Ministry Outreach - "Christian" but lost

As Apryl and I sat in the home of an ethnically Armenian family the old man turned to me and said, "Why are you here?" I knew where he was going, but answered politely. "NO! I want to know for which people you have come here? Muslims? Orthodox? Armenian? What?! Who did you come for?" The room was stock still. "We came for the glory of God. If God leads me to a Muslim I will speak the Gospel. If he leads me to an Orthodox or Armenian man I will speak the Gospel. We are here for God," I said with a smile. He shook his head and said, "We don't want the Muslims to become Christians." I took a deep breath and prepared to offend my host with as much tact and grace as I could muster. "My friend, then you have a problem with God. The Scriptures say that God desires all to come to repentance. So your problem is not with me it is with God."

This is the definition of Christianity that pervades most of the Middle East. These are 'first-birth' Christians relying on their ethnicity for favor with God. One need only replace "Jew" with "Christian' in Romans 2-3 and the story is the same. It is heartbreaking and these precious people need the Gospel just as much as the most devout Muslim. Pray that the Gospel of the second-birth would be mightily proclaimed among these who so desperately need it.
