FATHER DANIEL'S MUSINGS

Happy (belated) New Years! Both of them: the Church New Year, which began in Advent, and the Secular New Year! Sorry for the interruption in writing – after our return from Austria for the Chapter Meeting and the Feast of Saint Leopold (November 15), the time leading up to Thanksgiving together with the events of Advent, joyful as they are (with the complication of Bulletin deadlines that offered no leniency to or understanding of my tardiness in writing) crashed into us and the pace of life picked up. Only now, on the Feast Day of St Stephen, the Second Day of Christmas, is there time to dawdle over the keys and, hopefully, write something readable.

But before trying to pick up the thread of the liturgy which I dropped about six weeks ago (and, most likely, we won't, unfortunately, get to that today). I want to share, somewhat coherently if possible, a bit of what happened at the November Chapter Meeting at the Abbey, some of which some of you might already have heard. We – the Capitulars, that is, the solemnly professed members of the Chapter of Canons of Klosterneuburg: the Board of Directors, you might say – meet twice yearly to attend to the important business of the Abbey entrusted to our care. This involves voting on new members, the budget, elections, etc. Two important – and wonderful – things happened, both concerning our presence here in Glen Cove.

We started in Glen Cove, as you may remember, in June of 2011, preceded by rumors that “Monks from Australia are coming.” We are not monks, and aside from a superficial similarity of names, Austria and Australia are rather far removed from each other, much to the chagrin of Austrians. Anyway, we began, happily (at least for us!) at St Patrick and St Rocco. And, thanks to God's goodness and the kindness of everyone here, we have perdured. The original vote of the Chapter for this “American Project” covered a period of six years, which matches the six-year term of the pastor of a parish in the US. After six years, with everything going well, we continued, and then, again, after the twelfth year, we did likewise. It was clear to the Abbey that our mission in Glen Cove was “a going concern”, so we went forward. Still, to sanate, as it were, our status here, which had originally been tied to a six-year period, the Abbey asked the Bishop of Rockville Centre if he would like to invite us to stay on a permanent basis, which he graciously did. We then voted on this request, and positively! The status of our presence here is now officially on-going and open-ended, as permanent as anything in this life can be. For this we are inestimably grateful! This in no way changes our commitment to and engagement in our parishes; rather, this solidifies it.

As a sign of the Abbey's clear commitment to the permanent nature of our foundation here, as well as its future growth, we voted – at the same time as we voted on the permanent nature of our mission – to buy a home for the Canons here. Not that we're homeless! We have lived quite happily in the rectory of St Patrick, and this has been a blessing. But the time has come to establish something permanent, something which belongs to the Abbey and to the Community here; residing on the property of the Diocese differs fundamentally from having our own residence. For, while the care of our parishes is and always will be absolutely an essential – and cherished – part of the life of the Canons of Klosterneuburg in America, this does not exclude other activities, not strictly parochial.

We began, as soon as we got back from Austria, the search for a house – which the Canons would purchase – that would meet the needs of a (hopefully growing) religious community, and, we think we've found one, quite near the parishes. We are still in negotiations but are very hopeful that we have found a home for us and for the future. I ask for your prayers, and I promise to inform you all of the outcome, hopefully soon!

Christmas starts on the 24th of December in the Evening (the Holy Evening in some languages), enters – with the Christ Child – on the 25th, and continues, in the strictest counting, until the 6th of January, the (real) date of the Epiphany (even if it is in some places celebrated on a Sunday). And in a truly generous and Catholic world, the extended Christmas cycle continues not only through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord but up until the 2nd of February, the Feast of the Presentation. Thanks to Fr Elias' implacable affection for Christmas – and rightly so – we do **not** (and encourage you to follow suite) remove our Christmas decorations until that February date! The world, of course, in its rapacious “progress”, has already tired of its vague and offensive facsimile of Christmas, tossing out its pseudo-festive vesture in search of the next consumerist “holiday”. Don't give in! Resist! Christ shed the glory of Heaven to enlighten the world! Why not luxuriate in this time? Why rush back to the mundane? which are always absurd! Flee from rumors, flee from the passing on thereof and the listening thereunto! Rumors are sinful.

³ And how many of our confrères have enjoyed coming here to visit us, and you! At least 15!

The manner of voting in the Chapter, for the most serious things, like the admission of new members, etc., is old and venerable. We vote using black and white balls. Many have heard, of course, of being “blackballed”, meaning excluded from some organization or event. This comes from this ancient method of voting. A question is posed: should x be admitted to the Chapter? Each Canon is given both a black and a white ball, which he carried behind a screen, where two baskets, one white and one black, each covered by a lid with a hole in it. If he puts the white ball in the white basket and the black ball in the black basket, that is a “yes” vote; the white in the black, and the black in the white is a “no” vote. While a serious way of voting, there is, I have to admit, a certain giddiness in voting in this manner.

To forestall any absurd rumors, even if one might slightly understand their origin! The Canonry of Saint Leopold, supported by the Abbey, is going to purchase a house for the Canons; the parishes are in no way involved in this purchase.

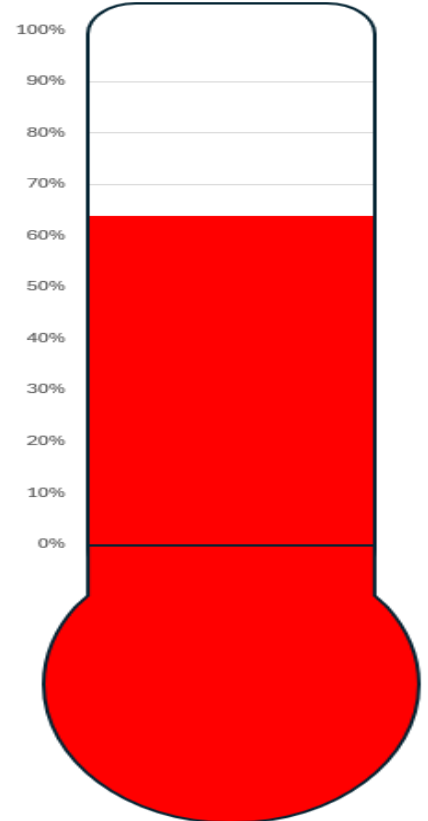

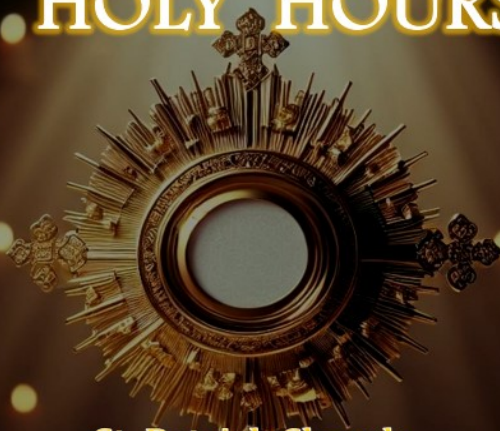

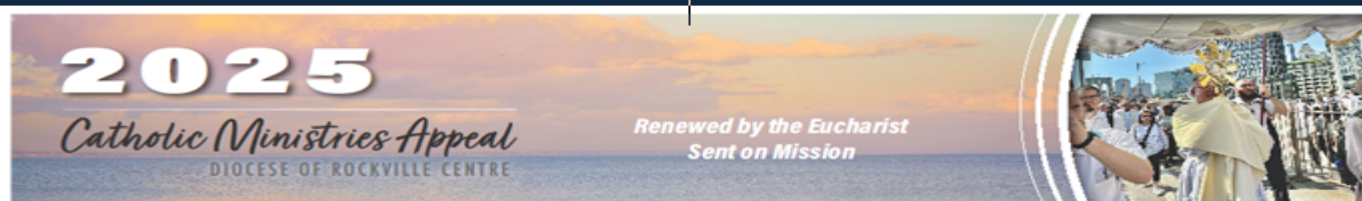
The Adult Choir sings for Christmas Midnight Mass, Holy Week, and special occasions.

Epifanía Del Señor

Isaías 60, 1-6

La gloria de Dios es en realidad el resplandor de la presencia de Dios y en estos capítulos de Isaías se dan una sucesión de imágenes que describen el esplendor y gozo de Jerusalén. La luz es símbolo de salvación y del amanecer de una nueva etapa de la historia. El versículo 5 evoca el tráfico comercial tan común en Canaán; de hecho, Canaán era camino obligado de todas las caravanas que se dirigían de norte a sur y de sur a norte. El profeta pone como destino final de todo ese tráfico a la nueva Jerusalén.



Efesios 3, 2-3A, 5-6

El énfasis de esta lectura de la carta a los Efesios es que todos son herederos de la promesa de salvación, tanto si son judíos como gentiles. Todos los hombres y mujeres de toda nación y raza llegarán a la ciudad santa para cantar las alabanzas del Señor.

Mateo 2, 1-12

Contemplar las estrellas ha sido siempre un pasatiempo muy popular en todas las culturas y religiones. Se trata de ver signos y anuncios de toda clase de eventos futuros en las estrellas. El descubrimiento de una nueva estrella se asocia al nacimiento de alguien importan-

te. Las estrellas son símbolo de deseos y objetivos a veces inalcanzables. También la cultura bíblica leyó en las estrellas el acontecimiento más importante al que tendía toda la historia de Israel: el nacimiento del Mesías, rey. La secta judía de Qumrán incluso había creado su horóscopo. La estrella es una referencia a la profecía mesiánica en el libro de Números donde se identificaba a una estrella con el Mesías.



Todos necesitamos una estrella que nos guíe: un consejo, una palabra de ánimo de los hermanos, meditar las escrituras, preguntar... Todos estamos en diferentes etapas del viaje: los viejos buscadores y los novatos, los que dudan, los que pecan, los que tienen un problema como Herodes, los que saben todo como los escribas, los que caminan rápido y los que caminan lentamente... Lo importante es alcanzar la meta y contemplar el rostro del Mesías. No permitamos que la riqueza, la fama, la comodidad o el orgullo no nos deje de ver a Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que en este mundo se nos presenta, como el más humilde, allí donde menos esperamos.

Vimos su estrella en el Oriente y venimos a adorarle



Jesús, vengo a este rato de meditación para contemplarte y adorarte, como aquellos magos de Oriente. Ayúdame a encontrarte, como ellos lo hicieron, en los brazos de María.

Meditación del Papa Francisco: Los Magos consiguieron superar aquel momento crítico de oscuridad en el palacio de Herodes, porque creyeron en las Escrituras, en la palabra de los profetas que señalaba Belén como el lugar donde había de nacer el Mesías. Así escaparon al letargo de la noche del mundo, reemprendieron su camino y de pronto vieron nuevamente la estrella, y el Evangelio dice que se llenaron de "inmensa alegría". Esa estrella que no se veía en la oscuridad de la mundanidad de aquel palacio. Un aspecto de la luz que nos guía en el camino de la fe es también la santa "astucia". Es también una virtud, la santa "astucia". Se trata de esa sagacidad espiritual que nos permite reconocer los peligros y evitarlos. Los Magos supieron usar esta luz de "astucia" cuando, de regreso a su tierra, decidieron no pasar por el palacio tenebroso de Herodes, sino marchar por otro camino. (S.S. Francisco, 6 de enero de 2014).

Reflexión: Hoy es uno de esos días en que todos quisiéramos de nuevo ser niños. ¡Qué alegría y qué ilusión al habernos ido a la cama pensando: "Esta noche pasarán por casa los Magos de Oriente y dejarán en ella muchos regalos para mí" El ejemplo de estos

"magos" (en la actualidad equivaldrían a una especie de astrónomos y no a aquellos que aparecen y desaparecen un conejo de su sombrero) es un ejemplo de fe y de sencillez. Su vida estaba resuelta. Eran felices. Tenían una familia maravillosa. ¿Para qué despeinarse? ¡Vaya ganas de complicarse la vida! Y sin embargo, ven la estrella y no tardan en seguirla. Tenían fe y supieron descubrir en el brillo de esa estrella diminuta, que a ratos se les escabullía, el paso de Dios por sus vidas. Y es que, hace falta tener los oídos interiores bien limpios para escuchar la voz de Dios. El rey Herodes, a través de estos magos, recibió también una invitación de Dios para sumarse a los que adorarían al Niño. Pero la basura del egoísmo y el ruido del poder acumulado en sus oídos, no le permitieron escuchar. Se quedó en su palacio y se ensució el alma con la muerte de tantos inocentes. La sencillez de los magos, se nos presenta unida a su fe, en el momento del encuentro con el Niño: Y de hinojos le adoraron, abriendo sus cofres, le ofrecieron como dones de oro, incienso y mirra... Unos hombres venían de oriente. Ellos habían visto una estrella diferente a las demás. Una estrella nacida hacía unos días, lo que equivaldría a un fenómeno extraordinario. Lo comentan con todos los habitantes de la ciudad en donde están. La ciudad se sobresalta por tal anuncio. ¿Qué harías si hoy te preguntaran si has visto la estrella que acaba de nacer? Al menos yo me sentiría confuso, dado que no soy un astrónomo, además las noches las ocupo en otras cosas que en estar mirando el cielo. Estos hombres los recordamos hoy. Hace más de dos mil años

que observaron el fenómeno de la estrella, y aún hoy se observa este milagro. Una estrella ha nacido, y nace en esta Navidad, y nacerá en las siguientes navidades. Esa Estrella la llamamos Jesús. Un Niñito nacido un lejano 24 de diciembre, y que sigue recibiendo la visita de unos magos cada año. Unos magos que eran de oriente y que hoy los niños del mundo quieren muchísimo. Esos magos le llevaron unos regalos al Niño Dios, pero no se dieron cuenta de que ellos fueron quienes recibieron el mayor regalo, el conocimiento de Dios a través de la Fe. Ojalá que en este día, escuchemos la voz del recién nacido. Y si no la percibimos, lavémonos los oídos, curemos nuestra sordera de alma y no nos quedemos solos y tristes como Herodes.

Diálogo con Cristo: La adoración de los magos me recuerda lo cerca que estás siempre, esperando que me dé el tiempo para contemplar y apreciar el infinito amor que me ofreces. Mi entorno social ofrece tantas falsas alegrías que necesito, como los magos, seguir tu estrella que muestra el camino, que aunque a veces parezca difícil, es el único donde podré encontrar la felicidad verdadera. Señor, ayúdame a salir a predicar tu mensaje de amor, dame la gracia de salir de mí para ejercer una labor de fermento dentro de mi familia y en el círculo de mis amigos, para comenzar a vivir un cristianismo militante, dinámico, lleno de celo, que nunca pierde de vista la estrella de tu amor.

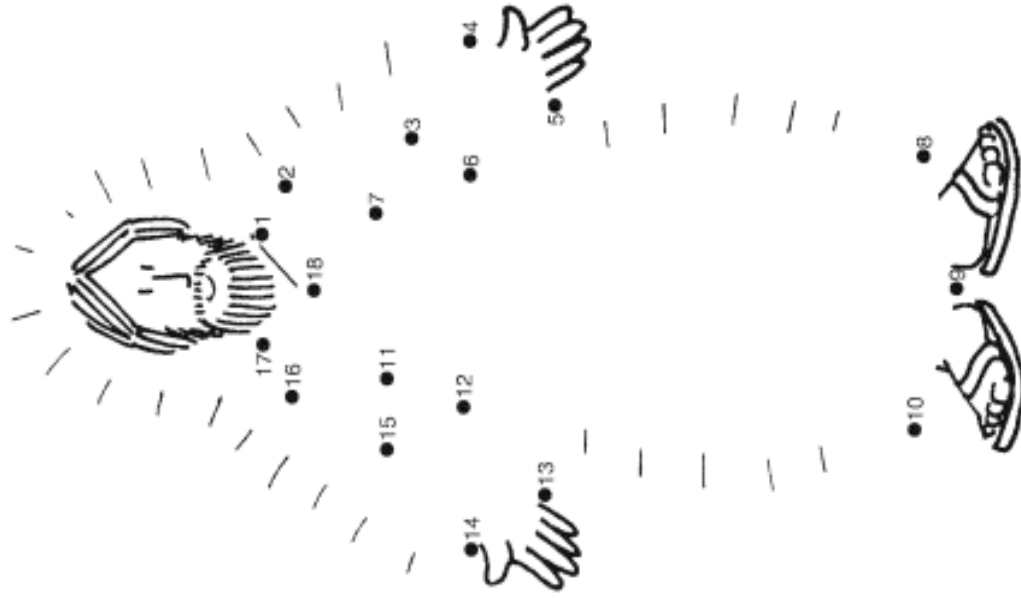

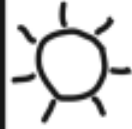

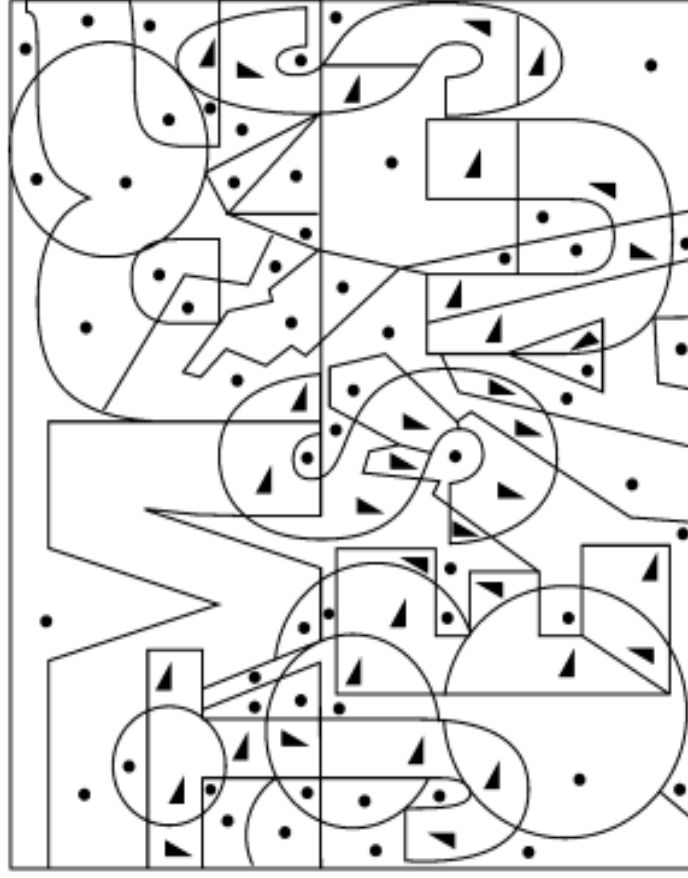
