## Gospel Opportunity - "Jane"

Matt and I have known "Jane" since the week we arrived in Iraq. In fact, she was our first language helper. She was single and living with her parents in the village we lived in at the time. A couple of times a week we would take the short walk to her house and spend hours learning language and then share a meal with her family. She is funny, a little ornery, and very, very smart. Since we first met Jane, she has gotten married, moved to the city we now live in, had terrible struggles in her arranged marriage, fallen out of touch with us (as she tried to conceal some issues within her in-law's household), struggled to conceive a child, and is now back in our lives again. I prayed for nine months that I would be able to rekindle this relationship and am so grateful. She has shared with me pieces of what she has gone through and, even more remarkably, her mother has shared some details and asked me to pray on Jane's behalf.

Recently, I have had the opportunity to help proof the ongoing Behdini Kurdish translation of the Old Testament. Part of this process is to sit down with native speakers and determine their understanding of the language translation and grammar. Despite her mother's displeasure, Jane has enthusiastically agreed to help me with this. In the process of looking at scripture together, I am using the opportunity to create a Bible study with her. It has taken six years of active pursuit to get to this point with Jane and I am so excited about what has already come of it! Exposure to scripture has prompted question after question from her. She wants badly to believe as she always has - that God has a scale and as long as her good outweighs her bad she will be okay. She wants to believe that whether Muslim or Christian as long as we try to be more good than bad we should all be okay, but she is already seeing that Scripture contradicts her. This has spawned questions and conversation that make clear the Holy Spirit is drawing her and allowed me to share the gospel openly with her again.

Pray for Jane! If you happen to have one of the prayer booklets I gave out to ladies on furlough, it contains a picture of Jane and her mother (I use her real name in the booklet). As always, I would ask you to pray for her and for me as I know the Holy Spirit will continue to work!
