





LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



DAY AND KNIGHT OF GIVING IS COMING SOON!

On Friday, September 26th we are kicking off an entire day celebrating and giving to our Catholic School. This weekend, our director of stewardship, Eric Perusek will be speaking after Communion at all the Masses about the day and how you can get involved. I am so proud of our Catholic School and I want to thank everyone for continuing to support the mission of educating young people in the Catholic faith. See the full page in this weekend's bulletin all about the day and how you can help us!

IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BECOME AN EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION?

You see them serving the Body and Blood of Christ every week at Mass and bringing Jesus to the sick and homebound in our community. Maybe you've thought about distributing Communion, but you have some questions. What are the proper qualifications of someone who is chosen to become a Minister of Holy Communion?

- 1. No person has the explicit right to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion you must be called by God, nominated and chosen by your pastor to participate in this sacred ministry.
- 2. Those chosen for this ministry are role models for the parish, living exemplary lives of faith as evidenced by their words, actions, participation in social media, etc.
- 3. They are participating regularly in the Sunday celebration of Holy Eucharist and believe wholeheartedly that the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ at Mass.
- 4. Those who are married must be in a sacramental marriage officially recognized by the Church.
- 5. They should feel a calling from God to serve Jesus to others, especially the sick, homebound or the dying.

St. Columbkille is hosting a diocesan training for new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion on Thursday, September 18th at 7 PM in church. Before you can be trained, you must be nominated and chosen by Fr. Suso. If you meet these criteria and would like to be nominated by Fr. CATHOLICS ARE CALLED TO SERVICE!

At St. Columbkille our mission is to Worship God, Serve Others and Form Disciples of Jesus. Jesus proclaims in the Gospel of Mark, "Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be the slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:44-45) Whenever we serve our brothers and sisters we are serving Jesus Christ Himself. I want to personally thank everyone in our parish who serves and volunteers in any capacity but especially those who donate their time to caring for the sick, the poor, and the marginalized in our community. St. Teresa of Calcutta once said that "Love cannot remain by itself – it has no meaning. Love has to be put into action, and that action is service." Read more about a great saint of our Church, Peter Claver, who put love into action by serving African slaves in Colombia for 38 years.

ST. PETER CLAVER, PRAY FOR US!

On Tuesday, September 9th the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Peter Claver. Born 1581 in Spain, to poor, yet deeply pious parents, Peter Claver spent his formative years deepening his love for God and immersed in his studies. From a very young age, he was filled with great zeal for the salvation of souls, and so, in 1602, he entered the Jesuit novitiate and was sent to study at the Jesuit College in Barcelona. After his novitiate, he took solemn vows in 1604, and was then sent to the College of Majorca. While studying philosophy there, he came under the influence of another Jesuit brother with great insight into spiritual matters, Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez. Alphonsus influenced Peter to become a missionary to the Indies in order to save souls that might otherwise perish without his help.

In 1610, he left his homeland forever, and sailed to Cartageña in modern-day Colombia, where five years later Peter was ordained a priest. His new home had become one of the largest slave ports in the new world (thousands of slaves would be brought in and sold each month). Despite the Church's official condemnation of slavery, the slave trade continued to flourish, and the plight of those brought over was deplorable. The conditions under which the slaves were transported were so harsh, that a third of them died while crossing the Atlantic. The future Saint, on seeing the inhumane conditions and treatment of the slaves, took a personal vow to become a slave of the slaves, dedicating the next 33 years of his life to serving them.

When a slave ship would come into port, Peter would rush into the sweltering hold of the ship with food and water, tend to the sick, instruct them in the faith, administer the sacraments to them, and remind them of their God-given

dignity. Once they had been sold, he would keep tabs on them, and come to visit them on the various plantations in the surrounding countryside. His care for them also extended beyond their immediate bodily needs. Peter would prevail upon their masters to treat them humanely, and even preached about the evil of slavery in the town square, demanding its abolition. His reputation became widely known, and miracles came to accompany his ministry. Peter would survive on minimal amounts of food and sleep, during some of his hospital visits he was seen surrounded with a supernatural light, and on one occasion, the touch of his cloak effected a miraculous healing.

The last four years of his life were marked by terrible sickness and neglect, which left him unable to carry on his work. During this period, he was all but abandoned to his suffering and forgotten. Saint Peter Claver died on September 8, 1654, having baptized more than 300,000 slaves into the Church, and affirmed their dignity as sons and daughters of God. After his death, the magistrates of the city who had formerly chided his concern for the slaves, ordered that he be buried at the public's expense with great pomp and ceremony.

One of the things that Saint Peter Claver used to say was that "we must speak to them with our hands, before we try to speak to them with our lips." Meaning, that he first wanted to show them the love of God, before they heard him speak about it. There is a great value to the authenticity of a person's witness. If one is first living the Christian life and on fire with love for God, that genuineness will first be witnessed in the manner of their life, long before they open their mouth. This will make speaking about the reason for their way of life much easier. If we wish to be effective in bringing souls to conversion, we too, must first speak about God with our hands, before we try to speak about Him with our lips. Worship God, Serve Others and Form Disciples of Jesus.

Never forget, the Lord Jesus is with us, always!


Run as many laps as you can to help us fill a whole rosary! For every lap you complete, a bead sticker will be added to our rosary board until we have a full rosary.


