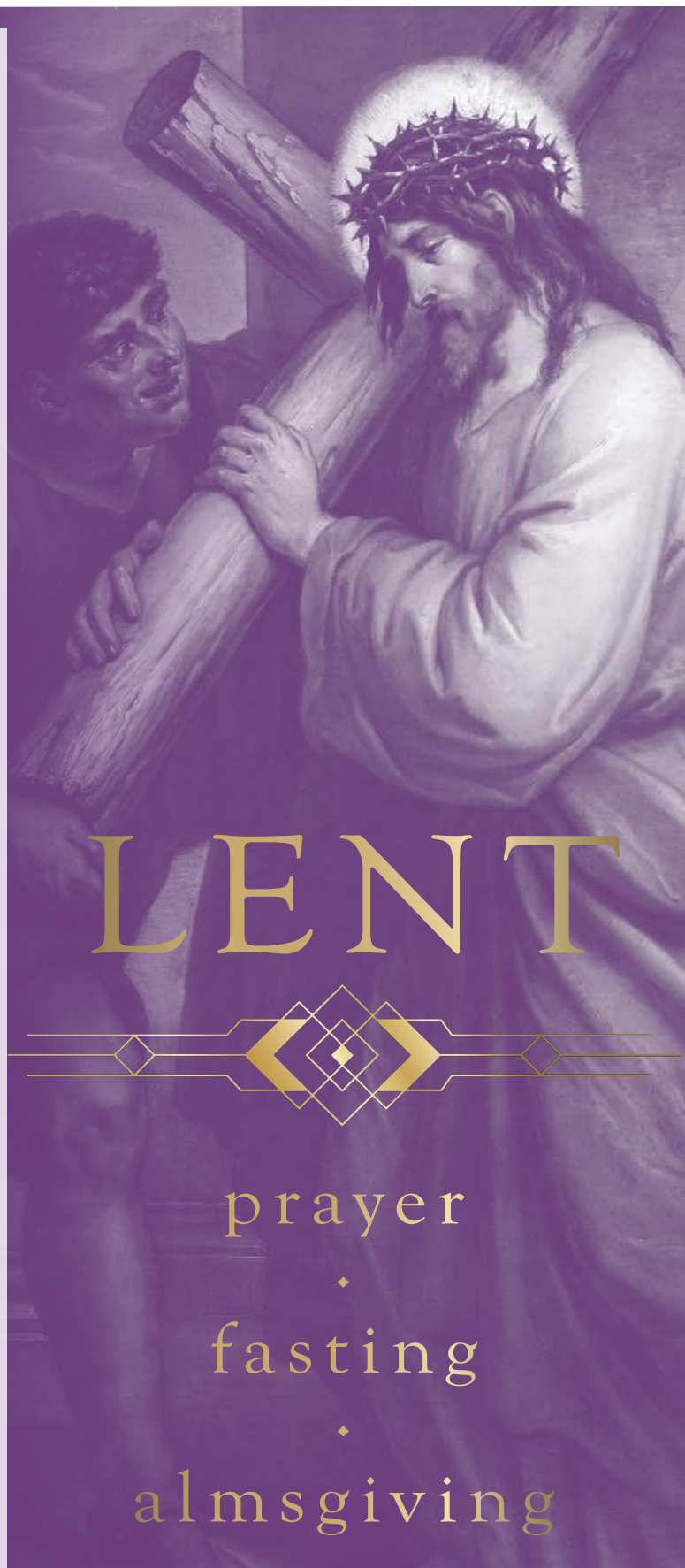

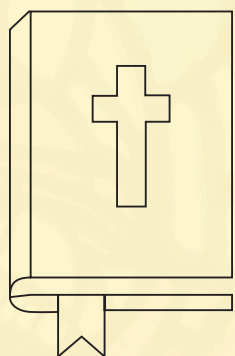

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



THE VEILING OF STATUES FOR THE FINAL WEEK OF LENT

While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Lent, the Catholic Church recommends this practice to heighten our sense and build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. In the Roman Missal we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from the 5th Sunday of Lent may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

What is Passiontide? This is the current practice of the Church, but veiling from the fifth Sunday of Lent onward is minuscule compared to what was once practiced. We go through great lengths to decorate our homes for Easter, so why not prepare for the great feast by using veils? But why go through such lengths to cover up images that are designed to raise our hearts and minds toward heaven?

First, we use veils to alert us of the special time that we are in. When we walk into church and notice everything is covered, we immediately know that something is different. These last two weeks of Lent are meant to be a time of immediate preparation for the Sacred Triduum. Secondly, the veils focus our attention on the words being prayed at Mass. When we listen to the Passion narrative, our senses are allowed to focus on the striking words from the Gospel and truly enter the scene. Third, the Church uses veils to produce a heightened sense of anticipation for Easter Sunday. You don't want them to be there because they are hiding some very beautiful images. And therein lies the whole point: the veils are not meant to be there forever. The images need to be unveiled; it is unnatural for them to be covered. The unveiling before the Easter Vigil is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a veiled world, in exile from our true home in heaven. It is only through our own death that the veil is lifted, and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives, face to face with God in the beatific vision.

PALM SUNDAY AND HOLY WEEK ARE COMING!

Rejoice because we've made it past the middle point of Lent...Easter joy is around the corner! Rejoice because God's mercy is greater than your sin. Spring weather has finally arrived, and Holy Week is just two weeks away. Here is a brief outline of all the Holy Week opportunities for prayer and encounter with our Risen Lord:

Palm Sunday is just one week away on March 29th, and we will be commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem with the Blessing and Distribution of Palms at all the Masses. On Monday, March 30th, Fr. Spicer and Fr. Suso will be hearing Holy Week Confessions at 1 PM and 7 PM in church. On Tuesday, March 31st, all the priests of our diocese will be gathering at St. Sebastian Parish in Akron with Bishop Malesic for the annual Chrism Mass where our holy oils for the new year will be blessed and all the priests will renew the promises of Holy Orders at a special Mass open to the faithful at 5 PM. On Wednesday, April 1st, Fr. Suso and Fr. Spicer will be hearing Holy Week Confessions in church. On Holy Thursday, April 2nd, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 PM commemorating Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. Night Prayer will be prayed in church at 10:30 PM on Holy Thursday. On Good Friday, April 3rd, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by the Passion of our Lord Service at 3 PM and finally Stations of the Cross at 7 PM. On Holy Saturday, April 4th, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:15 AM in church followed by two Easter Basket Food Blessings and 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM. The Great Easter Vigil Mass will be at 8:45 PM in church. Please note there are no 2:30 PM Confessions or 4 PM Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. On Easter Sunday, April 5th, we have Easter Masses at 8 AM, 10 AM and 12 PM. Parish Offices are Closed on Good Friday, April 3rd, and Easter Monday, April 6th, so our staff can pray with us and their families on Easter. The Holy Eucharist will be reposed in our Perpetual Adoration Chapel beginning at 9 AM on Holy Thursday, April 2nd, and remain closed until 9 AM on Monday, April 6th, for the Sacred Paschal Triduum.

ADORATION CHAPEL CLOSED FOR THE SACRED TRIDUUM

Our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel will be closed in honor of the three Holy Days beginning on Holy Thursday morning at 9 AM and will reopen on Easter Sunday morning at 9 AM.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY HOLY HOUR

The Season of Lent is all about preparing for Easter and trusting in the Divine Mercy of Jesus. Each one of us dies in the state in which we lived, and we all want to live like saints. We all want to love and recognize Jesus on the day of judgement and God has given us the Sacred Heart of Jesus as the grace we need to be saved from sin. Pope St. John Paul II

consecrated the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday in honor of the revelations of St. Margaret Mary and St. Faustina. Here is a little bit about Divine Mercy: It is because of Jesus working through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (d. 1690) that the entire Church celebrates the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which has led, among other things, to tremendous blessings for families who have gone on to enthrone the Sacred Heart of Jesus in their home.

The Feast of Divine Mercy is a brand new one, less than 25 years old. And it is less than 100 years ago that Jesus specifically asked St. Faustina to let the pope know He wanted the entire Church to honor and celebrate His Divine Mercy on this Second Sunday of Easter. Thanks be to God that St. John Paul II listened and acted.

God has special blessings and graces for us if we take the time to listen and respond in trust. So don't let this day, or perhaps this week, go by without learning a little more about Divine Mercy Sunday, about Jesus' words to us, and then responding in the way that God is asking of you. One helpful summary of Jesus' message is: the ABC's of Mercy. A = Ask for mercy. B = Be merciful in deed, word, and prayer. C = Completely trust in Jesus. Jesus told St. Faustina that "Souls that make an appeal to my mercy delight Me. To such souls I grant even more graces than they ask....Beg for mercy for the whole world." On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 12th, we will offer a solemn Holy Hour at 3 PM in church when we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Confession will be offered. Celebrate the Octave of Easter and rejoice in Jesus' mercy.

Never forget, the Lord is with us, always!

Trust. What should be simple for followers of Christ is often surprisingly difficult, even for devoted Catholics. Our brokenness and sin distort our ability to trust God and one another. Doubt takes root through our wounds or when we give in to temptation. In this week’s Gospel, when Jesus heard of Lazarus’ illness, He did not rush to act. He waited... He remained. When He arrived at the tomb, both Mary and Martha said, “If you had been here, our brother would not have died.” Yet Jesus had already declared, “This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God.” How often do we rush into action without first

turning to Christ? We act on impulse, convinced we are doing what is right, yet we fail to ask His will. I often wonder how many times God has desired me to remain rather than move on my own accord. Jesus will work through our actions regardless, but trusting Him—especially when He asks us to wait—is one way in which we die to self. Death to self leads to true life. We are not made for this world, but for eternity and life in Christ. When we turn toward ourselves and our own understanding, we turn away, or worse, turn against God in what He is trying to do in and through us. In marriage, it is easy to focus on how we are affected by our spouse. I often tell couples that the quickest path to healing is self-awareness—recognizing our own wounds, insecurities, and shortcomings and how they impact our spouse. When we shift from “what my spouse has done to me” to compassion for their wounds, grace enters in. We die to self when we acknowledge our brokenness and meet our spouse with mercy. I pray this Lent that we learn to trust enough to remain in Him when He calls us to remain, to act only when He calls us to act, and to die to ourselves so that His life may flourish in our marriages and in our hearts. - Nicole Melchi

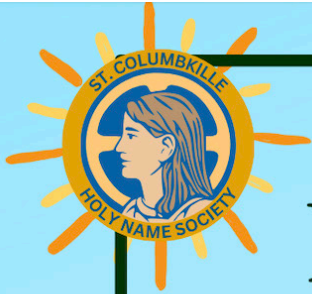

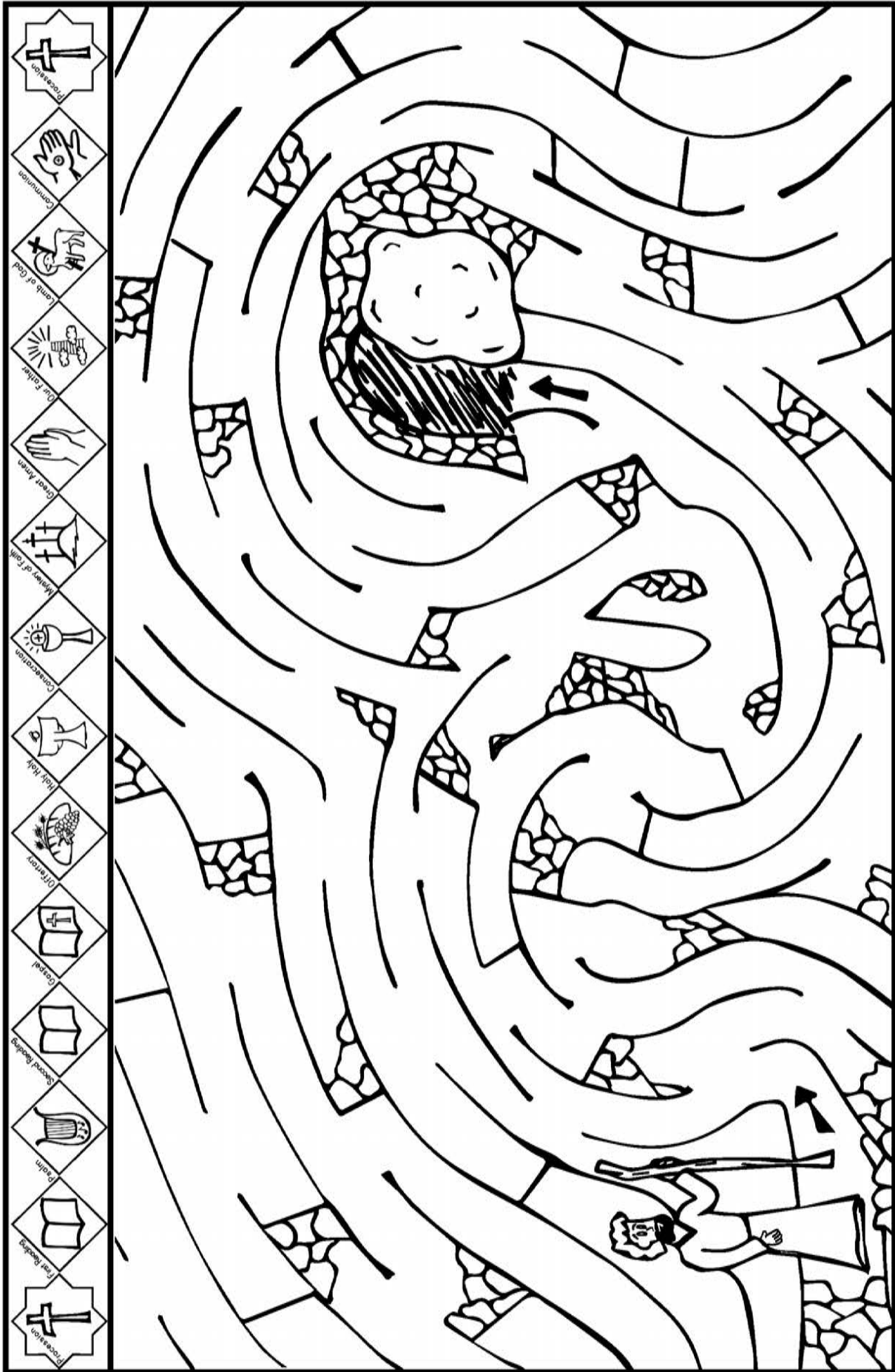

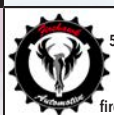
