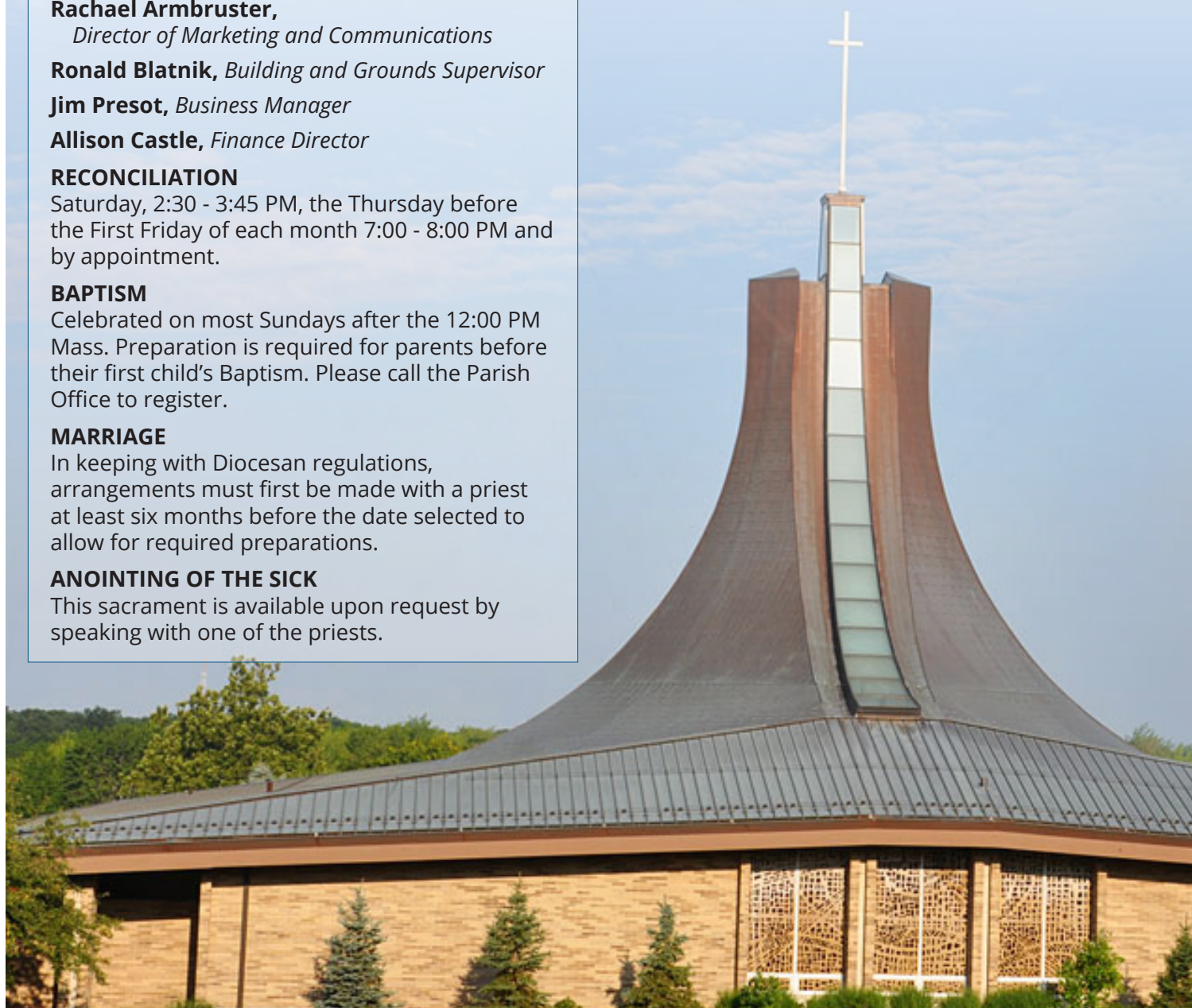

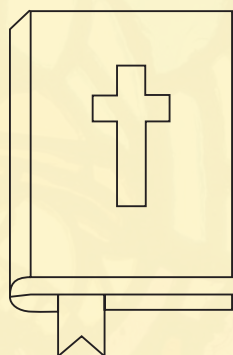

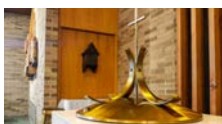

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



SAINT THERESA OF CALCUTTA, PRAY FOR US!

Nobel Peace Prize winner. Top of the "Gallup's List of Most Widely Admired People of the 20th Century." Witness to the human dignity of all. Religious order founder. Mary Teresa Bojaxhiu, also known as Mother Teresa or St. Teresa of Calcutta, was an extraordinary woman. She founded the Missionaries of Charity and changed the world in her call to help "the poorest of the poor" in Calcutta, India. This Saturday, September 5th, we celebrate the feast day of St. Teresa of Calcutta.

Born in Macedonia on August 26, 1910, Mary Teresa Bojaxhiu was fascinated by the lives of missionaries from a young age. At age 18, she left home to join the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland. In 1929, she began her novitiate in Darjeeling, India. Her first religious vows took place on May 24, 1931 - and she chose the name "Teresa" after St. Therese of Lisieux who is the patron saint of missionaries. She continued to serve as a teacher with the Sisters of Loreto in Calcutta, India for almost twenty years. However, the extreme poverty that existed just outside of the convent walls continually tugged at Mother Teresa's heart, inviting her to a life of radical compassion. In 1948, she asked (and was granted) permission to begin working with the poorest of the poor in the Calcutta slums.

Mother Teresa received basic medical training to provide care for those who lived in the slums. She founded a school and shortly after, in 1950, founded the Missionaries of Charity, a new religious community seeking to love and care for "the poorest of the poor" and those whom no one was willing to care for. The Missionaries of Charity remain an active religious order today. The goal of the Missionaries of Charity is to love and serve the poorest of the poor. This includes nursing the sick and dying, teaching poor children, visiting those in dire circumstances, giving shelter to the homeless, and generally caring for the unwanted, unloved, and lonely. At the time of Mother Teresa's death, there were 3,914 sisters in 594 missions in 123 countries. That number continues to grow.

In 1952, Mother opened her first hospice to help people die with dignity. In a country with multiple religious identities - primarily Hindu, Muslim, and Catholic - she worked to ensure each person died with dignity according to his or her own faith. She also opened a hospice for those suffering from leprosy and in 1955 opened a home for orphans and homeless children. By the 1960s, word of Mother Teresa's work had spread, inspiring an increase in volunteers, religious sisters, and donations that allowed this great mission to expand across India. Her message - to radically love and serve all people - was welcomed and spread around the world.

In 1979, Mother Teresa received the Nobel Peace Prize for her work. She refused the ceremonial banquet and instead asked that the \$192,000 cost be given to the poor in India. Despite her personal humility she attracted international attention and praise for her work. After experiencing a heart attack in 1983, Mother Teresa continued to face various medical complications. She resigned as the head of the Missionaries of Charity on March 13, 1997 and died on September 5 of that year. She was mourned by both religious and non-religious communities alike. She was canonized a saint on September 4th, 2016. Mother Teresa's most famous quote is "We can do no great things but small things with great love."

FAITH FORMATION



Today's Gospel reading relays the story of Jesus telling St. Peter to "get behind me Satan." This can be jarring to read, especially as it follows immediately after Matthew's account of Jesus telling Peter that he is the rock upon which He will build His Church! How is it that St. Peter can be both "Satan" and "Rock"? I think that we can all identify with having moments of triumph and moments of great weakness. Sometimes they may even follow right after one another as they do here for Peter! There are some important lessons that we can learn from this Gospel and from Peter's very human, relatable moments.

First, we all have moments where we do the right thing, make good choices, and put God first. Jesus celebrates one such moment when Peter is the first to recognize that He is the Messiah.

Second, we all will also have moments of failure, like when Peter tries to stop Jesus from fulfilling His call to lay down His life for the world. We, too, fall on our faces sometimes and make choices we regret. In these moments, we, too, need the Lord to point out to us where those areas are for growth. Peter took the correction of the Lord and went on to become St. Peter, our first pope. His life shows us that even with many bumps along the road, it is possible for all of us to become saints. He persevered through his weakness and trusted in the Lord to supply what he lacked. When we feel discouraged about our own mistakes and weaknesses, let us remember the life of Peter.

I leave you with this quote from Pope John XXIII. "Consult not your fears but your hopes and your dreams. Think not about your frustrations, but about your unfulfilled potential. Concern yourself not with what you tried and failed in, but what is still possible for you to do." – Sacred Heart Counseling Team

Join Us At Our First Session
September 16th
 7 PM in the Parish Center

You are invited to join the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) Have you ever wondered what Catholics really believe? Or perhaps you've been attending Mass with a spouse or friend and are feeling a desire to learn more? Join us on Wed. September 16, from 7-8 PM in the Parish Center.

What is OCIA? OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults/ formerly RCIA) is a faith journey for those exploring the Catholic Church. OCIA isn't a classroom lecture; it's a supportive, grace-filled journey of faith, prayer, and community. Our goal is to help you discern God's will. We support you through prayer, answering questions, and meaningful conversations.

Who is OCIA for? For the unbaptized adults, baptized Christians curious about Catholicism, or baptized Catholics seeking First Communion or Confirmation.

How does it work? The OCIA process follows the path of the early Church, walking through four stages:

Inquiry (Pre-Catechumenate):

A casual, welcoming period to ask questions, meet others, and share your own story.

The Catechumenate:

A time of dedicated formation to dive deep into Scripture, traditions, and the teachings of the faith.

Purification & Enlightenment:

A time of intense spiritual preparation that coincides with the season of Lent, culminating in the Easter Vigil.

Mystagogy:

The weeks following Easter where the newly initiated dive deeper into the life and mission of the Church.

Take the First Step! Classes meet weekly on Wednesday from 7-8 PM. The first session is on September 16th no pressure! Just come to say hello!

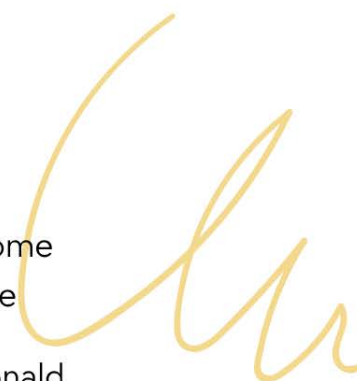
