



# **LETTER FROM THE PASTOR**



#### THANK YOU TO CHRIS ZGRABIK AND YOUTH GROUP!

Last weekend, we had over 35 teenagers participate in a youth renewal retreat. Special thank-you to our youth minister Chris Zgrabik and his team for hosting such a life changing retreat for so many of our young people. If you have a teenager who is interested in growing closer to Jesus, our youth group meets weekly on Tuesday evenings at 7 PM in the youth ministry annex located next to the church. #### ALMSGIVING AND THE CALL TO SERVICE!

Two weeks ago, I wrote about the theology behind the Lenten practice of fasting. Last week, I wrote about the theology behind prayer and the church's preference for using Latin in the sacred liturgy. This week, I want to focus on the Lenten practice of Almsgiving.

Giving alms has always been an important part of Lent. For many people, it means giving money to the Catholic Charities annual appeal, Catholic Relief Services Operation Rice Bowl or some other good cause. But the concept of almsgiving goes much deeper – it's greater than just one season or even the giving of money. It is our response to the teachings of Jesus that encourage us to reach out to people in need—not just with our money—but with our time and our talents. Today, we call it "stewardship." Much more than simply donating money or goods for the poor, almsgiving is also about performing acts of charity and serving our brothers and sisters. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (Catechism no. 2462) Almsgiving and service are an act of worshiping God because whenever you care for one of the least members of the Body of Christ you are caring for Jesus Himself!

Lent gives us the opportunity to cultivate a spirit of generosity. It gives us a chance to share what we have and who we are with other people. It puts us in communion with others and helps us understand that we are all members of the Body of Christ. Think carefully about how you will share your time, your talents and your treasure during Lent. Keep in mind the words of the Lord Jesus who Himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

At St. Columbkille, we are united in one mission to Worship God, Serve Others, and Form Disciples of Jesus. With this theology of Almsgiving in mind, I invite you to consider donating your time to serving our parish during the Sacred Liturgy. Right now, we have over 150 liturgical ministers serving on the weekends. Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers, music ministers, ushers, greeters, welcome desk attendants, screens and live stream operators, and parking lot ministers. Thank you for your service to our parish. Even with all these ministers we still need even more! We really need more ministers for our 12 PM and 5:30 PM Sunday liturgies.

Our parish council, parishioners, and staff have tasked me with bringing back the distribution of the Precious Blood at Masses and I need your help. If you served as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion in the past but stopped during the Covid pandemic, please come back! We need you to serve so that more people may have access to Jesus' Precious Blood. If you are new to our parish, consider this a personal invitation from Jesus to serve at the altar. If you are already a Communion Minister, please consider also serving as a hospitality minister, as a greeter, or welcome desk attendant. Jesus is inviting you to serve our parish during Lent!

On Saturday, April 27th, and Sunday, April 28th, we will be having a training session for all Communion Ministers at 1 PM to reintroduce the practice of distributing the Precious Blood at Mass. If you would like to be trained as a new Eucharistic Minister, please call the rectory and come to this training session! My hope and prayer is that we get enough Extraordinary Ministers to bring back the Precious Blood at our 4 PM vigil and 10 AM Sunday Masses beginning on June 2nd, Corpus Christi.

I am also looking for several individuals who feel called to be church sacristans. Sacristans have the awesome responsibility of preparing the sanctuary for liturgy and overseeing the upkeep of the sacred vessels, vestments, and sanctuary furnishings. Please call the rectory if you are interested in being trained as a sacristan at our parish. Almsgiving starts with serving God and one another at our own parish. Jesus is calling you to serve our parish during Lent...please answer His call! Easter joy is coming, never forget the Lord Jesus is with us, always!



# SERVICE SATURDAY

March 16th (9:30 AM - 12:00 PM)



The Rethink Poverty Simulation is a walk in another person's shoes. It's about sharing experiences and making a connection to the conditions of those in poverty. Give yourself one time in this experience of poverty and it can lead you to a new understanding and renewed dedication to fighting against the ties that bind people to poverty.

During the 2.5 hour simulation, participants role play one month in the life of a low-income family and aim to provide their family's most basic needs which include food, clothing, and shelter, while overcoming financial limitations such as unemployment, health issues, housing challenges, food insecurities and other obstacles. Family units interact with resources available in the mock community including banks, grocery stores, community action agencies, Job and Family Services, pawnshops, utilities, employers and more. The simulation occurs over four 15-minute "weeks" and mirrors life below or near the poverty line. For 46.5 million people in the United States, poverty is not a simulation or game.

#### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

The simulation breaks down stereotypes by allowing participants to step into the real life situations of others. Poverty is often portrayed as a stand alone issue - but this simulation allows individuals to walk a month in the shoes of someone who is facing poverty and realize how complex and interconnected issues of poverty really are.

- A Single Parent with limited resources and no transportation must find a way to get to work and get their child to daycare.
- 2. An Elderly Person must find a way to pay for both utilities and medication.
- 3. A Young Adult must care for siblings while their parent is incarcerated.
- **4. An Ederly Couple** must raise their grandchildren and deal with their own health and employment issues.




