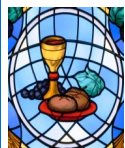

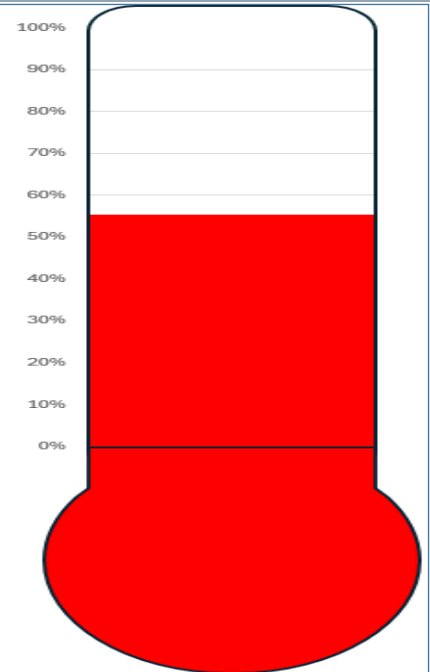

## IV Domingo de Adviento: Hay que estar atentos a las señales de Jesús

### Isaías 7, 10-14

Hay dos maneras de mirar esta lectura de Isaías. La primera se refiere a la situación histórica. Isaías trata sin éxito de convencer a Acaz de que todo va a salir bien y le promete al rey una señal. Para el Israel antiguo, una señal se consideraba prueba segura de la presencia de Dios. En términos modernos, nosotros pensamos sobre lo sobrenatural y natural, pero en el mundo de Israel se pensaba que cualquier

### Romanos 1, 1-7

Este texto es el inicio de la carta de Pablo a las y los cristianos de Roma. En él se nos habla de la vocación que Pablo recibió como apóstol y servidor del proyecto del pueblo del Dios liberador para realizar la misión de anunciar el Evangelio a los paganos. Ese anuncio permitirá el surgimiento de nuevas comunidades cristianas formadas por personas llamadas

a vivir según los valores del amor y la justicia propuestos en el evangelio de Jesús.

### Mateo 1, 18-24

El desposorio del tiempo del evangelio no es como nuestra idea de compromiso. 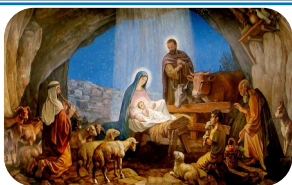
