AOD Liaison Outreach Workers (ADLOW) provide the following supports and interventions to people experiencing addiction:

- outreach for comorbid clients, youth, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) and LGBTIQ+ communities
- short to medium term bridging support
- brief interventions prior to gaining access to mainstream/primary health services
- motivational interviewing treatment techniques to enhance treatment readiness

- provide a single-entry point, operating a ‘no wrong door’ approach for people seeking mental health support and guidance.

An integrated approach is utilised by working closely with Emergency Departments to identify individuals with AOD concerns that can be assisted with AOD treatment via discharge plans and referrals.

Provide an Intensive Outpatient Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) treatment for people experiencing problematic use of AOD. Support primary health professionals and specialists through education and training.

Description of Activity *

The ResetLife Intensive Outpatient AOD Rehabilitation Treatment (ResetLife) is based on the Matrix Model, which is an evidence based, highly structured, integrated and time-limited intensive outpatient rehabilitation. The treatment approach incorporates elements of early intervention, treatment and post-treatment support. The activity is the only abstinence based program that includes more intensive and integrative intervention that is available in Victoria.

ResetLife provides interventions that are more intensive and integrated than previously available in Victoria for people experiencing problematic use of alcohol and other drugs requiring comprehensive care management. The model emphasises comprehensive care management by targeting participant's cognitive, behavioural, emotional and relationship issues which may be contributing factors to substance dependence.

The program is consumer focused, incorporating a holistic treatment approach with the aim of achieving:

- early recovery skills and relapse prevention
- family education

- harm minimisation
- ongoing screening and assessment
- capacity building and workforce support.

SEMPHN has commissioned ResetLife supports in the Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Port Phillip, Frankston and Casey and providers services across the SEMPHN region.

Support Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, families and communities receiving AOD treatment. The Activity also builds capacity to appropriately identify and treat people living with a mental health condition or experiencing problematic use of AOD.

Description of Activity *

AOD Services for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People Activity aims to:

- address the increased demand for access to drug and alcohol treatment through needs based targeted planning in response to the changing needs of the community
- deliver culturally appropriate drug and alcohol treatment services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are linked to broader Indigenous Health Services
- increase capacity to respond to the needs
- improve outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people experiencing problematic use of AOD.

This will be achieved through client engagement and commitment to residential rehabilitation treatment and building capacity to appropriately identify and treat coinciding mental illness and substance misuse through various methods together with:

- Counselling for adult people referred to residential rehabilitation centres
- Brief intervention for adult people referred to residential rehabilitation centres

- Coordination and case management
- Liaison with AOD mental health mainstream services
- Cultural capacity building training and professional development
- Community development activities to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community

SEMPHN was exploring expanding this AOD activity to include a mental health component that would support the enhancement and improved integration of services for adults experiencing mental health and substance abuse challenges. As of 2025, this initiative is on hold due to insufficient funding and will be reviewed as part of future contract renewal processes.

Support people living with co-occurring substance use disorders and serious mental health conditions to access combined treatment from the same practitioner or treatment team.

Description of Activity *

Integrated Care Program services are delivered by a multi-disciplinary team including dual diagnosis clinicians, addiction medicine specialist and lived experience peer worker through care coordination, client driven goal setting and therapeutic/psychosocial interventions over an extended period.

Clients are provided with ongoing peer-focused support, community engagement and support and transition planning outside of the counselling process.

Other key components of service delivery include:

- integrated mental health/alcohol and other drugs treatment planning
- secondary consultation with other care teams
- therapeutic interventions
- care coordination
- group-based peer support (as required)

- social prescription and community-based service navigation
- family counselling and support
- addiction medicine and other specialist consultations.

This enables consumers to receive a consistent message about treatment and recovery and facilitates referral pathways to clinical and non-clinical services. .

SEMPHN was exploring expanding this AOD activity to include a mental health component that would support the enhancement and improved integration of services for adults experiencing mental health and substance abuse challenges. As of 2025, this initiative is not proceeding due to insufficient funding.

Activity Consultation and Collaboration

Consultation

Stakeholders have been consulted via forums that included key AOD treatment service providers, Local Hospital Networks (LHNs), Department of Health and Aged Care (DOHAC) and Department of Health, Victoria representatives.

Ongoing regular meetings continued with AOD treatment services and DOH. Ongoing partnerships continued to ensure models of care and identified priorities are coordinated and informed by the sector.

The consultation process continued into 2022 and prioritised the involvement of people with a lived experience of AOD in the co-design process.

Collaboration

A coordinated approach between SEMPHN and the AOD providers delivered a co-design consultation in 2022. This included AOD Specialist Treatment Services, LHNs, Area 4 Pharmacotherapy, Victorian Alcohol and Drug Association (VAADA) and local government to promote a coordinated approach in delivering services, the identification of gaps and duplication of services.

SEMPHN will continue to work with identified AOD services as well as coordinate efforts with Commonwealth and State Departments.
