Norway Spruce—(Picea abies)
2 yr. seedling 7-10"
Very fast growth, Extremely hardy and wind resistant.
Full to partial sun. Prefers moist, well drained, acidic soils.



White Pine—(Pinus strobus)
2 yr. seedling 7-10"
Native five needle pine. Used as Christmas trees, windbreaks, wildlife habitat. Fast growing, in wide range of soils.



Red Oak—Quercus rubra)
1 yr. seedlings 6-12"
Recognized for its red autumn color. Rapid growth rate. Prefer moist well drained soils. Full to partial sun.



White Oak— (Quercus albe)
1-2 yr. seedling 6-12"
Slow to medium growth rate. Good fall color and excellent acorn production.
Full to Partial Sun. Rich, deep, moist, well drained soil.



American Hazelnut—(Corylus americana)
1 yr. seedling, 6-12"
Grows best on rich, moist, well-drained soils. Sun or
Partial shade, Moderate growth rate. Has been valued
as an ornamental and for planting in naturalized settings,
Nuts are used as food not only for humans but animals
alike.



Paw Paw—(Asimina triloba)
2 yr. seeding. 6-12"
Full to part sun, moist, well—drained, deep, rich soil, moderate growth rate. The largest tree-borne fruit. The edible fruits look similar to stubby bananas.
