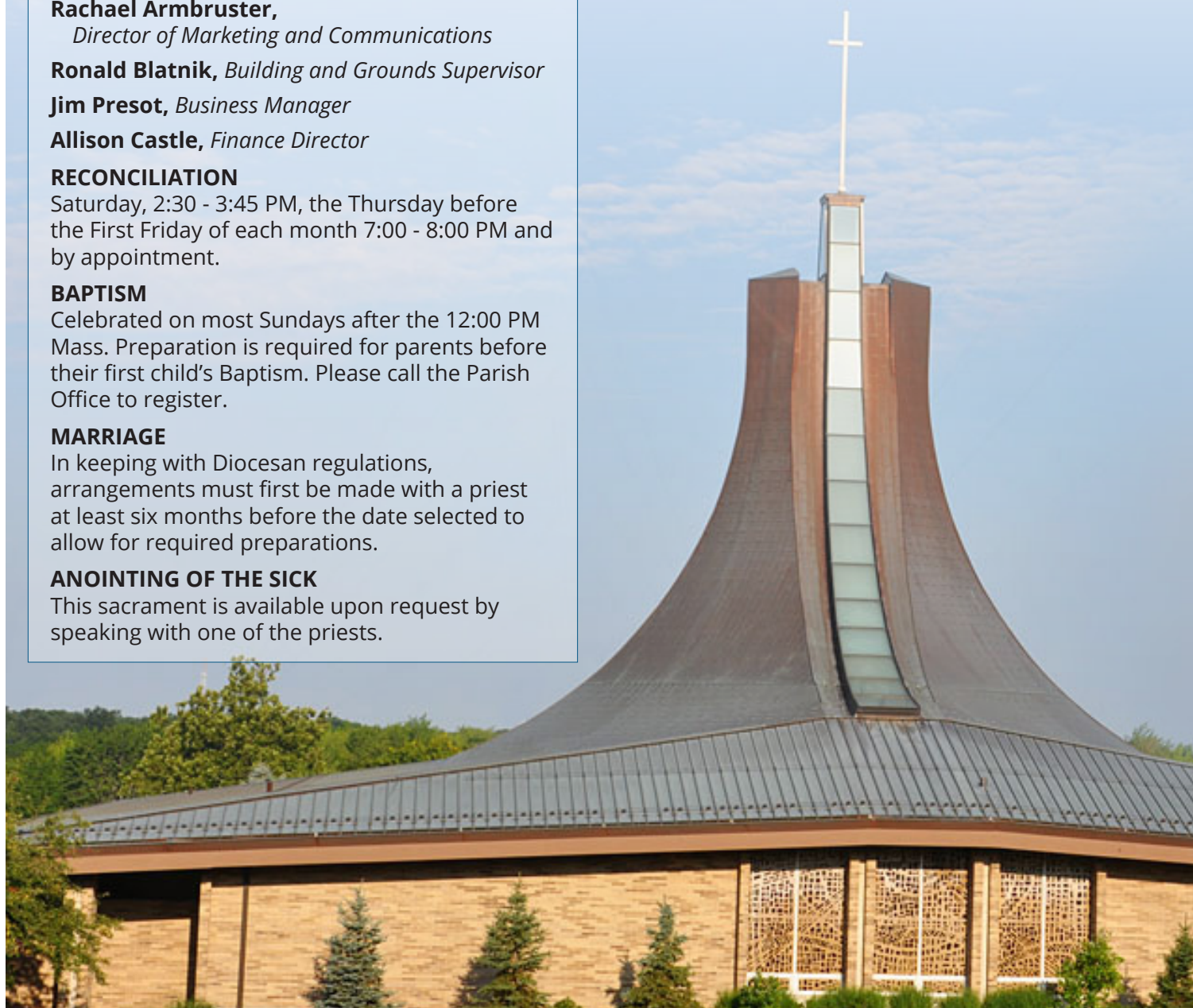

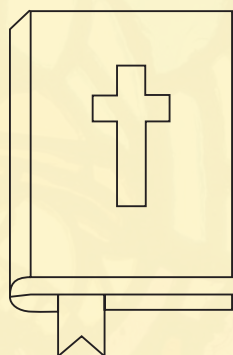

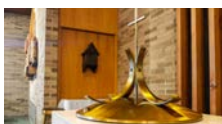

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



HAPPY LABOR DAY WEEKEND!

On Monday, September 7th, our Parish Offices and school will be closed in observance of the Labor Day Holiday, and we have Mass at 9 AM.

LABOR DAY AS CATHOLICS!

Labor Day was not intended to signify the end of summer, or the beginning of school, or the start of football season. Labor Day is a national holiday in which we are to celebrate the economic and social contributions of workers. As Catholics we have a rich history of Scripture and tradition pointing to the dignity of work and its true purpose. In 1981, Pope St. John Paul II released an Encyclical letter entitled "On Human Work" which beautifully presents a Christian vision of the dignity of human work and the worker. In the introductory paragraph he wrote: "Work means any activity by man, whether manual or intellectual, whatever its nature or circumstances; it means any human activity that can and must be recognized as work, in the midst of all the many activities of which man is capable and to which he is predisposed by his very nature, by virtue of humanity itself. Man is made to be in the visible universe an image and likeness of God Himself, and he is placed in it in order to subdue the earth." "From the beginning therefore, he is called to work. Work is one of the characteristics that distinguish man from the rest of creatures, whose activity for sustaining their lives cannot be called work. Only man is capable of work, and only man works, at the same time by work occupying his existence on earth. Thus, work bears a particular mark of man and of humanity, the mark of a person operating within a community of persons. And this mark decides its interior characteristics; in a sense it constitutes its very nature."

We live in an age that has lost sight of the true dignity of work - precisely because we have lost sight of the dignity of the worker. This loss is one more bad fruit of the rupture which was wrought by sin. In the industrial age, men and women were often reduced to mere instruments in a society that emphasized "productivity" over the dignity of the human person, the worker. The technological age promised something different, but it has failed to deliver on that promise. Too often, men and women are still viewed as instruments and objects rather than persons and gifts. Even Science, a great gift meant to be placed at the service of the human person, human flourishing, the family and the common good, has often promoted a view of the human person as an object to be experimented on and disposed of at will. This fundamental error is the root of the contemporary culture of death.

Finally, John Paul II unveiled for his listeners an important understanding of the Incarnation, that Jesus, the "Divine Worker of Nazareth" also reminds us that 'life is more than food' and that work is for man, not man for work. What makes a life great is not the entity of gain, nor the type of profession, or the level of the career. **Man is worth infinitely more than the goods he produces or possesses.** What a profound and truly liberating message for us all to consider on this Labor Day! The Catholic Catechism instructs us: "Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty: "If anyone will not work, let him not eat." "Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from Him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in His redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ. Work united to Christ can be redemptive." (Catechism 2247)

This Labor Day spend some time balancing work, prayer and family. Remind yourself that your worth and dignity are not tied to the goods you produce or the money you make but rather your identity as a beloved son or daughter of a heavenly Father who loves you!

FAITH FORMATION



This weekend's Gospel gives us an interesting challenge. Whether it is talking to someone about a moral issue, a rift in a relationship, or a difficult topic, confrontation can be difficult. For those who are conflict-avoidant, it can be downright terrifying. In these moments, it can also be tempting to gossip about how we may have been wronged or to confront the person publicly. However, Christ calls us in this reading to approach the person one-on-one to discuss the matter. Whether it is in a marriage, with a child, or even a friend, difficult topics need to be addressed sometimes. I have often been nervous and scared of these

kinds of conversations and have frequently been surprised at how well it has gone and how receptive the person has been. If we never talk about it, we will never know how open the person is to discussing the matter. However, this is not always the case. When the person is not receptive, Christ calls us to bring in someone for support and then bring the church if that does not work. If we follow these steps, we can be at peace knowing that we did what we could do. How the other person reacts or responds is entirely outside of our control; all we can control is what we do. It can be difficult and heartbreaking when someone does not respond in a way to repair the wrongdoing or rift in the relationship, but at least we can surrender them to God's grace and know we took the only steps we could take to make things right. - Sacred Heart Counseling Team

Join Us At Our First Session
September 16th
 7 PM in the Parish Center

You are invited to join the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). Have you ever wondered what Catholics really believe? Or perhaps you've been attending Mass with a spouse or friend and are feeling a desire to learn more? Join us on Wednesday, September 16, from 7-8 PM in the Parish Center.

What is OCIA? OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults/ formerly RCIA) is a faith journey for those exploring the Catholic Church. OCIA isn't a classroom lecture; it's a supportive, grace-filled journey of faith, prayer, and community. Our goal is to help you discern God's will. We support you through prayer, answering questions, and meaningful conversations.

Who is OCIA for? For the unbaptized adults, baptized Christians curious about Catholicism, or baptized Catholics seeking First Communion or Confirmation.

How does it work? The OCIA process follows the path of the early Church, walking through four stages:

Inquiry (Pre-Catechumenate):

A casual, welcoming period to ask questions, meet others, and share your own story.

The Catechumenate:

A time of dedicated formation to dive deep into Scripture, traditions, and the teachings of the faith.

Purification & Enlightenment:

A time of intense spiritual preparation that coincides with the season of Lent, culminating in the Easter Vigil.

Mystagogy:

The weeks following Easter where the newly initiated dive deeper into the life and mission of the Church.

Take the First Step! Classes meet weekly on Wednesday from 7-8 PM. The first session is on September 16th; no pressure! Just come to say hello!
