

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



DAY AND KNIGHT OF GIVING IS THIS WEEK!

This Friday, September 26th, we are kicking off an entire day celebrating and giving to our Catholic School. This weekend, students from our parish school will be speaking after all the Masses inviting you to participate and sharing with you about all the wonderful things we are doing to improve our school community. Thank you for supporting our principal, Meghan Kelley, our assistant principal, Andrew Brunn and all our teachers in the important work of helping our kids fall in love with Jesus Christ. I am so proud of our Catholic School, and I want to thank everyone for continuing to support the mission of educating young people in the Catholic faith. SAINT PADRE PIO, PRAY FOR US!

This Tuesday, September 23rd, we celebrate the Feast Day of Saint Pius of Pietrelcina, more commonly known as Saint Padre Pio. If you thought that mystical phenomena associated with holy men and women was something relegated to the past, to great figures found in the Scriptures, then you haven't met this Friday's saint. Born in a small Italian village in 1887, to poor peasant farmers, he was named Francesco in honor of Saint Francis of Assisi. It became evident from a very young age that Francesco had a deep love for God and felt, from his childhood, a call to the priesthood. He told his parents at age 10 – "I want to be a friar – with a beard." At the age of 16 he entered the Capuchin Order, and later received the religious habit in 1902, taking for himself the name "Pio" (a modernization of the name "Pius"). After several years of study, Francesco was ordained a priest in 1910 and officially became known as Padre Pio.

On September 20th, 1918, while he was praying before a large crucifix, making his thanksgiving after Mass, he had a vision of Jesus, and when the vision ended Padre Pio had the stigmata in his hands, feet, and side. The stigmata are a unique way of sharing in the Lord's Passion. It involves an individual of extraordinary holiness whom the Lord has chosen to bear the wounds of His Crucifixion in his or her body. There are only a handful of such individuals in the history of the Church, among them are Saint Francis of Assisi and Saint Catherine of Siena. The stigmata are more than mere aesthetics but involve a true participation in the Lord's Passion – meaning – the wounds are painful and will often bleed. In Padre Pio's case, the blood which seeped from the wounds had the fragrance of flowers. After examining him, doctors could offer no explanation for the wounds, and as he himself predicted, upon his death, the wounds were healed and not even so much as a scar remained.

The stigmata were not the only mystical phenomenon associated with Padre Pio. He had the gift of bilocation (he could be two places at the same time) and could also read souls, meaning that when people came to him for Confession, he knew details of their lives that they had not revealed to him. Saint Pio was also a man of intense prayer and one to whom others streamed with their intentions and spiritual needs. He would spend up to ten hours a day in the confessional (he saw the confessional as a great means to draw sinners to Christ, and holy people to even greater sanctity). Busloads of people used to come and see him seeking his spiritual counsel. In fact, the late Holy Father, Saint John Paul II, while he was still Archbishop of Krakow, wrote to Padre Pio asking him to pray for a woman he knew with throat cancer. Within two weeks she was cured of her life-threatening condition.

Padre Pio died in 1968 and was canonized a Saint in 2002. 300,000 people were present at his canonization, where Pope Saint John Paul II described him as a humble friar whose life was characterized by suffering and deep love of God. He saw Jesus in the sick and the suffering and poured himself out to care for their souls. During his homily, John Paul II said: "The life and mission of Padre Pio testify that difficulties and sorrows, if accepted with love, transform themselves into a privileged journey of holiness, which opens the person toward a greater good, known only to God."

How well do we deal with the difficulties and struggles in our own lives? Do we see trials as a share in the Lord's own Passion, which if offered up in union with Jesus' sacrifice on Calvary, help us turn away from sin and transform us into saints. This weekend as part of the final blessing at all the Masses, the priest presider will bless the assembly with a 1st class relic of Saint Pio – a piece of blood-stained hand wrap that once covered Pio's stigmata! Saint Padre Pio, pray for us.

BLESSING OF PETS IN HONOR OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI!

On Saturday, October 4th from 5:30 PM-6:30 PM, we will have a drive-thru blessing of pets outside the front steps of the church. Bring your dogs, cats and other pets by the church, stay in your car and Fr. Suso or Fr. Spicer will offer a blessing prayer, sprinkle holy water and you will receive a holy card. It only takes a minute, so we hope to see you there!

Never forget, the Lord is with us, always!




