

JMSG–NCRPA 2025 Competitive Season Summary

The JMSG–NCRPA Junior Highpower Rifle Team wrapped up another memorable competitive season—one defined by grit, growth, and the unmistakable sound of teenagers discovering that yes, they can beat adults at their own sport.

This season also marked a major shift across the sport: the full transition to electronic targets for all events, including every stage of the Camp Perry National Matches. For our team, it was the first year experiencing all national matches on e-targets, and the change brought a fresh, modern rhythm to competition. The instant feedback not only helped athletes stay focused and adapt quickly, but also created a much more exciting and accessible environment for spectators following every shot in real time.

Despite facing challenges in recruitment and operating with a smaller roster this year, our athletes demonstrated remarkable resilience. Each shooter contributed to a team atmosphere filled with dedication, sportsmanship, and steady improvement match after match. Here are our results from our “Super Bowl” of the season.....
President’s 100 Match

The President’s 100 is one of the most (mentally) demanding and prestigious matches in this sport, and our juniors held their own in a field of 129 Junior competitors!

Kalee Thomas led the team with a #27 finish (279-6x), followed closely by

Hunter Blankenship at #36 (274-5x), Alex McCaskill at #44 (272-6x), and Aiden Schroeder at #82 (254-4x).

Our junior coaches/adult team members also represented well:

Andrews placed #120 (286-12x), Smith #326 (278-4x), and Cole #368 (276-3x).

These finishes are especially impressive given this year’s P100 cutoff of 287-6x! This year’s President’s 100 match also delivered one of the most memorable moments of the event: a dramatic tie for the final qualifying position between two competitors (outside our team), which led to a sudden-death shoot-off.

In true highpower fashion, the tie was settled in a tense, shot-by-shot duel that had the entire firing line holding its breath. It was a thrilling reminder of the intensity and precision that define this match!

National Trophy Individual (NTI) Match

The NTI is known for pushing shooters to their limits, and our juniors rose to the occasion once again.

In a field of 129 Junior Competitors:

Blankenship led with a strong #36 finish (470-8x)
McCaskill placed #52 (459-9x)

Thomas K followed closely at #55 (458-9x)
Schroeder rounded out the group at #82 (454-7x)

Among 818 adult competitors: Smith (467-12x) and Cole (441-5x) put in solid performances as well.

This year’s team match also highlighted the camaraderie and cooperation that make the highpower community so special. With our small roster, two of our 2-man teams were completed thanks to the generosity and sportsmanship of neighboring programs — one junior shooter from Alabama joined our lineup, and another junior, traveling with an adult competitor from Puerto Rico, stepped in to support a second team.

Their willingness to jump in and compete alongside our athletes made these results possible and added a meaningful spirit of teamwork that extended far beyond our own club.
Leadership & Team Growth

One of the brightest highlights of the season came not from scores, but from leadership. Aiden Schroeder emerged as a natural mentor- consistently checking in on teammates, offering guidance, and uplifting others during tough stages. His steady presence helped shape the supportive team environment we are proud of this year.
Looking Ahead

While our roster may have been small, the spirit of the JMSG–NCRPA team was anything but. Our athletes proved that determination, teamwork, and a positive attitude can carry a program far—both on the range and beyond. As we look ahead to (promising) recruitment efforts and continued development, this season stands as a testament to what a committed group of young shooters can achieve.

To our board members, club supporters, volunteers, and families: thank you for your unwavering support. Your encouragement makes these successes possible, and we look forward to building on this momentum in the coming year.

OCTOBER 2025 WOMEN ON TARGET INSTRUCTIONAL SHOOTING CLINICS at DURHAM COUNTY WILDLIFE CLUB and SIR WALTER GUN CLUB

DCWC's WOT ISC, held October 4th, and SWGC's event, held October 19th, were both, once again very successful, with lots of smiles on the faces of participants and volunteers alike. Beautiful weather for both events! SWGC started WOT in 2008 and DCWC in 2010 and the weather has cooperated for the vast majority of these events, thankfully!

The volunteers assemble early to get their venues prepared for the first session at 9am, which follows a light breakfast and a safety briefing. The five squads of 12 ladies are guided to each of five sessions by their Squad Leaders, gentlemen members of the club who also act as another set of RSO eyes at each session, act as timekeepers to keep the event running on time, and answer participants' questions about the club and about the shooting sports.

The five sessions at DCWC are Pistol Paper (.22), Rifle Silhouette (.22), Archery, Trap and Skeet. At SWGC, the participants learn Pistol Paper (.22), Pistol Plinking (.38 and 9mm), High Power (.223), Smallbore Rifle (.22), and Skeet. Lunch is provided between sessions 3 and 4. After session 5, the Squad Leaders conduct a graduation ceremony for our newest sets of "WOT Alumnae", each lady receiving a certificate and a goodie bag. NRA's Women On Target program provides for eyes and ears, certificates and goodie bags, for each participant. The ammunition comes from a grant from The NRA Foundation, for which we are truly grateful, or we would have to charge probably three times the current \$40 registration fee if each club had to purchase this ammunition!

If our WOT Alumnae wish to return to WOT, they are charged with bringing two to three new ladies with them! They are also invited to learn more about their favorite discipline and become WOT instructors themselves. Many of our WOT volunteers were once WOT participants. We also welcome youth as instructors! At SWGC, the Club's youth High Power and Smallbore program participants are valued instructors!

On July 12 fifteen dedicated high power rifle competitors came together to compete in the NCRPA Shooting Sports Games. The match was held at the N.C. National Guard Training Facility, located in Butner N.C. Except for the near 100 degree heat it was a good day to shoot with light winds and clear skies.

The match was won by Daniel Fergus firing a 783-23x winning the gold medal. Second place and the silver medal was won by our own Savanna Andrews firing a 776-21x. Third place and the silver medal went former NCRPA-JMSG Junior and 82nd Airborne Trooper William Silos firing a 770-28x. Colby Smith fired a 764-20x for first expert honors and a gold medal. First junior honors and a gold medal went to NCRPA-JMSG Jr. competitor Aiden Schroeder firing a 757-17x.

Thanks to all the competitors who braved the heat to come out and participate. It was a great competition with some good scores posted. We look forward to doing it again next year.

2025 HIGH POWER RIFLE STATE CHAMPIONS

In 2025 the North State Shooting club put on the three NRA High Power Rifle State Champion Ship Matches . The matches were held at the N.C. National Guard Training Facility Located in Butler N.C. The NCRPA would like to thank the North State Shooting Club for doing a superb job of putting on and running the competition this year and the past several years. We would like to also thank the N.C. Guard for providing a first class range facility for the match. Range #4 at Butner is one of the finest in the country.

The Mid-Range State Championship Match (600yd) was held on June 28& 29. John Skowron won the conventional category firing a 1192-55x. David Buckley of Wax Haw N.C. won top honors with the Palma Rifle firing a 1199-73x. Number one in the F-Open went to Greg Chapa firing an 1195-68x. Jerry Brendle fired an 1193-68x to win top honors in F-TR. In the AR Tactical category John Ayala from Apex N.C. fired a 1179-!4x for the win. Top Female honors went to Savanna Andrews with a score of 1163-44x. The total possible points possible in the match was 1200-120x.

The Across The Course State Championship Match was held on September 20 & 21. The distances were 200, 300 and 600 Yards. There were 800 possible points and 80 possible x's available. The winner of the Match Rifle Category was Chris Blankenship of Jacksonville N.C. firing a 793-42x. The top Service Rifle Shooter was Haley Robinson of Mill Springs N.C. firing a 783 -38x.

The 1000 Yd. State Championships were held on October 18 and 19. It consisted of five 20 shot matches with 1000 points and 100x's available. The top conventional (in this case a palma rifle) was Mike Halsey from Greensboro N.C. firing a 984-21x. The F-Open State Champion is Jerry Brendle of Oak Ridge N.C. firing a 992-44x. Finally the F-TR State Champion is Tom Johanson of Newton N.C. firing a 967-21x.

Each match showed some of the finest shooting you will find anywhere in the country. Congratulations to the winners and condolences to the folks who didn't do quite as well. God willing and if the creek din't rise we will do it again next year.




