Aim of Activity *

The activity identifies the funding for the eight Assistance with Care and Housing (ACH) providers which transitioned to the Care Finder program. Care Finders deliver specialist and intensive assistance to help people within the Care Finder Target Population to understand and access aged care and connect with other relevant supports in the community.

Description of Activity *

SEMPHN has a network of 11 care finders across the catchment. We have transitioned eight ACH providers to care finder providers and have three brand new care finders. Our eight transitioned ACH providers began care finder service delivery on 3 January 2023 and the new providers are in the ramp up stage and preparing for full-service delivery by 30 April 2023. All contracts end 30 June 2025.

SEMPHN has care finder coverage across the catchment and each of the care finder providers understand they can see consumers from outside of their specified LGA if they are the most appropriate care finder provider for that consumer. There is a “no wrong door” policy so as to minimise the impact on the target population.

In 2022, SEMPHN undertook an aged care needs assessment which told us that In our catchment, approximately 11,000 people are living with a diagnosis of dementia, with nearly a third of this group residing in the LGAs of Mornington Peninsula and Casey. Older residents in these LGAs are also more likely to live alone, have lower incomes and require physical assistance.

SEMPHN is commissioning via open tender a Dementia Rehabilitation program which aims to help maintain function and quality of life so that people are supported to live in the community for longer. The program is focused onto improving access to allied health-led rehabilitation activities such as physical activity, social support, and education. Each participant in the program will have personalised activities designed to support their independence and wellbeing.

The successful provider will use the ICHOM tool to evaluate the delivery of its program to customers. SEMPHN will monitor the provider's evaluation of the program.

An important role of this activity is the upskilling of aged care staff to engage in the use of telehealth and the understanding that telehealth consultations are not second-class medicine. They are valuable and offer residents in residential aged care the ability to have access to health care without having to leave their home.

Description of Activity *

SEMPHN is partnering with an IT Service Provider to offer to purchase and distribute virtual consultation technology solutions to 157 Residential Aged Care Facilities across the catchment. SEMPHN is engaging with the facilities to understand their digital maturity and telehealth capability before purchasing hardware.

The approach also incorporates providing digital health-related training and support to staff at RACFs and encouraging the use of My Health Record.

SEMPHN is collaborating with the Victorian Tasmanian PHN Alliance (VTPHNA) to develop high-quality, tailored training for families, residents, and clinical providers to ensure the people who care for residents have access to support and advice when they

need it. This training will be online and will cater to all the various audiences who will interact with the education modules.

SEMPHN is collaborating with the Digital Health Agency and the VTPHNA to deliver educational webinars to RACFS and GPs on My Health Record and other digital health platforms such as Healthdirect Videocall.

The aim of the activity is to establish and maintain a network of Care Finders to provide specialist and intensive assistance to help people within the Care Finder Target Population to understand and access aged care and connect with other relevant supports in the community.

Description of Activity *

In 2022, SEMPHN commissioned a care finder specific needs assessment. This assessment allowed us to understand the aged care service landscape in SEMPHN and target where our care finder services needed to be focused.

SEMPHN has a network of 11 care finders across the catchment. We have transitioned eight Assistance with Care and Housing (ACH) providers to care finder providers and three brand new care finders. Our eight transitioned ACH providers began care finder service delivery on 3 January 2023 and the new providers are in the ramp up stage and preparing for full-service delivery by 30 April 2023. All contracts end 30 June 2025.

SEMPHN has contracted the Housing Aged Action Group (HAAG) on behalf of Gippsland PHN until 30 June 2025 and will contract manage them. To encourage consistency where possible, the Victorian and Tasmanian PHNs have developed a shared set of KPIs for our care finder providers.

SEMPHN has care finder geographical coverage across the catchment and each of the care finder providers understand they can see consumers from outside their specified LGA if they are the most appropriate care finder provider for that consumer. There is a “no wrong door” policy so as to minimise the impact on the target population.

As care finder is a new program, there has been intensive one on one work with all our providers. SEMPHN has dedicated staff working alongside our care finder providers to ensure they have undertaken training, are prepared to use the reporting portal, and have developed promotional collateral in line with DOHAC guidance. Many of the care finder providers are already seeing clients, working on setting up referral pathways and conducting assertive outreach. SEMPHN is in touch daily with our providers offering support and assisting with linkages into other care finders and community organisations.

We have attended various meetings to promote and discuss the program within our region. Access and Support funding has been raised extensively, both from existing providers, RAS and ACAS services and care finder providers (some are also A&S providers). The key concerns are whether the A&S funding will continue and how these programs will work in conjunction with care finder program. SEMPHN manage these questions by encouraging concerns be raised with DOHAC and reiterate that the funding and programs are separate and PHNs are not responsible for the A&S Programs.

Integration learnings from COVID-19 have been incorporated into developing the Care Finder Program. During the COVID-19 vaccine rollout in 2021, SEMPHN made new connections and relationships with local aged care services and providers, disability and community health, advocacy and support groups and strengthened existing relationships with our three local public hospital networks. During that time we had open communication channels for each other and developed a working relationship that allowed for integration where possible. With the covid vaccination rollout moving to business as usual, SEMPHN is taking the opportunity to continue to work on collaborations with our health, community and aged care partners locally and across Victoria.

Seeing the benefits of these relationships for all, SEMPHN has continued to meet regularly with our health system partners. An example of integration has been working with the Health Service Partnership. This collaboration has brought together Residential In Reach teams, Ambulance Victoria, Victorian Virtual ED, Residential Aged Care, General Practice and the PHN. Together we have developed a communication tool for Residential Aged Care facilities to integrate key messages from each of the above providers and compile in one easy document.

We continue to work on integration of the care finder program into our local health and aged care system.

SEMPHN is collaborating with the Victorian Tasmania PHN Alliance to host state-wide Community of Practice (CoP) events for care finder providers. SEMPHN will also host a local care finder CoP events to ensure the local needs of the SEMPHN community are being met.

With the EnCOMPASS program is ending, SEMPHN is working with the Southern Migrant and Refugee Centre’s EnCOMPASS Connectors to plan warm handovers where possible for clients who continue to need care finder support.

To address any awareness or utilisation issues amongst Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACFs) of available local after hours services.

Description of Activity *

SEMPHN has developed a range of templates to create an 'After Hours service tool kit' in collaboration with the Victorian and Tasmanian PHNs. The template is based on knowledge collected through consultations with local RACFs and is designed to support processes in facilities to reduce emergency presentations, along with evidence based resources on how to best support RACFs to enhance accessibility and utilisation of after-hours services. The toolkit includes a template action plan RACFs can use to develop action plans for each resident.

The tools made available are intended to:

- Provide RACFs with templates that provide clear instructions and suggestions to facility staff on how to create their own after-hours action plans. Also why these plans are so important for residents.
- Educate RACF staff on After Hours health care options and processes for residents.
- Encourage RACFs to implement procedures for keeping residents' digital medical records up to date, particularly following an episode where OOH care was required.
- Support engagement between RACFs and resident's General Practitioner (and other relevant health professionals), as part of

after-hours action plans in development.

The After Hours resources and templates are intended to be dynamic documents, meaning RACFs and residents' plans should be revised and updated regularly by the facility to reflect their policies and procedures, available services, and changes in care. They will all be stored online and will be accessible to facilities day and night. The templates are all editable and easily printed, we understand that facilities all work differently so want to make sure our resources are ready to be used in different ways.

These resources will be available to all RACFs in Victoria and Tasmania.

SEMPHN will roll out this activity to our RACFS after they have received their telehealth hardware and training. We see use and trust of telehealth and video call as an important part of after-hours planning. Engagement with facilities and managers on the ground in each facility is crucial to the uptake of this capacity building work.

The aim of the activity is to establish and maintain a network of Care Finders to provide specialist and intensive assistance to help people within the Care Finder Target Population to understand and access aged care and connect with other relevant supports in the community.

Description of Activity *

SEMPHN has a network of 11 care finders across the catchment. We have transitioned eight Assistance with Care and Housing (ACH) providers to care finder providers and three brand new care finders. Our eight transitioned ACH providers began care finder service delivery on 3 January 2023 and the new providers are in the ramp up stage and preparing for full-service delivery by 30 April 2023. All contracts end 30 June 2025.

SEMPHN has contracted the Housing Aged Action Group (HAAG) on behalf of Gippsland PHN until 30 June 2025 and will contract manage them. To encourage consistency where possible, the Victorian and Tasmanian PHNs have developed a shared set of KPIs for our providers.

SEMPHN has care finder coverage across the catchment and each of the care finder providers understand they can see consumers from outside their specified LGA if they are the most appropriate care finder provider for that consumer. There is a “no wrong door” policy so as to minimise the impact on the target population.

Integration learnings from COVID-19 have been incorporated into developing the Care Finder Program.

SEMPHN continues to work with our General Practices, Community Health, and large acute health service providers to find other opportunities to enhance integration between the health, aged care and other systems at a local level.

MPHN is collaborating with the Victorian Tasmania PHN Alliance to host state-wide Community of Practice (CoP) events for care finder providers. SEMPHN will also host a local care finder CoP events to ensure the local needs of the SEMPHN community are being met.

As the EnCOMPASS program is ending, SEMPHN is working with the Southern Migrant and Refugee Centre's EnCOMPASS Connectors to plan warm handovers where possible for clients who continue to need care finder support
