





LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



SAINT JOHN VIANNEY, PRAY FOR US!

The Saint whom the Church celebrates on Monday, August 4th, is one whose popularity was so immense that the railway company had to open a special booking office in the nearby city of Lyons, to accommodate the massive influx of pilgrims into the tiny village of Ars, France. The man whom all these people were flocking to see was St. Jean Marie Baptiste Vianney.

Vianney was born in 1786, as the fourth of six children to Catholic parents. His family worked the land as farmers, and despite their meager means, they would never turn away anyone who came to their doorstep seeking assistance. Jean Vianney's mother took great care to pass the

faith on to her children, and the future Saint took readily to learning the things of God, even from a young age. While he was out tending the animals at pasture, he would often pray with a statue of the Blessed Mother that he kept on his person. Among his other pious practices was the custom of making the sign of the cross whenever he heard the clock strike on the hour.

The early days of this Saint's life were marked by the dark times that were occurring around him. In 1790, the revolutionary government of France passed the Civil Constitution of the Clergy, which attempted a state reorganization of the Catholic Church in France, limiting the Pope's jurisdiction, and allowing well-to-do citizens to elect priests and bishops, as well as other invasive reforms. French clergy were compelled to swear an oath to accept this constitution. This led to resistance (more than a few went to the guillotine) and forced priests to go into hiding in order to minister to the faithful remnant. The darkest days came to an end when Napoleon rose to power, and the Church gradually gained greater freedom.

It was during his youth that Jean Vianney felt a great desire to win souls for God and decided that he was going to become a priest. Initially, his father was against the idea, needing him on the farm. However, after two years he relented, and Vianney began his studies for the priesthood. Because of his poor memory he struggled mightily with his schooling, but after some twists and turns, he was eventually ordained a priest in 1815. In 1818, Vianney was sent to the tiny village of Ars, where he would spend the next forty years of his life. Upon his arrival, he found the spiritual state of the parish deplorable and set about rekindling the flame of faith in the hearts of his people. He prayed for them, fasted and did penance for them, and set out to visit each household in his parish.

One of the consequences of the revolution was a widespread religious ignorance, which Jean Vianney set about remedying through his preaching and catechism classes. Ars was also the home to numerous vices, including excessive drunkenness and immodest dancing. But through his preaching, every tavern in the city eventually had to close due to lack of patrons, and he would often pay the musicians to stay away, so that the dances could not take place. The Saint would spend in excess of ten hours a day in the confessional, and God even granted to him the gift of reading souls. For thirty-five of his years as the curé of Ars, he was routinely assaulted by the devil – terrifying and horrible sounds in an attempt to frighten him, dragging him from his bed during the night, and even setting his bed on fire one evening while he was in it. Jean Vianney used to remark when he observed these things, that he knew a "big fish" was coming (meaning someone who was dead in sin was going to come to him and be forgiven). Until his death in 1859, he worked tirelessly to win souls for God. His reputation for holiness spread so far and wide, that beginning in 1827, the irresistible attraction that Saints exert, moved thousands upon thousands of pilgrims to travel to Ars and wait in line for days to go to Confession to him.

I had the honor of visiting the tomb of St. John Vianney in Ars, France back in 2019 with my priest classmates on the 10-year anniversary of our ordination to the priesthood. Please pray for all our priests, especially me and Fr. Patrick! Become a Saint, there is nothing else.

IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BECOME AN EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION?

You see them serving the Body and Blood of Christ every week at Mass and bringing Jesus to the sick and homebound in our community. Maybe you've thought about distributing Communion, but you have some questions. What are the proper qualifications of someone who is chosen to become a Minister of Holy Communion?

- 1. No person has the explicit right to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion you must be called by God, nominated and chosen by your pastor to participate in this sacred ministry.
- 2. Those chosen for this ministry are role models for the parish, living exemplary lives of faith as evidenced by their words, actions, participation in social media, etc.
- 3. They are participating regularly in the Sunday celebration of Holy Eucharist and believe wholeheartedly that

the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ at Mass.

- 4. Those who are married must be in a sacramental marriage officially recognized by the Church.
- 5. They should feel a calling from God to serve Jesus to others, especially the sick, homebound or the dying.

St. Columbkille is hosting a diocesan training for new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion on Thursday, September 18th at 7 PM in church. Before you can be trained, you must be nominated and chosen by Fr. Suso. If you meet these criteria and would like to be nominated by Fr. Suso to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, please email or call Jennifer, our parish office manager, at jgustoskey@stcolumbkilleparish.org or 216-524-1987, ext. 10.

This weekend's Gospel reminds me of what some refer to as "Lifestyle Creep." If you have not heard the term before, it essentially means that over time we can get accustomed to spending more money on possessions, food, services, and hobbies. Although these expenditures are luxuries initially, we can eventually perceive them as necessities as we become accustomed to them. An example I often think of is my experiences with my first vehicle. It was an '85 Chevy pickup truck that only had an AM radio and no AC. Although it was pretty boring to only have cattle markets and best farming practices to listen to,

which was the only thing on AM radio at the time in South Dakota, I never thought much of it because that Chevy always got me from point A to point B. I was content with my vehicle. Now, it is hard to imagine driving without AC and a simple cord that connects my car to all of my Spotify playlists and podcasts on my phone. These things now seem like a "necessity." We sometimes divulge too much in the name of self-care, reliable possessions, or perceived necessities. This Gospel reminds us to keep focused on becoming rich in what matters to God. From a mental health perspective, relying on consumerism for happiness often leaves us feeling hollow and unhappy. It is a difficult task finding the balance between necessities and luxuries, and as Americans in modern times, we are encouraged constantly to consume. However, if we take time consistently to focus on the most important aspects of life such as God, family, and virtue, we may find ourselves more peaceful, loving, and holy.






