Dog Project Record Book Requirements

1. Project Record Books are due to either the Fair Office or 4-H Office by July 1st
2. Vaccine records can be submitted to the Superintendent between June 1st 2026 to July 1st 2026 to futurevet@comcast.net

(Rabies vaccine must be administered by a licensed vet per Michigan Law. Core vaccines (required) are canine parvovirus, distemper, canine hepatitis, and rabies. Highly recommended are Bordetella and canine influenza. Your veterinarian may recommend others. Vaccination protocol is as follows: Puppy shots completed with a booster one year later, and then an update every three years regardless of who gives the vaccinations. Proof of compliance is to provide a copy of veterinarian records that clearly shows both rabies and core vaccination with a due date for next vaccination following the show, a titer test by a veterinarian showing acceptable levels of immunity both current through JULY 31st of current year, or a combination of a rabies certificate from a veterinarian showing due date after the show AND owner's vaccination records that includes the label from the vaccine vial along with the date administered. This vaccine will only be deemed valid for one year from the time the vaccines are given. Starting June 1st, paperwork may be submitted via email to the superintendent. NO SHOTS, NO SHOWING at the fair. Dogs who have a physical handicap need a statement of fitness from their veterinarian.)

3. Completing the Dog Project Record Book to the best of your ability leaving no blank answers and placing it in a 1" white binder with cover page in the clear plastic sleeve on the front of the binder is required to compete in the dog show on 7/18/26
4. Attach a Fair Exhibitor Tag that is completely filled out and attach it to the front of your binder
5. There are two resources needed to help with the project record book: **Ohio State University Extension- Dog Resource Handbook**. There are copies available at the MSUE 4-H Extension Office available to borrow. Secondly; <https://www.akc.org>
6. Follow the **(SCC 4-H Dog Project)** Facebook page for updates, news, and events
7. Exhibitors have to complete the requirements for your age group, but can complete more if you would like. It's not discouraged if the exhibitor would like to decorate the record book.

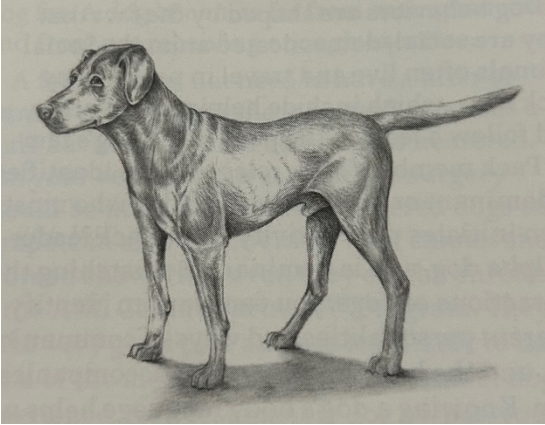

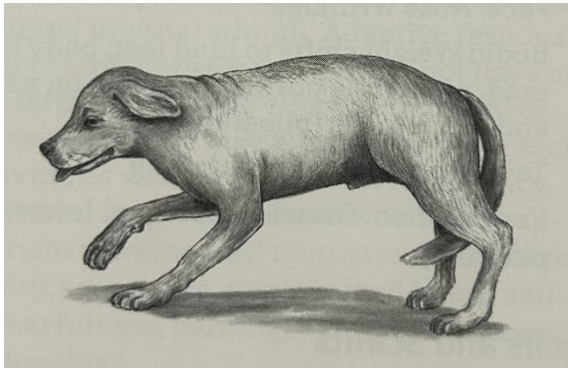
