Dear Friends,

From time to time God offers us a particular opportunity to pause and turn to Him for understanding, wisdom and grace. We are living in one such time. The mission of the church – to make Jesus present in the world for our life and salvation – has not changed. How God is leading us to go about that is changing. The older parish models we are attached to are no longer viable. Even though we may love the old wine, it is time for new wine, and new wineskins. And faith dares us to believe, that in time, the new wine will be good!

"No one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the new wine will burst the skins, and it will be spilled, and the skins will be ruined. Rather, new wine must be poured into fresh wineskins. [And] no one who has been drinking old wine desires new, for he says, 'The old is good." Luke 5:37-39

We need not be afraid, but we do need to be informed and open to where the Holy Spirit is leading us. There are too few priests to serve the number of parishes we have. Across the diocese we have more buildings than we need or can afford. Some parishes, ours included, have wonderful and vibrant ministries that do make Jesus Christ present, but often struggle to fund them. Here at Christ the King our financial situation is concerning. We have our work cut out for us! The old wineskin can no longer hold the wine.

"Do you understand all these things?" They answered, "Yes." And he replied, "Then every scribe who has been instructed in the kingdom of heaven is like the head of a household who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old." Matthew 13:51-52 In the upcoming months, each parish in the whole diocese will be engaging in the "Re-Made for Mission" process. Together we are called to be like the scribe, who as the head of the household, will bring **both the old and the new** as we build the Kingdom of Heaven. That is our universal mission. There are many wonderful parish and diocesan resources to meet those needs. The ultimate goal is to further the mission of the Church. This will be hard and noble work that goes well beyond "save my church building". It must be selfless and holy work that says "these are our gifts to be used for the universal mission of the Church".

Let us make the Collect for the Mass for Holy Church our prayer this year. In Service of the Gospel,

O God, who in your wonderful providence decreed that Christ's kingdom should be extended throughout the earth and that all should become partakers of his saving redemption, grant, we pray, that your Church may be the universal sacrament of salvation and that Christ may be revealed to all as the hope of the nations and their Savior. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Our parish website underwent a major overhaul and the parish is now active on Instagram, reaching out to younger age groups in our universal church.



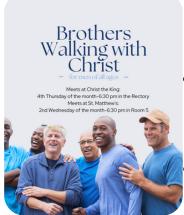
HOLY THURSDAY PILGRIMAGE SITE

PASTORAL COUNCIL

Throughout 2024 and 2025, the Pastoral Council remained dedicated to fostering a spiritually enriched community. We continued to highlight the contributions of our church ministries and community organizations in the parish bulletin and weekly emails.

A warm welcome was extended to all new parishioners who joined our church family this year. Through our outreach, social gatherings and ongoing communications we helped to integrate them into the life of the parish, ensuring they felt at home and supported in their faith journey.

In alignment with our diocesan mission, the Pastoral Council actively supported the Diocesan Appeal. Through our collective effort, we encouraged parishioners to contribute, helping to sustain essential ministries and programs that serve the broader Catholic community.

Throughout the past year, the Pastoral Council actively considered and participated in meetings involving the Synod called by Pope Francis. The implementation phase of the Synod was initiated by Pope Francis on March 11 of 2024. We expect that the changes in the Church contemplated by the Synodal Process will continue throughout the coming year and beyond.

The Pastoral Council has discussed and considered the implementation of a new Faith Formation model at our parish which places the whole family at the heart of growing in faith! Family Faith Formation will begin at Christ the King Church this Fall.

In addition, this past Spring, the Pastoral Council was introduced to the Church's "Re-Made for Mission" initiative. We recently participated in an on-line meeting regarding Phase 1 of the "Re-Made for Mission" program and expect to be actively engaged in this endeavor as it develops.

FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY

This year we welcomed Marge Stockwell and Rebecca Hanson on the CTK staff!

CTK Adult Faith Formation offered an array of gatherings in the "Coffee and Conversation" series which included: completion of "Genesis to Jesus" Bible study; a musical presentation on the Psalms; a discussion of Tradition -v- tradition; and presentations by Fr. Dan Quinn on his journey along the Camino de Santiago and a local physician on Evangelization in Action. A Parish Mission "Wrestling with God" was offered over three evenings in October 2024 by Redemptorist priest "Fr. Red" and was widely attended.

"Keepers of the Kingdom" Vacation Bible School was attended by 29 children ranging from grade levels Prekindergarten through 5th grade. Ten Middle School and High School aged youth led campers through the activities each day, including Bible stories, outdoor games, craft and music, and were guided by the help of eight adults. The children really enjoyed it and were engaged in their faith.

Service activities included: creating Christmas and Valentine cards for distribution through the Visitation Ministry (coordinated by Family Life Ministry); a "Chores for the Poor" collection (monetary) by elementary school aged children to augment a collection of non-perishable food by Middle School youth for assembly of Thanksgiving meal boxes for several families in need; and the donation of hams and non-perishable food for donation to the St. John/St. Ann's Outreach Center for Christmas dinners.

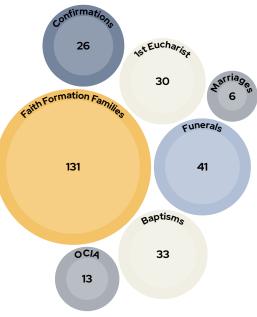
Middle School and High School Faith Formation was enhanced by several activities. Activities facilitated by the Family Life Ministry included Adoration and S'mores, learning about the origin and tradition of the Advent wreath while assembling their own for use at home, and the history and importance of the Divine Mercy message and devotion followed by Adoration. In addition, a teaching Mass was celebrated by the pastor to provide catechesis on the prayers, rites and other elements of the Mass and smiles were seen throughout the church.

Children and youth of all grade levels served in various liturgical roles during regular Masses from November through April. Roles included greeters, lectors, procession leaders, and gift bearers, in addition to ongoing participation by many youth as altar servers and members of the Youth Choir. Meanwhile, Children's Liturgy of the Word was resumed in November 2024 after a hiatus of several years. It is offered once a month and is attended by as many as 15 children each time.

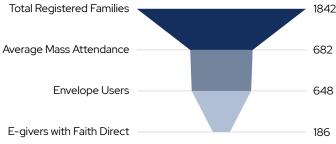
This year we launched our new website, an Instagram Profile (@ctkalbany) and began a Photography Ministry.

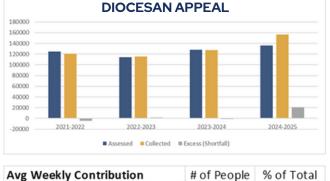

FINANCIAL REPORT JULY 1, 2024-JUNE 30, 2025

As part of the Re-Made for Mission initiative, the Diocesan Finance Office is evaluating the fiscal position of each parish in the diocese, identifying each as Favorable, Stable, Concerning, Critical, or Dire condition. Christ the King has a "Critical" score. How did we get here? Large, delayed maintenance projects (roofs, HVAC, parking lots) were paid for out of savings. Our collections have not increased with expenses and inflation, widening the gap between our income and our expenses. The parish has covered several years of losses at the Early Childhood Center. The Early Childhood Center now has a balanced budget and going forward we can continue to offer childcare in the community. Our Balance Sheet includes significant old, disputed debts owed to the diocese from years ago. Bottom line: We have wonderful ministries here, but we will not be able to sustain them unless our revenue increases. Please review all the data and prayerfully consider your contributions. We have work to do.

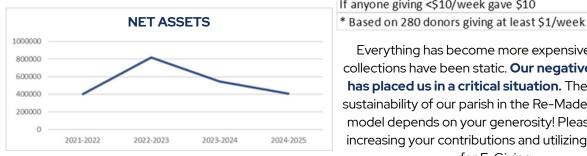
