
Dr. Paul L. Binion II

PASTOR/TEACHER


For 46 blessed years, since 1977, Pastor Paul Lawrence Binion II has faithfully pastored the Westside Church of God in Fresno, California. As Fresno's "longest-serving pastor," he is a "Pastor to Pastors," and a shepherd who lovingly "fathers" his flock. He serves as an advisor/confidante to numerous senior leaders, executives, organizations, ministries, fellowships, and residents in Fresno and throughout the Central Valley area. A highly sought-after orator, Pastor Binion is a renowned conference speaker, preacher, and teacher of the Bible.

Born in Fairfield, Alabama, to Paul Lawrence Binion, Sr., and Sara Ellafair House Binion, he is the eldest of five children. The family eventually settled in Los Angeles, California, where he became a long-time member of Wadsworth Church of God. Pastor Binion is a graduate of Susan Miller Dorsey High School; California State University, Los Angeles, with a Bachelor's Degree in History; and Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, California with a Master's Degree of Divinity. The Southern California School of Ministry conferred a Doctor of Divinity upon him.

Reflective of his commitment to his community's well-being, Pastor Binion launched a non-profit organization, the Southwest Fresno Development Corporation, which focuses on building community wealth through homeownership and was recently funded with \$1 million from the City of Fresno; established a Counseling Center to meet the mental health needs of our community; provides monthly food giveaways for hundreds of families experiencing food insecurity and hunger; and developed an Education and Career Initiative to help Fresno students achieve success in their educational and professional pursuits through scholarships.

In 2009, Pastor Binion and the Westside COG Board led the multimillion-dollar purchase of nine (9) acres of land and the construction of a state-of-the-art church facility in the heart of one of the most under-served communities in the U.S. The Westside COG is home to more than 400 members and serves as a hub for community members, neighborhood meetings and regional and local convenings and conferences. With a large sanctuary, classrooms, a dining hall and full-service industrial kitchen, Westside COG leases space to nonprofit organizations and is developing a community kitchen for food entrepreneurs and small business owners. Pastor Binion's vision is to expand the Westside COG campus to include the building out of the second-floor wing with office spaces for social enterprises, the construction of a 9,000 square foot Youth and Community Center, and the construction of affordable housing units for seniors on the rear church lot.

After his love for the LORD, the love of Pastor Binion's life is his beautiful wife, Valarie Jean Metoyer Binion. The two have been married since 1978, and have three daughters -- Tiffany (son-in-law, David), Crisandra, and Kimberley; two granddaughters, Alyssa and Zharia; and one grandson, David Paul.

THE CROSS, THE SWORD AND THE CROWN

Represents the emblem on which Christianity stands. The Cross represents the life and death of Jesus Christ, His blessed resurrection and the fulfillment of prophesy. The Sword represents the passionate Word of God that is given to the church. The Crown of Righteousness represents the reward waiting for those believers who pursue godliness and who lived righteously while facing temptation and hardship on earth.

THE KEY

Represents the "Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven" of which Jesus spoke in Matthew 16:19, and symbolizes authority given in teaching and decisions.

THE BIBLE

Represents God's Word spoken to humanity. This Word is to be revered and spoken to all, witnessed to all, and is life-changing to all.

THE SHEPHERD'S STAFF

Represents the concern and compassion that a shepherd has for his sheep. It conveys the concepts of authority, power, comfort, defense, and protection.

THE TRIANGULAR SYMBOL

Represents the interconnection between the Body of Christ and the Community; the triangular three-part Trinity and the circular shape represent the beloved community.

THE APOLOGETIC OF

Our God has sought to bring about a restorative paradigm for the Christian Church. Paradigmatic changes are not new to the followers of Jesus the Christ. From the establishment of Old Testament laws, rituals, and customs to the emergence of New Testament Pentecostal fire, the people of God have embraced and marveled at the awesome hand of God moving in the church throughout the ages. In each generation, there are servants and special envoys that are called to serve and encourage their contemporaries. Thus, new paradigms are born.

In our case, God has chosen men and women of God to "build the old waste places and to raise up foundations for many generations" (Isaiah 58:12). These offices have been established in the Scriptures to ensure that we will not be "tossed to and fro by every wind of doctrine" (Ephesians 4:14). Bishops are those called to the ministry of healing in the Lord's Church. They teach us how to live as the family of God. They are pastors of pastors. They guide, counsel and nurture those whom they serve. Their lives show evidence of the character of Christ and the fruits of the ministry.



THE PRESENTATION:

The color Purple signifies royalty. Those who have received order to rise to the Episcopacy wear the color Purple because they are Princes of the Lord's Church.

The Full Collar A symbol signifying sanctification and separation.

It is the unique representation of being set apart.

The Cassock This garment may be worn by all ordained clergy

as a symbol of a servant. A typical cassock has 33 buttons in the front representing the years of Christ's physical life and 5 buttons on the sleeve

representing the wounds of Christ.

The Rochet The white linen garment is the symbol of the

Priesthood. Aaron's white linen ephod is found in the Book of Leviticus and is a reminder to the Bishop that his role as Celebrant and Worship leader is

prominent in the total mandate of the office.

The Chimere This garment is the symbol of the Prophet.

The Bishop of the church becomes the Chief Defender of the faith and preacher of the

doctrines in the church. This is the symbol that sets him apart as one who speaks the things which

become sound doctrine.

The Ring (Sonship) Symbolizes fidelity to the nuptial bond with his

spouse, the church. It is a symbol of Sonship and

The Pectoral Cross The cross of gold is hung around the Bishop's

neck as a symbol of his imprisonment for Christ.
