

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



MARY AND JOSEPH WAITING IN HOPE!

Happy 1st Sunday of Advent. In this weekend's Gospel, the Lord Jesus commands us to be watchful and alert as we wait for the day of Jesus' Second Coming. Jesus urges us to vigilance saying, "Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." The most perfect model of remaining vigilant during this season is Mary and Joseph. As we prepare for Jesus' birth at Christmas, the readings and season invite us to behold Mary as the model for mothers who say yes without knowing the whole story and Joseph as the foster father who protects and serves the holy family. Mary is prompted by the Angel Gabriel to cooperate with God's plan of salvation without seeing the complete picture. Mary was more than merely the biological mother of the Lord Jesus. Mary and Joseph's task in the Incarnation was not over after the event in the stable at Bethlehem. Birth was followed by education. Mary and Joseph exercised

a continuous formation of the young Jesus as He grew from infancy to childhood to the teen years to young manhood. The New Testament does not tell us how this happened. There is only one brief glimpse...in the narrative of the losing and finding of the boy Jesus in the temple. Mary acts like a typical mother, with the emotions of loss and anxiety and with the maternal demand to know why her son would go off without telling her and Joseph.

It is interesting that Luke cites her words and not Joseph's. "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety" (Luke 2:48). These are words we expect a mother to say. Mary is not shy about asserting her maternal authority. It flows from her love, of course...aside from this brief anecdote, we know nothing else about what happened between mother and son all those years. Her maternal training style, her motherly witness of virtues, her approach to parenting is not recorded for us. Nonetheless, we should not forget that it happened. Mary was indeed mother of God. But she was also a human mother of a son who had a human upbringing. Joseph was indeed the foster father of Jesus. But he was also a human father of a son who needed to be taught how to live just like us.

A good part of a mother's and father's identity comes into play at Christmastime. How the house is decorated, whether we make our own cookies, buy them at the bakery, or skip them altogether, whether the children are dressed for Christmas Mass and dinner in good clothes or wearing pajamas—each is a litmus test of a parent's worth. All of us remembers the presence (or absence) of our own mothers and fathers at this time and I imagine that says something about how we view ourselves. This Advent, let's remember to pray for all our mothers and fathers, grandmothers and grandfathers who taught us that our life is worth more than simply what we do.

Be watchful, be alert for the Lord Jesus is coming at an hour you do not expect. In what ways are the anxieties of daily life blinding you for the real and proper coming of Jesus? Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse, pray for us. Amen.

WHAT IS THE MEANING BEHIND THE ADVENT WREATH CANDLES?

The word "advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus," which means "coming." For Catholics, Advent is the four-week season leading up to Christmas. During Advent, we anticipate the coming of Jesus at Christmas as well as prepare ourselves for Jesus' final coming at the end of time. It's a time full of reflection, excitement, and hope. The Advent candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. Each of the candles represents an aspect of preparation during the Season of Advent:

- 1. The Candle of Hope; Color: Purple. Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we look forward to Jesus' coming with hope.
- **2. The Candle of Peace; Color: Purple.** During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming.
- **3. The Candle of Joy; Color: Pink.** This third candle is pink, symbolizing anticipation and rejoicing. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day.
- **4. The Candle of Love; Color: Purple.** During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of His Son: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

CELEBRATE OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

On Friday, December 12th, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Pro-Life Group of St. Columbkille invites you to join in celebrating Our Queen and Mother as Patroness of the Americas and of the Unborn. The image has special significance during the Advent Season because Mary is depicted as pregnant with Jesus.

Her miraculous image, left on Juan Diego's coarse tilma was responsible for the conversion of 8,000,000 Indians. According to Kodak of Mexico, the image is smooth and feels like a modern-day photograph. Several images can be seen reflected in the eyes of the Virgin and the distortion and place of the images are identical to what is produced in the normal eye. The image, to this

date, cannot be explained by science. It shows no sign of deterioration after 450 years! (The fibers used to make the tilma usually disintegrate in 15-30 years.) The stars on her mantle are the constellation that appeared in the sky that day. Our Lady promised to eradicate abortion in our land by converting all who look upon her image.






