

## Pastor's Column: From a Minister to the Ministers

As I consider this "August/September" edition of our newsletter, the two months designated for the content of this newsletter–August and September–bring to my mind the transition of seasons.

August always marks the end of summer for me. I'm sure that goes back to childhood when, in my day (the old days), the school year began after Labor Day; Labor Day was (still is) the first Monday of September, and school started the next day. And that meant Summer basically ended with the flipping of the calendar page from August to September. And even if Fall technically only appeared on the



calendar three weeks into the month, September still meant Autumn/Fall was upon us. Swimming gear, shorts, and suntan lotion were put away and, whether it really felt appropriate for them or not outside, sweaters, flannels, and blue jeans were resurrected from drawers and closets and readied for service.

Also, the August/September transition always seems to be one that is here too soon. We can't believe it: it seems like only a couple weeks ago we were opening up the pool for Memorial Day; now here we are getting ourselves ready for fairs, pumpkins, and leaf raking. Even with this year's heat waves (I'm typing this as July comes to a close; I'm assuming August will have a few more "Impact Days," per WGAL), the summer still seems to have whizzed on by.

Seasons come and seasons go, that's why they're called seasons, I guess. Be it summer transitioning to fall, or the move from football season to basketball season, or the coming of hunting season, or waiting for another strawberry season to come, we go through lots of seasons in this life of ours. And it's easy to be preparing for, planning for, anticipating the next season even before it arrives. Again, in this August to September season we close down and shut off much of our summer interests, even as we know September can be as summery as June, July or August. But the calendar motivates the mind to change the thinking from vacationing to schooling, from hot to cooler, from summer greenery to autumn oranges, reds, and browns.

A famous, beloved passage of Scripture reminds us: For everything there is a season, and a time for

every matter under heaven. The Byrds sang it this way: To everything turn, turn, turn; there is a season, turn, turn, turn. Ecclesiastes 3 goes on to talk about there being a time/season for birth, death, planting, harvesting, weeping, laughing, talking, muting, keeping, throwing away—and so on.

I like to consider that passage as stating a very wise point: though it be a season of some sort or another we are experiencing, it is a season of something nonetheless, so appreciate it, value it, take it in, experience it. It is a season—that means it, indeed, will come and go, transitioning into another, new season. Don't put the summer stuff away until summer is past; appreciate, value, take in, experience the summer for all it's worth. Don't let the birth pass into growth so quickly. Enjoy the newborn. Don't rush through the grief so fast; there is much to be valued in the weeping, don't laugh it off.

August has much going on—appreciate it, value it, take it in, experience it. It's a season. September will come; and when it does, appreciate it, value it, take it in, experience it.

Whatever your season right now, it is all, as the Ecclesiastes writer phrases it, under heaven—in other words, under God's hand, God's care, God's blessing.
