**HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY for CANOPY SKATEPARK FACILITY and Camp
Corve Site (The Venue)**

**Adopted April 2022
Updated February 2026
Next review February 2027**

Statement of General Policy

- To provide adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from our work activities
- To consult with employees and guests on matters affecting their health and safety
- To provide and maintain safe site owned plant and equipment
- To provide information, instruction and supervision for employees, sub-contractors, volunteers, guests and students
- To ensure all employees, volunteers, and students are given adequate training and are competent to do their tasks
- To prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health
- To maintain safe and healthy working and recreation conditions
- To review and revise this policy as necessary and at least annually.

Responsibilities:

Overall and final responsibility for health and safety is that of the Director of CampCorve, Don'tRain SkateBoard Coaching and Canopy Skatepark and Camp Corve Site, Hamish Fleming.

Canopy SkatePark Facility and the Camp Corve Site

Day to day responsibility for health and safety is delegated within each area as follows:

- Maintenance and safe use of all equipment (ramps, skateboards, helmets and safety pads) – Hamish Fleming
- Checking all session or event areas are safe and suitable and first aid equipment up to date – Hamish Fleming
- Aware of Fire Safety Procedures at all sessions or events – Hamish Fleming

Camp Corve Events

- The Site Health & Safety is the responsibility of the Site Manager Hamish Fleming, and
- Third Party Suppliers are responsible for the health and safety of:
 - The Maintenance and safe use of all their equipment
 - Checking all the event areas where they are supplying/using equipment or services and that they are safe, compliant and suitable and their first aid equipment is up to date
 - That they are aware of Fire Safety Procedures on the site and to do with any service or equipment they are supplying or using at the event

CampCorve, Don'tRain SkateBoard Coaching and Canopy Skatepark employees and/or sub-contractors will meet formally at the start and the end of the day and raise Health and Safety concerns with each other as they arise. Any necessary action is taken immediately.

Training

We are a small, highly trained, competent and experienced team of employees and/or subcontractors. As the business grows, we will review our training procedures.

Accidents and First Aid

Hamish and Erin Fleming are qualified first aiders. First aid equipment will always be on hand.

Monitoring

Monitoring of conditions, safe working practices and accidents are carried out by the staff team and any sub-contractors will monitor their conditions, safe working practices and accidents.

Emergency Procedures

CampCorve, Don'tRain SkateBoard Coaching, Canopy Skatepark and Camp Corve staff and/or subcontractors will adhere to all site emergency procedures which will be made clear and agreed before running any sessions or events. Emergency procedures will be available around the site and where appropriate explained to all guests, learners, sports facility users, support staff, third parties suppliers, parents, carers and all visitors.

Event Health and Safety

Hosts – those who are hiring the Venue from WightCo Limited and Don't Rain Limited and inviting their guests to their event.

The Hosts are responsible for:

- Complying with all requirements of Health and Safety regulations in relation to any features of Your Event which are special or unique to Your Event
- If You are supplying your own entertainment or equipment or that of third parties, You must ensure that all electrical equipment to be used during the Event must be fully PAT Tested. All such equipment must bear the appropriate labels and be accompanied by the appropriate certificates as proof of such testing and compliance.
- Bringing to the attention of all your invitees (Guests) to the event PRIOR TO attending the event all the Health & Safety requirements of the site

PLEASE BRING TO THE ATTENTION OF YOUR GUESTS PRIOR TO THE EVENT THE FOLLOWING:

- The site is a countryside environment, and the ground can be uneven and the going variable from soft (muddy) to hard and dusty. Use appropriate footwear.
- The site is surrounded by ditches and undergrowth such as nettles, brambles etc. Take care to follow the pathways and use the allotted gateways and openings. You stray off the pathways at your own risk.
- Camp Corve is a quiet remote site. However, Corve Lane and the track running through the farmyard area out to the fields beyond are public bridleways. Be aware that there are small and large agricultural vehicles, other possible users such as walkers, dog walkers, horse riders, cyclists or farm workers etc., that use this right of way. **Care must be taken in traversing or crossing the bridleway.**
- Children and vulnerable people must be accompanied at all times on all parts of the site.

- To drive and park in a careful and thoughtful manner in the designated areas and taking into consideration any other possible users of the bridleway such as walkers, dog walkers, horse riders or farm workers etc.,
- To not exceed a maximum of 15mph and where possible to travel at 5mph.
- To act in a responsible manner in an area of outstanding natural beauty and to respect the safety and enjoyment of others
