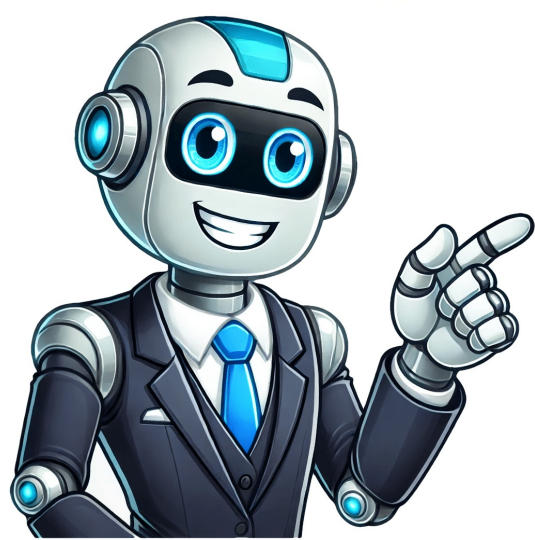

Even if no direct money is exchanged, the time spent on these games can be seen as wasted without any spiritual or mental benefits. It's recommended to explore halal ways to earn money and have fun, following the Prophet's guidance to engage in activities that bring benefit.
