Kurdistan, Iraq

The Historical Christians in Iraq

Historical Christianity has had as long history (if not longer) here in Iraq as Islam. Please understand what I mean when I say "Christians" in the Middle East. Other than a few believers in Iraq, most of what exists in the Christian minority is more akin to Catholicism. The majority of "Christians" living here were born into Christianity just as Muslims are born into Islam. They consider themselves Christians but have never received the second birth. Most are not believers. Scores of headlines over the years have said something like this: "Christians Martyred by Radical Muslims" and this is alarming to Western believers who naturally are deeply saddened by the idea of fellow believers being killed. However, it's much more tragic than that. These are not fellow believers being killed and going to Heaven. Instead, these are people as lost as Muslims that die with no hope.

I say all this to help you understand the need of this minority group here in Iraq. Thankfully, here in Kurdistan, there's no current violent conflict between Muslims and Christians, but the eternal need is still great. Though our main focus is on Muslim Kurds, we want to be faithful to share the gospel with everyone God brings into our path. Please pray for this minority here in our region and for us as we seek to show them the truth.
