

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



SAINT PATRICK PRAY FOR US!

The Saint whom we celebrate on March 17th each year, is a name that many know, but not a man with whom most are familiar. Patrick was born around the year 389 in Britain, into the Roman Empire, which had been nominally Christian for a little over 100 years. His grandfather was a priest (celibacy was not a regularized discipline in the Western Church at this time) and his father was a deacon. Patrick's family would have been wealthy, because his father served as a Decurion (a tax collector for the Roman Empire), and Patrick himself would have served in this position someday, as this post was hereditary. Patrick tells us in his writings that his childhood was split between the family estate in Southwestern Britain

and a villa that they had nearby. As the son of a well-to-do family, he would have received an excellent education, of which he would unfortunately not be able to avail himself.

At the age of 15, Patrick was captured one night by slave raiders from Ireland, who regularly raided the coast of Britain. This would have been a terrifying and traumatic experience as he was awoken in the middle of the night, bound in chains, dragged from his home, placed into a boat, and had to watch as Britain sank into the horizon, thinking that he would never see his home again. Unlike in the Roman Empire, slaves could not buy their freedom in Ireland, nor be freed by their masters, because the Irish believed this upset the natural order. Patrick was sold to an Irish chieftain and would spend six years as a slave where he worked as a shepherd. This would have been humiliating for him as a nobleman, especially because shepherding was considered the least glamorous of the tasks that could be given to a slave (even below herding cattle and tending pigs).

Although Patrick didn't realize it at the time, his captivity would have a profound effect upon his future work. It was during this time that he learned the language and customs of the people to whom he would one day bring the Gospel. More importantly, it was this experience that brought Patrick to faith. Although he would have received basic religious instruction as a child, he was far from being a devout Christian. But in such desperate circumstances, he turned to the God whom he had been taught about as a child, and began to pray. The more he prayed and meditated upon the biblical stories he learned in his youth, the deeper his relationship with God grew – he even earned the nickname, "holy youth" from his fellow slaves.

One night, the Lord spoke to Patrick in a dream and told him that he would be going home soon, and the very next night God told him to get up and go, that his ship was ready. Patrick had to travel nearly 200 miles to the coast at night, where he received passage on a ship and made his way home. Shortly after returning home, he had a series of visions, and during one of these, he heard the voice of the Irish begging him to come and walk among them once again. So, after some understandable resistance from his parents, he entered the monastery with the great hope of being sent as a missionary to Ireland, but he was told that because of his age and because his education had been interrupted, he would be not able to become a priest.

Patrick's trust in God, however, was far greater than his human limitations, and he not only became a priest, but eventually a bishop, and was chosen to go to Ireland as a missionary. Patrick would labor for the rest of his life, contending with Irish kings and pagan druids, working to bring the light of the Gospel and establish the Church firmly in Ireland. Saint Patrick died around AD 461.

THE FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

Tuesday, March 26th, all the priests of our diocese will be gathering with Bishop Malesic at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist for the annual Chrism Mass where our holy oils for the new year will be blessed and all the priests will renew the promises of Holy Orders at a special Mass open to the faithful at 7 PM. On Wednesday, March 27th, All our priests will be hearing Confessions in Church at 7 PM followed by a special prayer service of light and darkness called Tenebrae at 8 PM. On Holy Thursday, March 28th, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 PM commemorating Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. Night Prayer will be prayed in church at 10:30 PM on Holy Thursday. On Good Friday, March 29th, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by the Passion of our Lord Service at 3 PM and finally Stations of the Cross at 7 PM. On Holy Saturday, March 30th, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by two Easter basket food blessings and 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM. The Great Easter Vigil Mass will be at 8:30 PM in church. Please note there are no 2:30 PM Confessions or 4 PM vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. On Easter Sunday, March 31st, we have Easter Masses at 8 AM, 10 AM, and 12 PM. Please note there is no 5:30 PM Mass on Easter Sunday. Parish Offices are Closed on Good Friday, March 29th, and Easter Monday, April 2nd, so our staff can pray with us and their families on Easter.

ADORATION CHAPEL CLOSED FOR THE SACRED TRIDUUM

Our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel will be closed in honor of the three Holy Days beginning on Holy Thursday morning at 9 AM and will reopen on Monday morning at 9 AM.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY HOLY HOUR

The season of Lent is all about preparing for Easter and trusting in the Divine Mercy of Jesus. Each one of us dies in the state in which we lived, and we all want to live like saints. We all want to love and recognize Jesus on the day of judgement and God has given us the sacred heart of Jesus as the grace we need to be saved from sin. Pope St. John Paul II consecrated the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday in honor of the revelations of St. Margaret Mary and St. Faustina. Here is a little bit about Divine Mercy: It is because of Jesus working through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (d. 1690) that the entire Church celebrates the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which has led, among other things, to tremendous blessings for families who have gone on to enthrone the Sacred Heart of Jesus in their home.

The Feast of Divine Mercy is a brand new one, less than 25 years old. And it is less than 100 years ago that Jesus specifically asked St. Faustina to let the pope know He wanted the entire Church to honor and celebrate His Divine Mercy on this Second Sunday of Easter. Thanks be to God that St. John Paul II listened and acted.

God has special blessings and graces for us if we take the time to listen and respond in trust. So don't let this day, or perhaps this week, go by without learning a little more about Divine Mercy Sunday, about Jesus' words to us, and then responding in the way that God is asking of you. One helpful summary of Jesus' message is: the ABC's of Mercy. A = Ask for mercy; B = Be merciful in deed, word, and prayer; C = Completely trust in Jesus. Jesus told St. Faustina that "Souls that make an appeal to my mercy delight Me. To such souls I grant even more graces than they ask....Beg for mercy for the whole world." On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7th, we will offer a solemn Holy Hour at 3 PM in church when we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Confessions will be offered. Celebrate the octave of Easter and rejoice in Jesus' mercy. Never forget, the Lord is with us, always!

SERVICE SATURDAY

March 16th (9:30 AM - 12:00 PM)



The Rethink Poverty Simulation is a walk in another person's shoes. It's about sharing experiences and making a connection to the conditions of those in poverty. Give yourself one time in this experience of poverty and it can lead you to a new understanding and renewed dedication to fighting against the ties that bind people to poverty.

During the 2.5 hour simulation, participants role play one month in the life of a low-income family and aim to provide their family's most basic needs which include food, clothing, and shelter, while overcoming financial limitations such as unemployment, health issues, housing challenges, food insecurities and other obstacles. Family units interact with resources available in the mock community including banks, grocery stores, community action agencies, Job and Family Services, pawnshops, utilities, employers and more. The simulation occurs over four 15-minute "weeks" and mirrors life below or near the poverty line. For 46.5 million people in the United States, poverty is not a simulation or game.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The simulation breaks down stereotypes by allowing participants to step into the real life situations of others. Poverty is often portrayed as a stand alone issue - but this simulation allows individuals to walk a month in the shoes of someone who is facing poverty and realize how complex and interconnected issues of poverty really are.

- 1. A Single Parent with limited resources and no transportation must find a way to get to work and get their child to daycare.
- 2. An Elderly Person must find a way to pay for both utilities and medication.
- 3. A Young Adult must care for siblings while their parent is incarcerated.
- **4. An Ederly Couple** must raise their grandchildren and deal with their own health and employment issues.


