SEPTEMBER 14, 2025 THE EXULTATION OF THE CROSS



Dear friends,

It's a curious thing—the exultation of the cross. In the time of the early Christian community, the cross was a means of execution, and a very brutal execution at that. It was the way the Roman government kept order and instilled fear in the people. It was a sign of oppression and dominance by the powerful over the powerless.

But here we are, in our churches, homes and schools, where crosses abound. Beautiful crosses, exquisitely hand-crafted out of wood, glass and ceramics or forged lovingly out of metal. They are given as gifts to commemorate special events and take places of honor in our homes. We're so far removed from the cross as a means of execution that we don't always appreciate the irony of this. If we replaced our crosses with the electric chair, a firing squad, a gallows for hanging people, or a gurney which people are strapped to and injected with lethal drugs (our current means of executing people) we might appreciate the irony of displaying crosses everywhere.

But here we are, celebrating crosses on this feast we call the "exultation of the cross." The power of the cross is that we are taking one thing that is really the worst thing imaginable—the execution of a person—and proclaiming that this symbol is a sign of hope. What was once seen as a sign of domination by the powerful over the weak, is now a reminder that in powerlessness and vulnerability comes new life.

This message can get lost when we start focusing on beautiful images of the cross but it can also get lost when we think that our role is to praise Jesus for all the hard work he did dying on the cross. Simply put, the cross is not so much about Jesus as it is about us. Jesus showed us the way so we could "take up our cross and follow him."



In the early Christian communities the cross was often depicted in the form of plus sign. For them, the cross was a reminder of the four elements that are key to a journey of growth and transformation. The early Christians were tapping into some very ancient wisdom about what transformation looks like. Essentially, transformation deals with four questions: how do we face change, how do we move through suffering, how do we receive joy, and how do you give your life in service.

So when people looked at the cross, it was not really something to remind them of what Jesus did, but a reminder of what they were supposed to do if they wanted to be Jesus' disciples. I shared a little about this early Christian perspective in the September issue of *The Carpenter* and will be sharing more in the October issue. Leaning into the journey of life

THE LOVE OF THE HEART OF JESUS

We continue reading from Pope Francis' recent letter to the church "On the Love of the Heart of Jesus Christ."

*Integrity and Harmony
In communion of service*

We should not think of this mission of sharing Christ as something only between Jesus and me. Mission is experienced in fellowship with our communities and with the whole Church. If we turn aside from the community, we will be turning aside from Jesus. If we turn our back on the community, our friendship with Jesus will grow cold. This is a fact, and we must never forget it. Love for the brothers and sisters of our communities - religious, parochial, diocesan and others - is a kind of fuel that feeds our friendship with Jesus. Our acts of love for our brothers and sisters in community may well be the best and, at times, the only way that we can witness to others our love for Jesus Christ. He himself said, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn 13:35).



This love then becomes service within the community. I never tire of repeating that Jesus told us this in the clearest terms possible: "Just as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40). He now asks you to meet him there, in every one of our brothers and sisters, and especially in the poor, the despised and the abandoned members of society. What a beautiful encounter that can be!

If we are concerned with helping others, this in no way means that we are turning away from Jesus. Rather, we are encountering him in another way. Whenever we try to help and care for another person, Jesus is at our side. We should never forget that, when he sent his disciples on mission, "the Lord worked with them" (Mk 16:20). He is always there, always at work, sharing our efforts to do good. In a mysterious way, his love becomes present through our service. He speaks to the world in a language that at times has no need of words.
