LIVING THE LITURGY #2 - MUSINGS FROM FATHER DANIEL

Well, last week we left off with the statement that "Liturgy" does NOT mean "the work of the people" but rather, "a work for the people, on behalf of the people." Interesting, you say (at least I hope so), but . . . so what? This incorrect idea leads¹ to the misunderstanding that the Liturgy is something which "we do" (though that's *partially* correct) but then – and here's the principal danger – that we decide what it is, that its authorship and authority come from us, that, ultimately, it is an expression of – and should reflect – who we are.

This perilous misunderstanding endangers – among other things – our very participation, our "fully conscious and active participation"² & * in the Liturgy, for which *Sacrosanctum Concilium* pleaded. While certainly we "do" something at liturgy, we are **not** doing something we have made up, we have determined, but something given to us for our own good, for our own edification and growth in holiness, for our own (trans)formation, ultimately, into Christ. The Liturgy is principally God's work on our behalf, which, yes, we carry out. But it does not take its rationale or its efficacy or its very shape from our choosing/liking/disliking, or whatever we may think; rather, it forms us³, transforms us, transports us. If we expect the Liturgy (or anything in life, really) to be and do one thing when it is, in fact, made to do something else, we will most often miss the point and wind up not doing, or at least not doing fully (or well), what it calls us to do.

And for that, it is important to make clear the purpose of the Liturgy: **to worship God**. We come to Mass⁴ to worship God. While the following are all goods which can and do come from the Mass, none of them is the principal purpose for which we attend Mass; therefore, it is proper to say that we do not come to Mass principally to learn, to be uplifted, to receive Holy Communion⁵, to enjoy the music, to listen to homilies (riveting or dull), to form a community, to be entertained, etc.

We worship God. Or, to make that clearer, we **are worshipping** God. We are doing something. We are not, unequivocally not, passive, not an audience! This is an absolutely essential point.

So here, if I may, to underline this truth, I should like to rant just a bit, rant against pews! Pews stink!⁷ Pews confuse. A relatively modern invention – well, since the 16th century, coterminous with the Protestant (so-called) Reformation – pews (or seating in general) didn't exist previously. People stood, bowed, knelt, prostrated themselves, walked around and lit candles, etc. Yes, there might have been some benches, if needed, for the elderly and infirm. But, in general, at the Liturgy, one was active (standing is an active position; sitting is not). The assembled faithful, the congregation – actors in the great drama of the liturgy, participants, not observers, not an audience – by their very posture showed – and were reminded – that they were not watching a play or listening to a lecture.

Does sitting in a pew make clear to you, or others, your real role at Mass?

⁴ Forming is far more than simply teaching us, which is a good but not essential by-product of the Liturgy. It is an idea inherited largely from Protestantism, that the Liturgy's purpose is to educate us – morally or otherwise. The Liturgy is not a pedagogical exercise, though it does teach. This is one of the reasons (but not the only one) why the homily is most certainly not the most important, or even near the most important, parts of the liturgy!

⁶ This merits, and will receive, considerable attention later. While the reception of Holy Communion at Mass is a great gift, of course, it is – and how deeply our current generation has forgotten this – not necessary or even appropriate for everyone always to receive the Eucharist at Mass. Each and every time we approach the Eucharist, we need to be, to borrow from *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, "fully conscious and actively prepared" for the monumental, transformative action we seek to undertake. Not everyone is always properly prepared to do so, and the idea that "the purpose of going to Mass is to receive Communion" blurs the reality of both the purpose of the Mass and our readiness.

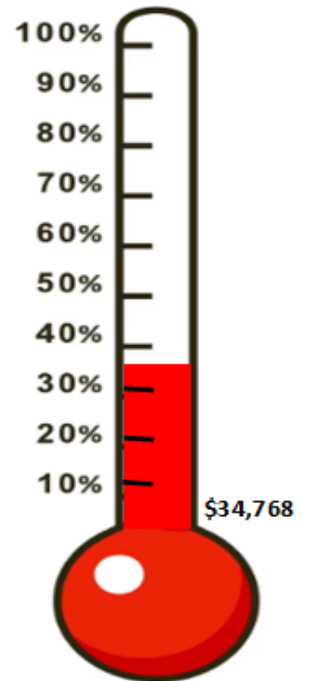
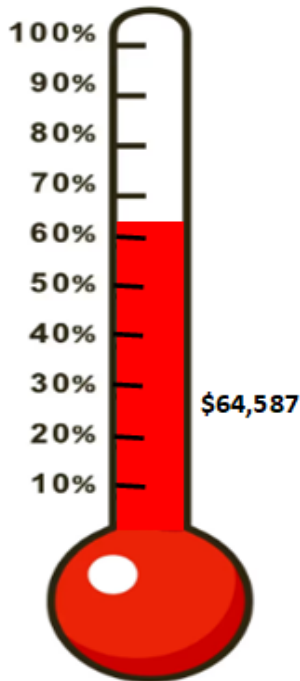

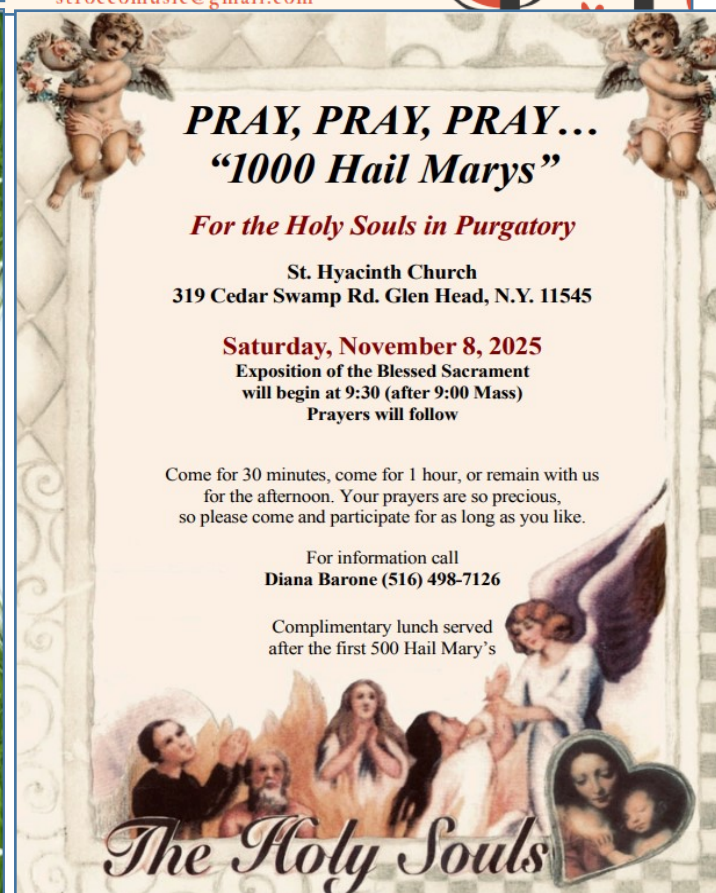

XXX Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario: Ser imagen de Dios

Eclesiástico 35, 15-17. 20-22

La imparcialidad de Dios de la que nos habla el Libro del Eclesiástico, lo obliga a optar radicalmente, aunque suene contradictorio, por la justicia de los oprimidos, explotados y excluidos de la sociedad. Es que la imparcialidad de Dios tiene un sentido muy profundo y exige que las relaciones humanas estén basadas en principios de igualdad, equidad, dignidad, justicia y reconocimiento de los deberes y derechos de los seres humanos. Pobres, oprimidos, viudas, enfermos y extranjeros saben que su clamor de justicia no se detiene en la oscuridad emanada por el poder despótico, totalitario de la injusticia humana, sino que atraviesa todo obstáculo y llega al corazón de Dios que no tolera ningún tipo de impunidad.

2 Timoteo 4, 6-8, 16-18

Señor, hoy como el publicano y el fariseo, me acerco a Ti a orar. Me acerco, porque sé que sin Ti nada puedo, como Tú mismo nos lo dijiste. Señor, yo llevo en mi interior un fariseo y un publicano. Tú conoces mi debilidad y cómo a veces, sin yo quererlo, caigo y te ofendo; otras, me esfuerzo por hacer tu Voluntad, pero cuántas veces en este interés por agradarte me busco a mí mismo. Señor, sin Ti nada puedo, y como me doy cuenta de ello, me acerco una vez más para presentarme como soy y dejar que Tú lleves las riendas de mi vida. Tú toma lo bueno que me has dado, para mayor gloria tuya, pero también hazte cargo de mi debilidad y utilízala también en favor tuyo; pues, como San Pablo decía, "cuando soy débil es cuando soy fuerte", porque Tú tienes un mayor protagonismo. Señor, yo sólo quiero ser tu instrumento.

Come el fariseo que agradecía a Dios no ser como los demás hombres porque no cometía sus mismos errores y pecados que ellos. Los dos hombres estaban en oración, pero qué oraciones tan distintas.
