


Newsletter - Winter 2022

Plans for the coming year include the building of a new farm bridge on the Geddes farm, expansion of the water system on Tarawera, and a new staff break room on Tarawera.

The Trust is pleased to announce Wiremu Cottrell as the latest Assistant Trustee.


Wiremu currently works for Alliance and was previously an Agribusiness Manager with BNZ.

TRANCHE 2 WATER APPLICATION UPDATE

The Trust's consent application for Tranche 2 water under Plan Change 6, Ruataniwha Basin will be heard late August 2022.

Objective is, secure reliable groundwater for Gwavas Station, while protecting the environment and neighbouring water users.

Tarawera and Gwavas Stations operate an integrated farm system, relying heavily on Gwavas finishing Tarawera bred livestock.

Tranche 2 water will mean certainty in achieving this, but it will take 2 to 3 years to install the necessary infrastructure, after consent.
