OBSERVATIONS, WITH CAVEATS

Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen!!

Do we even remember that it's still Easter? I rather think not. The World, which at best has a somewhat perverse and thoroughly jejune understanding of Easter, has certainly left it long behind in the dust¹. And confessing this to my shame, even I, who am (tediously) nearly indefatigable in using this greeting throughout the Easter Season, have grown a bit weary, almost – for a slightly wry take on the Easter Prefaces' term – “overcome with Paschal joy”.

But joy is not always easy! Joy is not simply happiness or jollity or cheerfulness², but it is a constant, intentional, active living in that Truth, which is far deeper than the (pseudo-)truth-in-illusion of the optimist or pessimist (though from different angles, of course). Joy is seeing and living in the Beyond-that-is-also-Here; joy is trust, genuine trust, in God and what He has done, is doing, will do: of which the Resurrection is the center and the doorway.

But joy isn't always easy. We have to practice it, ask for it, be aware of it, accept it. That's why, among other reasons, we have the Easter Season – the fifty days from the Resurrection to Pentecost³ – in which to practice living in the joy of the Resurrection, which is contrary, of course, to worldly living. And why? So that at the end of the Easter Season, our “vacation-like” time of basking in the glow of the Resurrection, we might be ready, with the Coming of the Holy Spirit, to get to work! And our work – job, mission, privilege! – is to proclaim Christ to the whole world. Being a disciple of Jesus (more than simply being a “good Catholic”, although that's included, of course!) consists not only in receiving the Gift, but in passing on the Gift!

The two magnificent Feasts surrounding us – the Ascension, this past Thursday⁴, and next Sunday's Great Feast of Pentecost – help us to practice that joy the Resurrection instills, so that we “overcome” with it in the right way!

The Ascension – Christ's entrance into Heaven in His glorified Body (the same one we receive at Holy Communion!) – means not only that He is there, but that we are there! Not totally, not yet; and not without the possibility of leaving Heaven (which is, sadly, always a path open to us when we sin); but we are there. If He is there, and we are in Him (and that's what a Christian life, what Communion means), then are we not in some real sense already there? Yes.⁵

Pentecost, the Holy Spirit's descent not only on the Apostles but on us – in Baptism, Confirmation, in the Eucharist, in our calling out to Him – means that the joy, even when not always felt, is in fact in us, and that we can be(come) the courageous, evangelizing disciples Christ calls us to be. Pray deeply in these next days this life-changing prayer: Come, Holy Spirit!

¹ So that the next feast of the god of consumerism might receive its worship in its temples/stores/internet sites. And so that we are “free” from freedom!

² Although cheerfulness, that is, a constant thoughtfulness of keeping up the spirits of others (and one's own), flows from joy. Cheerfulness accompanies living-in-reality (even when that reality be grim) with a vision of the deeper Reality to which joy testifies. A small virtue, or even none by some accounts, cheerfulness and charity and joy dance together.

³ Which means, of course, “50th (day)” [πεντηκοστή (*pentēkostē*)]. This term, in the Acts of the Apostles, refers to the Jewish Feast of Shavu'ot [שבועות (*Šāvū'ōt*), “weeks”] which occurs 50 days after Passover, celebrating the Giving of the Law to Moses at Mount Sinai and thereby prefiguring the Coming of the Holy Spirit.

⁴ And how fortunate we are here, in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, in the Province of New York, that we celebrate the Ascension [a Holy Day of Obligation – don't forget! If you missed it, go to Confessions before going to Communion] on the right day, 40 days after the Resurrection, as Scripture says! Most places in the US transfer the Feast to the following Sunday, with a good intention I imagine: “so that more people might experience it”, though I fear the logic is specious.

⁵ I'm delighted to say that, on this point, Saint Augustine agrees with me! Well, all right, I agree with him . . .

St Vincent de Paul

“The Harvest is abundant, but the workers are few”

Our Lord, Jesus Christ spoke these words to his disciples to spread the Good News, to feed the hungry and help the poor.

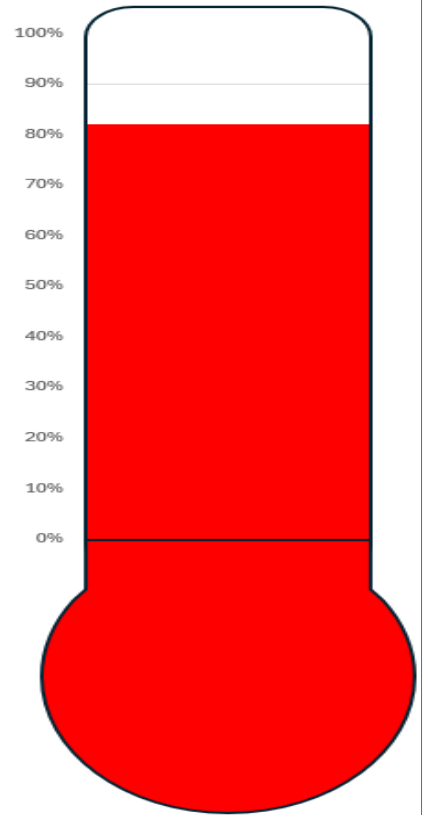

Meditación del Papa Francisco: ¿Quién nos separará del amor de Cristo? Con estas palabras, san Pablo nos habla de la gloria de nuestra fe en Jesús: no sólo resucitó de entre los muertos y ascendió al cielo, sino que nos ha unido a él y nos ha hecho partícipes de su vida eterna. Cristo ha vencido y su victoria es la nuestra. [...] Con san Pablo, nos dicen que, en la muerte y resurrección de su Hijo, Dios nos ha concedido la victoria más grande de todas. En efecto, ni muerte, ni vida, ni ángeles, ni principados, ni presente, ni futuro, ni potencias, ni altura, ni profundidad, ni ninguna otra criatura podrá separarnos del amor de Dios manifestado en Cristo Jesús, nuestro Señor". La victoria de los mártires, su testimonio del poder del amor de Dios

Jesús pide al Padre que nos consagre en la verdad y nos proteja del mundo. Es significativo, ante todo, que Jesús pida al Padre que nos consagre y proteja, pero no que nos aparte del mundo. Sabemos que él envía a sus discípulos para que sean fermento de santidad y verdad en el mundo: la sal de la tierra, la luz del mundo. En esto, los mártires nos muestran el camino. (Homilía de S.S. Francisco, 16 de agosto de 2014). Jesús reza, pide para que la tristeza y el aislamiento no nos gane el corazón. Nosotros queremos hacer lo mismo, queremos unirnos a la oración de Jesús, a sus palabras para decir juntos: "Padre santo, cuídalos con el poder de tu nombre... para que estén completamente unidos, como tú y yo", "y su gozo sea completo". Jesús reza y nos invita a rezar porque sabe que hay cosas que solo las podemos recibir como don, hay cosas que solo podemos vivir como regalo. (Homilía de S.S. Francisco, 20 de septiembre de 2015).

Reflexión: Si alguna vez hemos dirigido a Dios una oración mientras pasábamos por un momento poco deseable, ¿cómo ha sido ese momento de unión con Dios? ¿Qué le hemos pedido, qué le hemos dicho? Lo más cierto

es que hemos dejado desahogar nuestra alma contando a Cristo las penas que atravesábamos en ese momento. Hoy Cristo nos enseña a orar con el alma cargada de temor, de miedo, de pena. Y hoy también Cristo nos dice cuánto se preocupa por nosotros. Que un hombre deje de lado sus sufrimientos y preste mayor atención a otras angustias que no son las suyas, o una de dos: o es un loco que busca fastidiarse la vida con masoquismos o ama vehementemente a los demás. Quien no ha sufrido por una persona ni la conoce ni la ama. Sin embargo, Cristo no se cansa de probarnos su amor. Porque sufrió por nosotros nos ama. La respuesta más humana de nuestra parte debería de ser la de la gratitud. La de nuestra correspondencia a su amistad. Sufriendo un poco Él u ofreciendo el sufrimiento que ya padecemos. Pero también le agradecemos lo que hace por nosotros, y lo hacemos guardando los mandamientos, pero sobre todo custodiando el distintivo que caracteriza a todo cristiano. La caridad. Si Cristo pidió algo ardentemente a su Padre fue precisamente la unidad. "Cuida en tu nombre a los que me has dado para que sean uno" Unidad en la familia, en el trabajo.
