## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



### PARISH FEASIBILITY STUDY EXECUTIVE SUMMARY!

Over the past eight weeks, our parish engaged with CCS fundraising in the process of seeking your willingness to participate in the Diocese of Cleveland's *Called to Flourish* capital campaign. We had a great response from parishioners with nearly 400 survey responses to review. Thank you to everyone who spent time giving interviews or filled out e-survey responses. I am happy to report that the results show overwhelming support of the initiatives with 97% of the interviewees saying we should conduct a campaign. After carefully reviewing the data with CCS fundraising experts, my staff, facilities committee, and parish and finance councils, we are

moving forward with a \$4 million dollar campaign implemented over the next six months. Please review the two-page feasibility study executive summary in the bulletin this weekend. Over the next several months, we will be developing a compelling case statement, recruiting campaign leaders and volunteers and begin personal visits with parishioners. This is an exciting time of growth for our parish and school as we honor our past and build the future together!

### HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY!

For freedom Christ has set us free from sin! Happy July 4th week to you and your families. The fourth of July has always been a time to celebrate the freedoms we enjoy as a nation and remember that our independence was won at great cost. Just two years ago, our nation experienced a truly historic moment where the most fundamental of all human rights, the right to life was restored to the most vulnerable among us, the unborn. Now is the time to continue the work of building a post-Roe America. It is our responsibility as disciples of Jesus to be leaders in healing wounds, repairing social divisions, and working toward a lasting peace. As Catholics who believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist – Jesus alive in our bodies – we must become agents of reconciliation in our broken world.

### BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS SUPERVISOR NEEDED!

Patrick Grau, our current facilities director, has retired after nine years of service to our parish and we need a new maintenance supervisor for our campus. The Director of Maintenance and Grounds is a working managerial position designed to maintain both the church and school buildings and grounds in top condition to ensure full and productive use of facilities. ### HOLY LAND GIFTS NEXT WEEKEND!

After all the Masses next weekend, July 11th-12th, there will be a display of handmade religious articles for sale such as Nativity scenes, crucifixes, rosaries and statues straight from the Holy Land. Because of the ongoing conflicts in the region, many Christian families in Bethlehem are struggling to make ends meet. Holy Land Gifts represents over 100 Christian families who make a living selling traditional olivewood handcrafts and religious articles. When you purchase one of these beautiful gifts, you are helping artisans in the Holy Land provide for their families and live and work with dignity in a region fraught with tension and war. ### SAINT MARIA GORETTI, PRAY FOR US!

You don't have to be old or have lived a long life to become a Saint. On Monday, July 6th, the Church celebrates the Feast Day of Saint Maria Goretti, a girl of only twelve, who is not only venerated as a Saint, but as a martyr as well. She was born in 1890 to a poor Italian family. Her father was a tenant farmer, who died of malaria when Maria was very young. From that point onward, her mother had to struggle mightily to feed her children. Maria received no formal education and could not read or write but would spend her days taking care of her younger brothers while the adults were out working in the fields. Every night, she would pray the Rosary, and she quickly grew in spiritual maturity, so much so, that others around her noticed her cheerfulness and piety.

One of the men who had worked with her father, Alessandro Serenelli, had taken an unholy interest in Maria (who by all accounts was a very beautiful girl). After having made several attempts to seduce her, all of which she rebuffed, he waited until no one else was home. Then, on July 5th, 1902, he seized her and attempted to force himself upon her. She resisted him, crying out: "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!" She admonished Alessandro, telling him that what he was doing was on the path to hell. He told her that if she did not submit, that he would kill her, and pulled out a knife. Maria told him that she would rather die than submit to sin. At that, Alessandro became filled with rage and stabbed her fourteen times. Maria was discovered some time later bleeding to death.

## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Maria was rushed to the hospital, but the doctors were unable to do much for her, because the damage was too extensive. Her final hours were spent with her thoughts directed to God and others – she expressed her concern for her family and welcomed the Lord in the reception of Holy Communion. She also forgave her murderer, answering: “Yes, for the love of Jesus I forgive him... and I want him to be with me in Paradise.” About twenty-four hours after the attack, Maria Goretti died from her injuries, a martyr for purity. Alessandro was captured and sentenced to 30 years in prison. Throughout the first eight years of his sentence, he remained unrepentant of his sins, until one night he had a dream. In that dream, he was visited by Maria Goretti who smiled at him and gave him a bouquet of lilies. When he awoke, his heart had been converted. He repented of his crime and changed his life. When he was released from prison after 27 years, the very first thing he did was to seek out Maria’s mother to ask for forgiveness, which she granted. Alessandro moved to a capuchin monastery and worked there in the garden as a tertiary for the rest of his life.

In 1950, Maria Goretti was canonized a Saint. She is the patron saint of purity, rape victims, young women, and youth in general. On that day in Saint Peter square, with tears in his eyes, Alessandro was also present, and heard as Pope Pius XII raised her to the altars. Much can be learned from her life – what forgiveness ought to look like in our own lives, the value of chastity amid a very confused world, courage to stand up for the truth, even in the face of violent opposition, and the absolute necessity of prayer in our lives. We have a statue of St. Maria Goretti on the south wall of the church next to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Saint Maria Goretti, pray for us!

Never forget, the Lord Jesus is with us, always!

## PARISH NEWS



In our Gospel this weekend, Jesus says to come to Him, and He will give us rest. His yoke is easy and His burden light. I will be the first to say that when I am experiencing pain and suffering, it does not feel so easy, restful, and light. However, when I reflect further on this passage, I think of one of the greatest gifts we can offer someone – presence in their suffering. When someone I love or even a stranger tells me of the suffering or hardship that they are experiencing, there is often little I can do to change it. I cannot cure illnesses, feed all the poor, or perform miracles. While Christ can do all these things, we are often

met with suffering that is not taken away when we ask Him. We can often feel like we are abandoned, forgotten, or doing something wrong in these moments. However, Christ is there to hear, understand, and love us when we come to Him. When we are suffering, it is often the love and understanding of another that makes that burden lighter. This is easy to see when we are surrounded by loved ones at a funeral, encouraged by family after a job loss, or supported by friends in a moment of crisis. While the suffering itself is not miraculously cured in the way we often want, there is love and understanding. It is a small difference, but if our prayer shifts from asking for miracles and more toward asking for presence in our suffering, we might find our hearts opened more to what God has in store for us, and a lighter burden in an unexpected way. – Luke Brown

### BIBLE STUDY: THE LETTERS OF SAINT PAUL

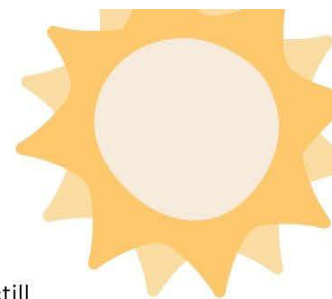

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PRESENTED BY CCS FUNDRAISING

CCS engaged with St. Columbkille in April 2026 to test the feasibility of a \$12.5 million campaign (with a \$4 million investment from parish reserves) to address four key investment priorities for the parish, in addition to participation in the Diocese of Cleveland’s *Called to Flourish* campaign:

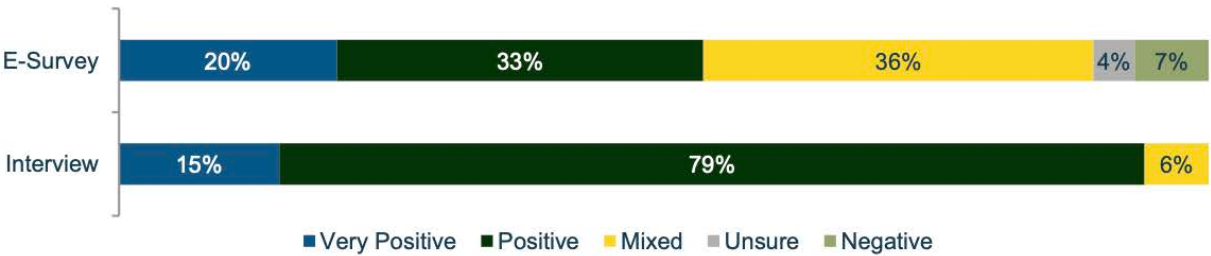
- 1. **Sacred Worship Space:** church interior beautification, entry vestibule, entry plaza, Adoration chapel, accessibility improvements
- 2. **Parish Offices & Meeting Spaces:** office renovation, Parish Hall updates, updated meeting spaces, dedicated food pantry, removal of White House
- 3. **School Enhancements & Safety:** boiler, A/C, interior repairs, covered school entrances, outdoor pavilion, accessibility improvements
- 4. **New Rectory Residence for Our Priests:** providing privacy separate from parish offices

STUDY METHODOLOGY

In CCS's experience, successful fundraising campaigns are built upon four pillars: a compelling case for support, volunteer leaders willing to advocate for the cause, committed prospective donors willing to consider gifts, and an organized plan for fundraising. The following information outlines key findings in each of these areas.

REACTION TO THE PROPOSED CASE STATEMENT

The top five funding priorities include school renovations, new entry vestibule and elevator, new entry plaza, new rectory residence, and church interior beautification. Accessibility was a priority across the board.

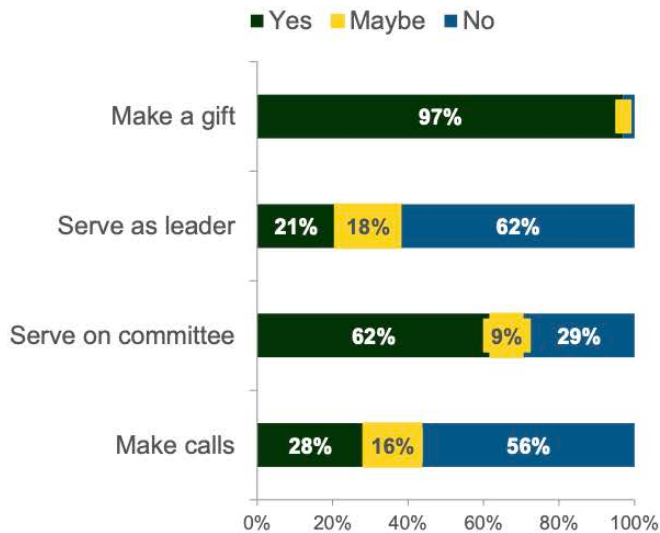

- 79% parish is top philanthropic priority; +14 pts vs. CCS Sector Benchmark (65%)

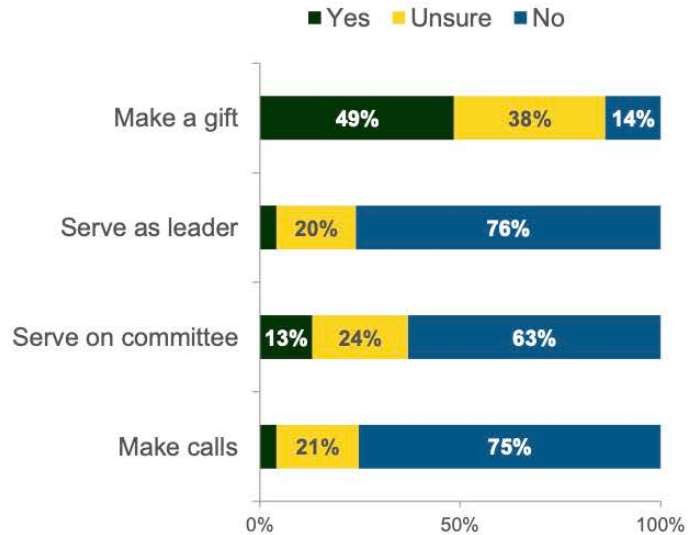


## WILLINGNESS TO PARTICIPATE IN A CAMPAIGN

Based on the study findings and a careful review of the data, CCS recommends St. Columbkille move forward with a \$4 million campaign implemented over the next six months.

### **DEVELOP A CASE**

Develop a compelling **case statement** and additional campaign materials that paint a clear picture of the needs

### **RECRUIT CAMPAIGN LEADERS**

Recruit **campaign leadership and volunteers** who represent the parish and school.

### **PURSUE A PHASED APPROACH**

Create **appropriate approach strategies** for parishioners in early phases as well as public phase. Prioritize personal visits, thoughtful target requests, and peer-to-peer engagement to build momentum

Blessed Junipero Serra was a Franciscan monk. His haircut is called a tonsure. He shaved the top of his head.



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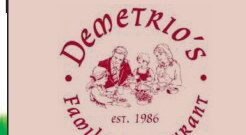
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
