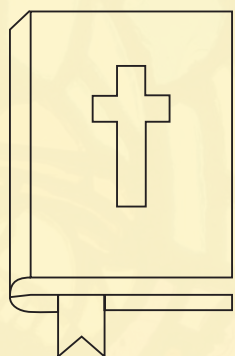

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



TWO-NIGHT MISSION ON THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION!

On Monday, February 26th (7 PM - 8 PM) and Tuesday, February 27th (7:30 PM after our 7 PM Mass until 8:30 PM) our priests will be offering a two-night mission on the healing power of Confession. The priests will talk about the scriptural foundations of the sacrament, how to invite someone back who hasn't gone in a long time, and how to make a good Confession. Fr. Suso will be using a portion of a fantastic video series on [formed.org](https://www.formed.org) entitled *Forgiveness*.

DIOCESAN-WIDE EVENING OF CONFESSION THIS WEEK!

Why not follow up the mission on forgiveness by going to Confession the next day.

On Wednesday, February 28 from 5 PM - 8 PM, every Catholic Church will be open for Confessions. Every priest in the diocese will be forgiving sins in the Sacrament of Penance that night and we are blessed to have Fr. Robinson, Fr. Spicer, and Fr. Suso all available for Confession and absolution on this special night. Confession guides with an examination of conscience will be available, so if you know someone who hasn't been to Confession for a long time, please invite them to come!

LATIN MASS RESPONSES DURING THE LENTEN SEASON!

I thought that the five weeks of Lent would be the perfect time to reintroduce some of the Latin Mass responses during the Sacred Liturgy. The Second Vatican Council expects that all the faithful be familiar with the principle Mass parts in Latin. Meaning that it represents the desire of the Church, not a conservative or liberal agenda. But, because the most common objection to using Latin in the Liturgy is that Vatican II did away with it, I am going to quote from the document on the liturgy from the Second Vatican Council: "The use of the Latin language, with due respect to particular law, is to be preserved in the Latin rites" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 36). Furthermore, the council decreed that "a suitable place may be allotted to the vernacular [English] in Masses which are celebrated with the people ... nevertheless care must be taken to ensure that the faithful may also be able to say or sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 54). Such parts would include: 'Greeting,' 'Gloria,' 'Creed,' 'Holy, Holy,' 'Mystery of Faith,' 'Our Father,' and 'Lamb of God.'

To try to do all of these at once would be overwhelming, so we are only going to do a few of them at any given time. During Lent we are singing the Holy, Holy Holy – Sanctus, Mystery of Faith – *Mysterium Fidei*, and the Lamb of God – *Agnus Dei*. We will learn these Mass parts during Lent and then will return to English at Eastertime. Again, the goal is not to switch to Latin exclusively, but to ensure that the call of the Second Vatican Council is realized, namely, that we are able, if need be, to recite or sing the principal Mass parts in Latin.

Another thing to keep in mind is that the ability to recite the principle Mass parts in Latin serves the unity of the Church. It allows for the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church of Jesus Christ to pray with one voice when she gathers together from disparate parts of the world. It was surely the hope of Vatican II, that when we gather for Mass with Catholics from other nations, who speak other languages, that we be able to pray with one voice around the one altar of sacrifice, which makes us one with Christ, and each other. There is something intangible, yet deeply profound, about standing next to someone whom I may not be able to communicate with in any other way because of a language barrier, but when it comes to that which really matters – what I believe – we can stand side by side and proclaim together the deepest truths of our faith in a common language. In that moment, at the high point of the Church's most sacred activity, I not only know what my brother or sister is saying, but I am also united with them in the truth of professing it.

So let us respond to the call of the Second Vatican Council this Lent and immerse ourselves in the language of prayer of the Church that endured for sixteen centuries (Latin was the exclusive language of prayer from the 4th century until the 20th in the Western Church). To aid us, the Mass parts with musical notation are found in the *Breaking Bread Hymnals* and the words will be on the screens. And be patient, this is new for most of us. It will probably take a little while, but it will gradually sink in, and before long you'll be able to switch between Latin and English at Mass as easily as you change stations on the radio. We plan on using them only during Lent right now, but if you like them, please let one of the priests or Maria DiDonato know. We can always bring them back! Never forget, the Lord is with us, always! - Fr. Suso

Sacrifice is important throughout the year, but it is especially important to reflect on during the Lenten season. All of our relationships require sacrifice and some of us are worse at it than others. When it comes to sacrifice, I often like to ask people how they are being called to sacrifice. How we are called to sacrifice is something that changes depending on our vocation, relationships, and faith. I spoke with a man once who was reflecting on the early years of his relationship with his wife and how difficult it was to leave his wife at home and work long hours to make ends meet. The sacrifice was leaving his wife at home to work long hours for the betterment of his family and future financial security. When I met him, he had been married fifteen years and was still working long hours despite achieving

financial security. His wife was upset with him for working too hard and missing social events and their children's sports. Over time, he realized that the sacrifice of working long hours was something he was no longer being called to. While this may sound simple, it is no easy task to give up something that we enjoy, which is why it is called a sacrifice. We need to frequently look at how we are being called to sacrifice for the ones we love because the sacrifice we are called to is not always the same. First and foremost, we need to ask God how He wants us to sacrifice for the ones we love. We also need to ask our loved ones what they need from us so that we can serve them.
