Project Requirements:

1. Exhibitors must be present during judging.
2. There is no limit on the number of entries, except market classes and barnyard classics. Market birds are one entry per species. Limits may be placed based on cage availability.
3. Exhibitors must have feed and water containers that are un-spillable and hang on the cage. It is highly recommended that exhibitors use ½ gal. plastic feed & water cups for turkeys, geese, market chicken pens and large breed ducks; 1 qt. or larger plastic feed & water cut for egg production and 1 pt. for bantam chicken and bantam ducks. See pictures below. Feeders and waters not allowed: Fountain waters of any kind, cut plastic cups, paper ice cream container, any container that cannot be made un-spillable and to hang from the cage. 4. Birds must be fed and watered at least twice per day. Cages must also be cleaned daily no later than 10 a.m.
5. Birds must be bathed prior to coop in day. Birds found dirty or infested with parasites will not be allowed to enter.
6. Egg Production: An entry consists of a dozen eggs. Eggs should be brought to the Poultry Barn the day of judging with exhibitor tag attached.

7. Poultry Science: Exhibits should be brought to the Poultry Barn the day of judging. Exhibitors must be present for interview during judging.
8. Meat Production: Grand and Reserve Champion will be sold at the Jr. Livestock Auction. All other A-rated meat pens will be sold through silent auction.
9. All market poultry exhibitors selling through silent auction are responsible for making sure their photo is taken by noon on Monday and included in auction display. Clean up after auction and when market animals are shipped for processing is the responsibility of exhibitor.
10. Exhibitor must be present to weigh in their birds and coop in their own birds.
11. All exhibitors participating in market poultry project will be responsible to sign up to work the silent auction wagon, poultry pick up table, and various other duties related to the livestock sale and processing and market project birds. Failure to sign up and fulfill duties will result in loss of awards, premiums and right to sell.
12. All exhibitors are responsible for own feed and water cups, feed and bedding (pine shavings only, no cedar).
13. Judging for showmanship using one bird, any breed, sex/age. Showmanship animal MUST be entered in a breed class.
14. Some classes may be combined or split at discretion of superintendent
15. Exhibition Poultry will be judged according to the American Poultry Association.
16. All market exhibitors must be present (or have a representative present) when birds are picked up for processing to help with loading and to collect your supplies and equipment.
17. Poultry Association "Standard of Perfection" and the APA/ABA Youth website is a good source of poultry education information.
18. It is strongly recommended that exhibitors label supplies and equipment with their initials or name.
19. Sharing of club shirts for silent auction photos is prohibited. However, exhibitors are welcome to wear club shirts for silent auction photos.
20. Market poultry exhibitors must bring proof of hatch date to check in to present to superintendent. Hatch date means the bird must not be hatched any earlier than the hatch date.

Division 1801 – Poultry Showmanship

Class 01 - Senior Poultry Showmanship, 14 yrs. & older

Class 02 - Intermediate Poultry Showmanship, 11-13 yrs. old

Class 03 - Young Poultry Showmanship, 10 & under

Class 06 - Clover Sprout Showmanship, borrowing a bird
Showmanship birds must be entered in a class, not just showmanship.

Division 1802 – Poultry/Pigeon Science

Educational exhibit, display, poster or notebook or combination relating to poultry science. Exhibitors must be present for interview during judging.

Class 60 - Poultry Science Sr. Division, 15 yrs. & older

Class 61 - Poultry Science Jr. Division, 12-14 yrs. old

Class 62 - Poultry Science Young Division, 11 yrs. & under

Class 63 - Poultry Science Clover Sprouts, ages 5-7

Division 1804 – Egg Production Chickens

Egg laying contest winners will be determined by number of eggs laid by Friday at 5 p.m. Ties will be broken by Saturday at noon.

Class 15 - Hens - Two laying hens, any Standard Breed

Division 1805 - Eggs

Class 17 - 1 dozen eggs, uniform color and size - Brown

Class 18 - 1 dozen eggs, uniform color and size - White

Class 19 - 1 dozen eggs, uniform color & size - any other color

Class 20 - 1 dozen eggs, uniform color & size, any other*
*bantam or duck eggs

Division 1817 - Decorated Egg Class

Class 302 - Decorated Egg, Sr. Division 14 yrs. & older

Class 303 - Decorated Egg, Intermediate, 11-13 yrs. old

Class 304 - Decorated Egg, Young, 10 & under

Division 1806 – Poultry Meat Production

Proof of hatch date, see Rule 20. Exhibitor must be present for judging. Entries limited to one pen. Clover Sprouts are not eligible to sell their livestock on the livestock auction.

***Market Chickens and Heritage Chickens have a minimum weight of 5 lbs. per bird.**

Division 1806 – Poultry Meat Production continued

Class 32 - Chickens, 3 birds to a pen, 9 wks. at show*

Class 33 - Ducks, 2 birds to a pen, 10 wks. at show
*Heavy Breeds Only Jersey Giants, Ancona, Delaware

Geese/Turkeys will be shown/sold individually.

Exhibitors bring either one of each sex of bird or two of the same sex but will be judged individually.

Class 34 - Geese/Goose, one bird, 14 wks. at show time

Class 35 - Geese/Gander, one bird, 14 wks. at show time

Class 36 - Turkey/Hen, one bird, 17 wks. at show time**

Class 37 - Turkey/Tom, one bird, 17 wks. at show time**

**Turkeys must weigh 17 lbs. at fair.

Class 38 - Heritage Breed Chickens, 3 birds*.

Class 39 - Clover Sprout Meat Production**

**Clover Sprouts must show other exhibitor's poultry instead of bringing their own.

***Heritage Breeds ONLY:** Jersey Giants, Ancona, Delaware, Araucana, Blue Andalusian, Brahma, Dominique, Buffalo Orpington, Rhode Island Red, Bared Plymouth Rock, Speckled Sussex and Wyandotte ONLY.

Provided that MDARD and/or Fair Board determines poultry cannot be exhibited at the fair, this will be announced via the Fair's website with further directions for exhibitors as to a plan.

Class 101 - Single Comb Clean Legged (Leghorn, Japanese, Australorps, Dutch, Rhode Island Red)

Class 102 - Rose Comb Clean Legged (Wyandotte, Rosecomb, Leghorns, Rhode Island Red, Belgian Bearded d'Anvers)

Class 103 - All Other Comb Clean Legged (Ameraucanas, Chanteclers, Cornish, Malays, Polish)

Class 104 - Feather Legged (Cochin, Silkie, Sultans, Brahas, Booted)

Division 1811 – Large Fowl

Class 110 - American (Wyandotte, Rhode Island Red, Buckeye)

Division 1814 – Show Turkey

Class 127 - Turkey (all breeds)

Division 1816 – Barnyard Classic

Class 400: Chicken, Water Fowl, Turkey, etc. – No breed*

*Exhibitor is limited to two entries in this class

Division 1815 – Pigeons – Breed

1. Exhibitors must be present to be interviewed during judging in order to be eligible for Grand/Reserve.
2. There is no limit on number of entries. Note: Follow class guidelines.
3. Exhibitors must have feed & water containers that are non-spillable hung or fastened to the case, fed and watered at least 2 times a day and cages cleaned daily.
4. Birds should be dusted with commercial poultry dusting powder before the Fair. Birds found to be infested with mites, dirty, etc. will not be allowed to enter. Pigeons must be clean to enter.

Class 01 - Utility, one bird (King, Runt Strasser, etc.)

Class 02 - Fancy, one bird (Fantail, Pouter's, Modena, etc.)

Class 03 - Flying, one bird (Homer, Roller, Tippler, etc.)

Class 04 - Clover Sprout Pigeon, bringing bird to fair

Class 05 - Clover Sprout Pigeon, borrowing a bird at fair

Division 1817 – Club Display

Class 301 - Club Decorations (Not for market birds) \$25 Award. Do not enter this class. Decorations are allowed after judging has been completed on Monday. They should not disrupt airflow through cages or be on top of the case due to lack of sturdiness. Each club will have a 4'x8' hung lattice above cages. Decorations must be completed by Tuesday night of fair.
