little of us really. Yes, yes, I know that, in the eyes of the world, and sometimes in our eyes, weakened by the world's lies, it looks like – and is held to be a commonplace truth – that the Church asks far too much from Her members . . . but that's just not true. For example, all that is required of us, as Catholics in good standing, is that we come to Mass this weekend, Palm Sunday, and that we again attend Mass next Sunday, Easter Sunday.<sup>1</sup> No more is . . . required; with that, we fulfill your duty. And that is true.

However, the idea of “doing the minimum”, helpful within limits, often becomes the enemy of “achieving the excellent.” Wouldn't it be sad, deeply sad, to have been here today and to have heard all that Jesus will do in this week before us, for us – that He will offer Himself, be betrayed, suffer and die, and rise – that we will have heard that and then leave Him alone while He does it, simply coming back next Sunday to claim the prize of his Resurrection? It seems churlish, ungrateful even.<sup>2</sup>

Now, if perhaps you can do nothing else – work or illness or some serious obligation preventing you from doing more, from being present at the liturgies of Holy Week – then the Church's generosity truly shows itself as kindness. But – and this is the moment for a real self-examination<sup>3</sup> – why would you want to be anywhere else this Week? Where else is there to be?

This Week, the Greatest Week, stands not only at the center of the Church's year<sup>4</sup>, at the heart of our self-understanding as Christians, but at the very center of everything that is! The Liturgies of Holy Week are not simply splendid, dramatic, beautiful reminders of what Christ has done (though they also are that); they are portals through which we truly travel, by which we are transported, to find ourselves at the very events of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ! We are not an audience, not spectators, not gawkers, not recallers of the Great and Lifegiving Events; we are actors, players, participants, as we have always been. But who are we, in the Great Drama that is reality?

On Palm Sunday, we are without question those who wave our palm branches enthusiastically and claim Christ as our King! Ah, but do we then turn on Him, betray Him, shout (as we did today!) “Crucify Him! Crucify Him!” as we have in the past, since He was crucified, remember, not by the Romans or the Jews, but by everyone, including us and our sins?<sup>5</sup> Who do we want to be?

On Holy Thursday, as we are truly seated at the Last Supper, truly hearing Christ say, “This is My Body, given for you” do we choose to stay with Him, face the torture and the ridicule with Him, or do we – as our past sins indicate – betray Him as did Judas, deny Him as did Peter, run away as all the other Apostles did (except brave and loving John)? The choice is now ours!

Will we walk and stand with Him on Good Friday, through the jeering hatred of the Crowd; will we die with Him – for this is His great and transforming invitation, to die with Him! – or will we hide, will we “have somewhere else to be” as did his closest friends and followers (except brave and loving John)? The choice is again ours.

Shall Holy Saturday, that strangest of all days in the Church's (and History's) calendar find us with Him in the Tomb, waiting, trusting in the darkness? Or somewhere else? We get to decide.

Christ will rise on Easter morning – even for us, whether we're there or not. The Royal Invitation is delivered! Where else could we possibly want to be?

<sup>1</sup> And this falls under the simple rule that we are to attend Mass every Sunday! Nothing extra even for Easter!

<sup>2</sup> And so very sad.

<sup>3</sup> Which goes well with the opportunity, tomorrow, Monday, 30 March, of going to Confession in the “marathon” of Confessions, available in every parish in the Diocese of Rockville Centre from 2:00 to 4:00 pm and again from 6:00 to 9:00 pm!

<sup>4</sup> To live by the Church's calendar, to allow its rhythms to animate our life, refreshes and invigorates us and gives us true direction. Why just live in the secular world and by its tepid, directionless, off-key melodies?

<sup>5</sup> After all, that's why the palm branches we held aloft last year came back to us as the ashes with which we freely marked our foreheads as sinners on Ash Wednesday!

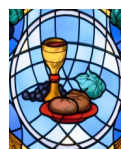

## Liturgy of the Word

We recall and commemorate the events of our salvation as we begin Holy Week. As we remember the suffering and death of Jesus, we are drawn more deeply into the mystery of God's steadfast love for all humanity: God so loved the world that he sent his only Son that all may be saved.

Saint Matthew writes of Jesus' celebrated entry into Jerusalem, where some of the very large crowd cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. Isaiah prophesies of one who will speak to the weary a word that will rouse them. Paul writes to the Philippians about the total self giving of Christ and his exaltation by the Father. In the Gospel Matthew gives his account of the last hours of Jesus, including their Passover meal, his betrayal, and his passion death and burial.

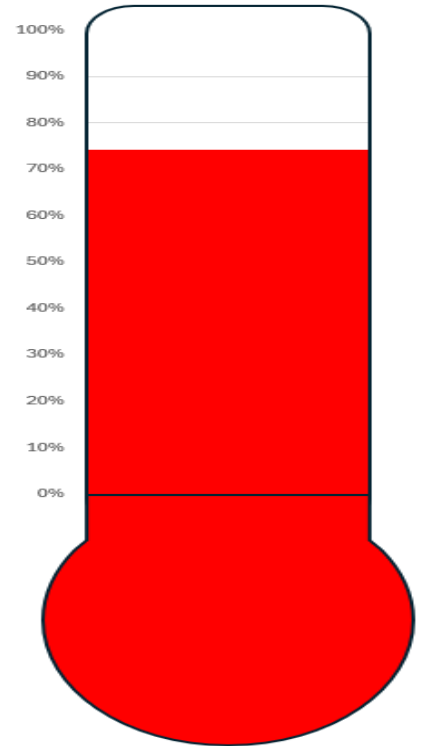

Isaías 50, 4-7

Para nosotros los cristianos las lecturas de hoy nos muestran formas de ver a Jesucristo como el sirviente que sufre. Este sirviente en Isaías tiene cualidades que generaciones posteriores verán en Jesús. Es quien tiene siempre los oídos dispuestos a escuchar la palabra de Dios. Es quien no se rebela o da la espalda cuando sus enemigos lo persiguen. Jesús es quien dice: "El Señor es mi ayuda. . . a quien temeré".



2 Filipenses 2, 6-11

La noble descripción que Pablo hace de Jesucristo es realmente un himno. Describe a Jesús como quien está dispuesto a dar todo para cumplir el plan de Dios para nuestra salvación. Jesús no vino esperando vivir grandiosamente, como un rey o como el "número uno", a pesar de que eso es lo que realmente él es. Aun cuando él es Dios, vino a nosotros como el más pequeño de todos, para mostrarnos que el amor de Dios no depende de riquezas ni de honores. Pablo nos dice que esta debe ser nuestra actitud. Nuestro amor debe ser como el Dios.

Mateo 26, 14-27, 66

Este evangelio es una lectura de la pasión (sufrimiento) de Cristo. En este domingo leemos el recuento de Mateo. Vemos a Jesús traicionado por dos de sus amigos, Judas y Pedro, y por la multitud. Vemos que se burlan de él y los soldados lo maltratan al tiempo que se ríen de él ofreciéndole honor como rey de los judíos. Herido, coronado de espinas y muriendo a cada paso en el camino, Jesús carga la cruz hasta el calvario. Su sufrimiento es tan grande que piensa que hasta Dios se ha olvidado de él. A pesar de todo Jesús está dispuesto a entregar su espíritu. A igual que el centurión rezamos: "Verdaderamente este hombre era el Hijo de Dios".



## Domingo de Ramos

### Solemnidad

Martirologio Romano: Domingo de Ramos en la Pasión del Señor, cuando nuestro Señor Jesucristo, como indica la profecía de Zacarías, entró en Jerusalén sentado sobre un pollino de borrica, y a su encuentro salió la multitud con ramos de olivos. El Domingo de Ramos abre solemnemente la Semana Santa, con el recuerdo de las Palmas y de la pasión, de la entrada de Jesús en Jerusalén y la liturgia de la palabra que evoca la Pasión del Señor en el Evangelio de San Mateo. En este día, se entrecruzan las dos tradiciones litúrgicas que han dado origen a esta celebración: la alegre, multitudinaria, festiva liturgia de la iglesia madre de la ciudad santa, que se convierte en mimesis, imitación de los que Jesús hizo en Jerusalén, y la austera memoria -anamnesis- de la pasión que marcaba la liturgia de Roma. Liturgia de Jerusalén y de Roma, juntas en nuestra celebración. Con una evocación que no puede dejar de ser actualizada. Vamos con el pensamiento a Jerusalén, subimos al Monte de los olivos para recalar en la capilla de Betfagé, que nos recuerda el gesto de Jesús, gesto profético, que entra como Rey pací-

fico, Mesías aclamado primero y condenado después, para cumplir en todas las profecías. Por un momento la gente revivió la esperanza de tener ya consigo, de forma abierta y sin subterfugios aquel que venía en el nombre del Señor. Al menos así lo entendieron los más sencillos, los discípulos y gente que acompañó a Jesús, como un Rey. San Lucas no habla de olivos ni palmas, sino de gente que iba alfombrando el camino con sus vestidos, como se recibe a un Rey, gente que gritaba: "Bendito el que viene como Rey en nombre del Señor. Paz en el cielo y gloria en lo alto". Palabras con una extraña evocación de las mismas que anunciaron el nacimiento del Señor en Belén a los más humildes. Jerusalén, desde el siglo IV, en el esplendor de su vida litúrgica celebraba este momento con una procesión multitudinaria. Y la cosa gustó tanto a los peregrinos que occidente dejó plasmada en esta procesión de ramos una de las más bellas celebraciones de la Semana Santa. Con la liturgia de Roma, por otro lado, entramos en la Pasión y anticipamos la proclamación del misterio, con un gran contraste entre el camino triunfante del Cristo del Domingo de Ramos y el Viacrucis de los días santos. Sin embargo, son las últimas palabras de Jesús en el madero la nueva semilla que debe empujar el remo

evangelizador de la Iglesia en el mundo. "Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu". Este es el evangelio, está la nueva noticia, el contenido de la nueva evangelización. Desde una paradoja este mundo que parece tan autónomo necesita que se le anuncie el misterio de la debilidad de nuestro Dios en la que se demuestra el culmen de su amor. Como lo anunciaron los primeros cristianos con estas narraciones largas y detallistas de la pasión de Jesús. Era el anuncio del amor de un Dios que baja con nosotros hasta el abismo de lo que no tiene sentido, del pecado y de la muerte, del absurdo grito de Jesús en su abandono y en su confianza extrema. Era un anuncio al mundo pagano tanto más realista cuanto con él se podía medir la fuerza de la Resurrección. La liturgia de las palmas anticipa en este domingo, llamado Pascua florida, el triunfo de la resurrección; mientras que la lectura de la Pasión nos invita a entrar conscientemente en la Semana Santa de la Pasión gloriosa y amorosa de Cristo el Señor.

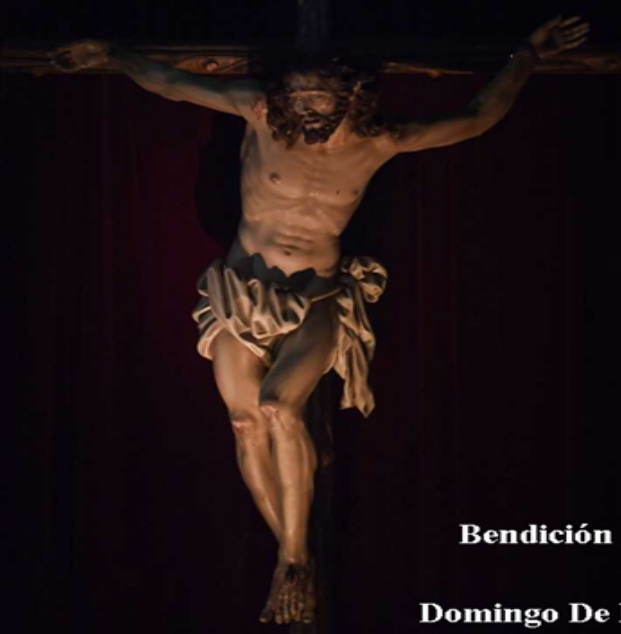
