

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



HAPPY FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY!

Three Wise Men, New Year's House Blessing! The Christmas season continues this weekend with the Feast of the Epiphany: Wise Men bringing gifts to Jesus. Every year, we sing a popular Christmas song about three kings and the gifts they brought to the Christ Child. The song is not technically correct, because the Bible does not say they were kings. Matthew 2:1-2 says, "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came Wise Men from the east to Jerusalem, saying, Where is the newborn King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the east, and have come to worship Him." Matthew 2:11 continues, "And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary His mother, and fell down, and worshipped Him: and when

they had opened their treasures, they presented unto Him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh." So why are Epiphany and the Wise Men so special for Catholics?

Epiphany marks the occasion of a time-honored Catholic tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2024 — is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 24.

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Wise Men or Magi — Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "24" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

The chalking of the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be somewhat less well-known in the United States. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work or visit them there.

Most often, the chalking takes place after Epiphany Mass, and can be done at any church, home, workplace or school. Traditionally, the blessing is done by either a priest or member of the family. This blessing can be performed simply by just writing the inscription and offering a short prayer, or more elaborately, including songs, prayers, processions, the burning of incense, and the sprinkling of Holy Water.

After all the Epiphany Masses this weekend, packets of blessed chalk, prayers, and containers of Epiphany Holy Water (Holy Water blessed with special blessings for Epiphany) are being distributed. Any member of your household or family can pray the prayers, follow the ritual and write the blessing on the doors of your home.

Practicing traditions like the chalking of the doors helps us to live our Catholic faith more concretely and serve as an outward sign of our dedication to the Lord Jesus. Our homes are also the place where many of us will make the greatest strides in our spiritual growth, through observance of daily prayer, spiritual reading, and work offered as a sacrifice to God.

The chalking of the doors of a home encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. It also serves as a reminder of imitating the Magi – the Wise Men as they welcomed the Christ child and gave their most precious gifts to Jesus. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us. Never forget, the Lord is with us, always!

How do you relax and unwind? When I ask this question to clients, I use the word recreation. The word recreation is derived from the Latin root "recreare" or "re-create." I would wager that the latter would result in feeling much more refreshed and rejuvenated than the former. Time spent on most activities is perfectly fine, but they can become an issue when they are our sole form of recreation. Some activities are like cheesecake – we feel very differently after we have eaten one piece versus the entire cheesecake. Balance is needed in life for health in all areas – physical, mental, and spiritual. This week, consider taking some time to reflect on your recreational activities and changes you can pursue to make your free time truly a time of recreation. - Luke Brown


