



LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD ON FEBRUARY 2ND

The Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, also known as Candlemas, often slips quietly past our modern consciousness. But like so much in our Catholic faith, there is more there than we might at first recognize. Celebrated on Monday, February 2nd – 40 days after the celebration of Christmas, this feast recalls Mary and Joseph presenting the infant Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem, as prescribed by Jewish law. It is a moment marked by humility, obedience, and the fulfillment of divine promise, and it is a moment of prophetic mystery as we hear Simeon tell Mary that, “you yourself a sword will pierce – so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.” (Luke 2:35)

Candlemas reminds us that our belief in God is often lived out in honoring the observances of our faith. Mary and Joseph's act of bringing Jesus to the Temple was a simple one, yet it resonated with profound meaning. They were obedient to God's law, despite Mary's unique holiness as the sinless Mother of God and Jesus' divinity. Their willingness to submit to the law of Moses demonstrates how even they lived out their faith in humble, ordinary ways.

It is customary on Candlemas to bless candles which can be used throughout the liturgical year. When Jesus was presented in the Temple, Simeon took Him in his arms and said, “Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people, Israel.” (Luke 2:26)

Inspired by this scriptural motif, it is traditional on the feast to bless and light candles, which remind us that the darkness shall not overcome the light of Christ. As Christians, we are called to be light in a world that is overshadowed by darkness. Candles became part of the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord as early as the 4th or 5th century, particularly in Jerusalem and later, Rome, where a candlelit procession was introduced. Blessed candles are available in the sanctuary this weekend after all the Masses.

SAINT BLAISE THROAT BLESSING!

The Feast of St. Blaise is this Tuesday, February 3rd. Blaise was most famous for healing a person's throat who happened to be choking on a chicken bone. At the end of all the Masses this weekend our priests will be offering a solemn throat blessing to the entire congregation for good health and healing.

SAINT BLAISE, PRAY FOR US!

The life of the Church is planted thick with “sacramentals,” in fact, these are very often the things that stick out in our minds as we think about those unique pieces of our Catholic identity – things like holy water, palm branches, ashes, rosaries, etc. Another of these uniquely Catholic experiences is the Blessing of Throats on the Feast of Saint Blaise. Despite the scarcity of biographical details concerning Blaise's life, he grew to become one of the most popular saints during the Middle Ages. We know that he lived from the third to the fourth century, and that he was the Bishop of Sebastea, in Armenia. Even though the official persecution of Christians in the Roman Empire ended in AD 313 with the Edict of Milan issued by Emperor Constantine, the Eastern Emperor, Licinius, still harbored hostility toward the Christians. In fact, the corrupt emperor would move to purge Christians from government posts, demand sacrifice to the pagan gods, burn churches, and enslave, torture, and execute many Christians living in the East. Licinius had Blaise imprisoned, and tradition tells us, that while in prison, a mother whose child was choking on a fish bone, brought her son to him and begged Saint Blaise to save him. After he prayed over him, the boy was able to cough up the bone and recovered.

It is because of this event, that the Church blesses throats on his feast day, and invokes his intercession for God's protection from all ailments of the throat and every other illness. After beatings and intimidation, Saint Blaise was put to death (likely by beheading) in 316 for his refusal to sacrifice to the pagan gods. Licinius' persecution would last another seven years, until Constantine marched his legions east (carrying their Christian battle standards) and deposed Licinius, making himself sole Emperor of the Roman Empire in 324. This feast day is a reminder to us of how God, in His goodness, chooses to work through others, including us.

There are those who are often critical of the Cult of the Saints and the use of sacramentals. They claim that this practice is nothing more than magic or superstition. But if that's true, why did Jesus call others to share in His ministry (e.g. the 12 Apostles, the 72 Disciples, etc.)? And why did our Lord also use material things as a part of His public ministry (e.g. rubbing mud into the blind man's eyes, taking water and turning it into wine, etc.)?

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

God, in His wisdom, delights to work through intermediaries (angels and humans) to accomplish His purposes, so that His creation might participate in His saving work and deepen their communion with Him and one another. Petitioning for help through the intercession of a Saint, like Blaise, is not any different than asking a friend to pray for you, except, that when this friend is a Saint, we know that they have the ear of God in a unique and mysterious way.

This weekend in honor of St. Blaise, we will offer the Blessing of Throats as part of the final blessing after all the Masses. "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."



