
PARENTS & KIDS: We have a few special things to help children enjoy worship:

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

SCRIPTURE READING: Ephesians 1:11-23

¹¹ In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹² so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³ In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴ this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

Honestly, I was shocked to see how much money we had raised over the year. I asked Christine, our office manager, if it was right. Yet there it was. \$18,128 with a balance of \$15,600. We are well situated financially to carry this mission forward for the next 5 years! That means at least 1,500 large loads of laundry!

Thank you for your time, skills, energy, support, and willingness to change people's lives. I feel this is what Jesus would applaud as he walks beside us on laundry days. I look forward to where we go from here to grow this ministry and support others that are just waiting!!

Reflections on our year with Laundry Love – by Sue Boutin

Like so many things, this journey started as a story of need. LeighAnn Viche suggested I speak with her friend from Lakeside Presbyterian Church about Laundry Love in February.

We asked how to help and started sewing laundry bags for them. It soon became a partnership of faith communities working to make a difference for low income people in Duluth. Yes, initially I was fearful of who I may meet at the laundromat. But, like so many things in life, connecting and listening to their stories made me realize we all just want the same thing. To be seen and respected. The laundromat has become a community where people help each other, make friendships and are so grateful for our help.

We had no idea how we would manage the \$500 monthly cost to fund this service. Mostly, we just plugged along thinking of things that could raise money. It started with a spring plant and craft sale. Then being paid volunteers at Grandmas. Noisy offerings one Sunday added a cushion. Memorial donations came in as the word spread about the mission. An endowment grant from our church provided seed money to keep us operating till the end of the year. The men's bible group raised money with a car show. Funds from sewing classes were donated. General donations came from people who heard what we were doing. Busy hands worked to create things for a sale. Then
