The aim of the AOD ResetLife activity is to address the increase in demand of clients seeking AOD treatment in the LGAs of Port Phillip and Frankston by providing an evidence based outpatient rehabilitation treatment service for clients using methamphetamine, alcohol and other drugs. It will also support primary health professionals and specialists through education and training.

The Intensive Outpatient AOD Rehabilitation Treatment Service provides a more intensive and integrative intervention than is currently available in Victoria for people experiencing problematic alcohol and other drug use who require comprehensive care management. The model emphasises targeting participant's cognitive, behavioural, emotional and relationship issues, which may be contributing factors to substance dependence.

The program incorporates a holistic treatment approach which includes early recovery skills, relapse prevention, family education, harm minimisation, individual and family counselling, peer support, and post-rehabilitation continuing care support.

Description of Activity *

ResetLife is based on the Matrix Model, which is an evidence based, highly structured, integrated and time-limited intensive outpatient rehabilitation treatment approach incorporating elements of early intervention, treatment, and post-treatment support.

ResetLife consists of screening and assessment, harm minimisation through random mandatory drug testing, individual therapy sessions, conjoint family therapy sessions, and specific structured group counselling sessions including: early recovery skills;

relapse prevention; family education; and continuing care social support.

The aim of the AOD ResetLife Youth Program is to address the demand of young clients seeking non-residential AOD treatment across the SEMP HN catchment by providing an evidence based outpatient rehabilitation treatment service for clients using methamphetamine, alcohol and other drugs. The program structure is flexible allowing it to be adapted to young people who require early intervention, are experimenting with alcohol or other drugs, or who have developed a mild, moderate, or severe substance use disorder.

It will also support primary health professionals and specialists through education and training.

The Intensive Outpatient AOD Rehabilitation Youth Treatment Service provides a more intensive and integrative intervention than is currently available in Victoria for people experiencing problematic alcohol and other drug use who require comprehensive care management. The model emphasises targeting participant's cognitive, behavioural, emotional, social and relationship issues, which may be contributing factors to substance dependence.

ResetLife for Youth incorporates a holistic treatment approach which includes early recovery skills, relapse prevention, family/parent education, harm minimisation, individual and family counselling, peer support, and post-rehabilitation continuing care support.

Description of Activity *

ResetLife for Youth is based on the Matrix Model for Teens and Young Adults, which is an evidence based, highly structured, integrated and time-limited intensive outpatient rehabilitation treatment approach incorporating elements of early intervention.

treatment, and post-treatment support.

ResetLife for Youth consists of screening and assessment, harm minimisation through random mandatory drug testing, individual therapy sessions, conjoint family therapy sessions, and specific structured group counselling sessions including: early recovery skills; relapse prevention; family/parent substance use education; youth substance use education, and continuing care social support.

The program is currently delivered in the Glen Eira LGA. Based on the SEMPHN Needs Assessment 2022/23 – 2024/25, Frankston and Casey LGAs have been identified for possible extension of the Youth ResetLife program. Selection of the LGA is currently underway. Commissioning will commence in March 2023.

The aim of the Bounceback AOD program is to enhance capacity of youth mental health to provide integrated care to young people aged 15-25 with co-morbid mental health conditions and problematic substance use through collaboration and co-location of service elements. This will improve and streamline access to AOD treatment and enhance wraparound services and care coordination for young people while enhancing workforce capacity to respond to people with AOD issues.

Description of Activity *

This activity will embed an AOD clinician and AOD peer worker into the existing Bounceback program at EACH Case/Cardinia to provide early intervention and targeted treatment to young people experiencing co-morbid mental health conditions and problematic substance use.

Description of Activity *

During recent years the SEMPHN catchment has experienced greater than usual MATOD workforce challenges that have impacted MATOD prescriber capacity. MATOD prescribers are an ageing workforce, many of whom are approaching retirement and several who are high volume prescribers. Some retired during the pandemic, and others are considering early retirement. These same factors have generated greater than usual reluctance from non-MATOD GPs to take on new programs, resulting in reduced recruitment of new GPs to the MATOD treatment space.

Additionally, a number of prescribers in the catchment have had their practice limited by AHPRA restrictions or have ceased delivering MATOD services altogether. Some larger MATOD practices have reported difficulties with recruiting new prescribers and some solo MATOD prescribers have taken on a very high number of new patients as they transitioned from other prescribers. In addition, the largest MATOD prescribing general practice in the SEMPHN region, based in Frankston, which serviced the LGAs of Frankston and Mornington Peninsula, is scheduled to cease operations in June 2023, impacting around 4000 drug and alcohol

patients, including 1600 patients on MATOD. The above circumstances expose the MATOD service system to extreme risk and vulnerability.

Nurse Practitioner MATOD prescribing models have been successfully piloted in the LGAs of Kingston and First Step in Port Phillip, contracted by SEMPHN, and have been found to be an effective approach to increasing access to MATOD services.

This activity will:

- Continue the Nurse Practitioner MATOD model in the existing sites in Kingston and Port Phillip.
- Commission a new provider(s) based in either in the LGA of Frankston or Mornington Peninsula to implement a Nurse Practitioner model for patients across the SEMPHN region.
- Commission other prescribers, as required, in other locations within the SEMPHN-region that may better address the access of patients to MATOD services based on identified needs within the region.
